

Welcome to the 65th Annual Fishing Derby!

It's that time of the year again - the weather starts to warm up and the fish begin to bite. This year will mark the 65th annual CBSC fishing derby. The derby is comprised of 3-three day weekends (Friday, Saturday, Sunday) with a fish fry and awards ceremony at the end. While watching an 80 pound grouper be weighed is exciting, we think it's more exciting to get out in the action. One advantage of the CBSC fishing derby, is it doesn't require you to have a boat to compete. There are five (5) different categories including: adult boating, adult shore fishing, junior boating, junior shore fishing and a flotation device category (kayak, SUPs, etc...) that includes both adults and juniors. The derby has always been a fun family event and this year, we are especially encouraging our juniors to participate with their parents.

Since the derby is comprised of 3 different weekends, adults have the option to buy a ticket that is good for the entire derby or for one weekend, if that is all you can make. Because junior tickets are discounted, the price is the same whether you buy for one weekend or all three (prices to come!). You can purchase entry tickets at the Ship's Store at the weigh-in scales (just below JJ's Cantina). On the first day of each phase (weekend), we will select a target fish that will be announced via facebook and posted at the scales. The person (adult *OR* junior) who catches the largest "target" fish that weekend, will win a prize.

At the end of the last phase, the Cholla Bay Sportsman Club will host a fish fry and awards ceremony at the clubhouse in Cholla Bay. The fish fry is open to the public and we will be raffling off many prizes in addition to the fishing awards. 

BARB'S DOG RESCUE STORY

We ask for your help. Virtually every dog that comes to us is malnourished and/or in poor health. The need is great!

Items needed: Dog Food No more than 50 lbs per vehicle. It cannot contain any meat, meat by-products, bone meal or bone marrow from any animal with hoofs. It must be poultry, seafood or vegetarian. We prefer the Costco brand of Kirkland puppy food. We feed puppy food to our nursing mothers and dogs that are malnourished or ill. This food can be purchased here in Puerto Peñasco at Welton's across the street from Sam's Club. Any premium brand with the first ingredient of fowl or seafood (not by-products) is also good. With an average of 300 dogs, we can use all dog supplies, training pads, toys, beds, coats, harnesses (not collars), leashes, treats and food. We also use large amounts of bleach, bleach wipes and sprays, lysol



type sprays, laundry detergent, paper towels, gently used towels, comforters, receiving blankets as well as regular blankets.

Let's Go Fishing Via Rosario Villa January 2020 Cholla Bay Launch Ramp Report Submitted by Lucky Chucky AKA Chuck Blair

The activity level around the launch area is limited during and right after the holiday season as people focus on family get togethers, shopping and sharing of food and gifts. Us poor old "fishaholics" just have to bide our time and wait it out until the celebrations are over and the credit card bills jar us back into reality. This mid December to mid January time frame brought cold and windy weather conditions to Cholla Bay which slowed the fishing and catching down considerably. The numbers of commercial pangas that are launching has



been steady but the exclusion from parking their trailers and tow vehicles on the Cholla Bay beaches has held so be grateful. Hats off to the new Mexican President AMLO for his support of this and other environmental concerns by actually enforcing existing regulations. It will take decades for the Sea of Cortez to recover from overfishing by both sportfishing and commercial fishing interests but recovery is still possible. You can still catch crab off the Oregan coast and lobster off the coast of New England because resource management was aggressively implemented. Now a restoration of Colorado River water influx into the Gulf of California is also an essential ingredient for regeneration to occur. Good luck with that but it is possible with torrential rainfall on the Gila River watershed and fewer existing dams to restrict that river's runoff from flowing to the sea. Some cagey fishermen did manage to bring saltwater denisons back to Cholla Bay for filleting and flaunting and they deserve congratulations. Terry Martin showed his brother Mike that he's not the only one in the family that can wrestle a bull Gulf Grouper to the gaff as Terry bagged a nice one(45#) around New Year's. Bill Moody on his boat "Pura Vida" brought in a nice catch of fish including red snappers and pintos. Scott Nelson aboard his boat "Colorado" Sweetie" with Chino Leon along had several successful outings in January. You are usually gonna catch fish with Chino on board pickin the spots. Please give him an opportunity to demonstrate his extensive local knowledge. As the ocean temperature slowly warms from the near sixty degrees it is now, the fish activity will increase and anglers will be more successful in the spring. In my 66 years of fishing out of Cholla Bay, I've learned that generally the fishing is better the first six months of the year than the last six months. This water temperature theory holds for sea depths of less than approximately 200 feet but over that depth the water is just cold period and GPS is essential because most landmarks are out of sight. Good luck finding those way out there reefs without it. That's all I got for now. Let's go fishing!

"Hole in One" wins a new Golf Cart!






