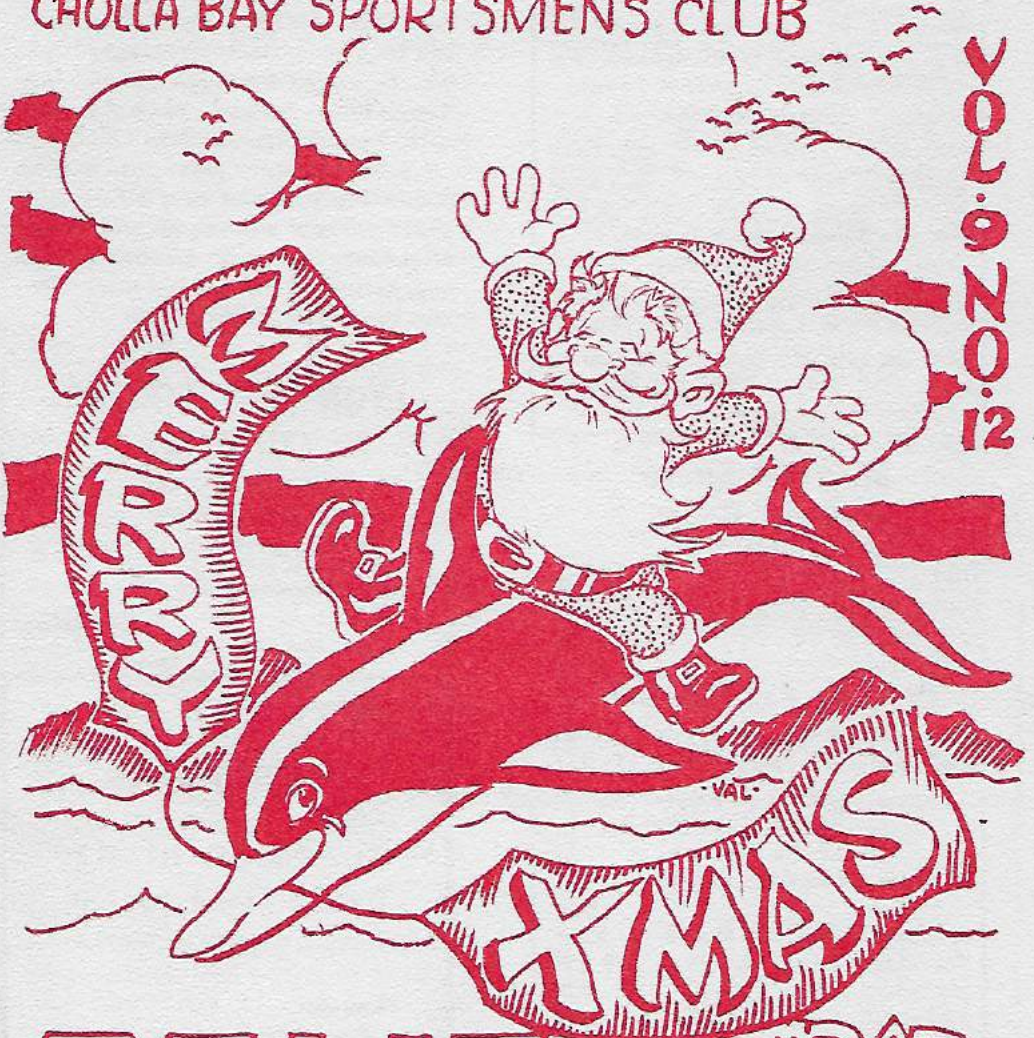

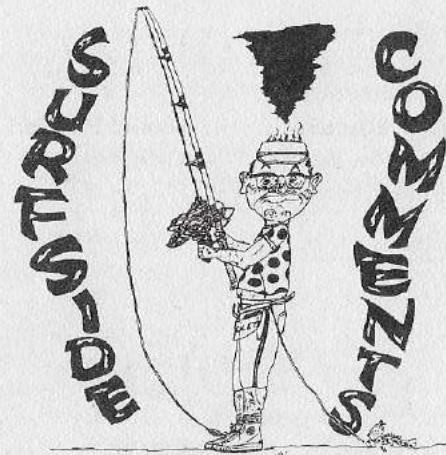

Santa Claus is peeking around the corner and for those who have a male member of the family who has been bitten by the fishing bug, here are a few items I'm sure they would love to find under the Yule tree.

The most desired and appreciated gift is a new rod or reel or, better yet, a matched outfit. The desirability of a matched rig can't be stressed too strongly as this is a must for developing skill in casting. To insure a balanced matching outfit go to a reputable dealer who knows his equipment. Many of the leading manufacturers now offer kits containing matching rod, reel and line.

For those who desire a top quality handcrafted rod I would highly recommend my favorite rod built by local rod builder Al Ellis. Al not only makes one of the finest lines of handcrafted rods in the country, but also personally monograms each rod which gives an extra touch appreciated by those who take pride in their personal equipment.

A tackle box is always a welcome gift. If Dad or Son is anything like yours truly, he is a tackle collector from the word go and always has an overflow which will fit nicely into a new tackle box. The new line of rust-free plastic boxes as well as the old tried and true wooden boxes

are ideal for stowing salt water tackle.

For the surf fisherman an assorted box of spoons and/or jigs makes an attractive as well as an always welcome gift. I don't need to tell any of you who have fished the Cholla Bay area that the mortality rate on lures is high due to the rocky shoreline. My favorite spoons are the Dixie Jet, Kastmaster, Webber Champ, Garcia Abu Koster, Johnson Sprite, Tony Acetta H-7 and Tony Acetta Pet #15 in sizes ranging from ¼ oz. to 1 oz. Since I'm not much of a jig user I could suggest consulting your dealer as to the best size and type to use.

There are many other accessories which come in mighty handy for surf fishing. Among the most useful are chest-high waders, a small pair of cutting pliers which will cut hooks or steel leaders, long-nose pliers, a fishing scale, fish cleaning knife, plastic lure boxes, fishing hat, polaroid glasses, a small hand gaff, spike beach rod holder, long fish stringer with float attached, windbreaker jacket, and nail-type clippers for cutting and trimming fishing lines.

Hope you find what you were looking for under your tree. Good fishing in the coming year!

This month we will cover a little of this and that which had already been covered over the past year but which you may have forgotten.

Water pump failure — engines used at Cholla in salt water have a rough way to go to start with. Running the engine out of water is a dangerous practice and should never be done under any circumstances. This will shorten the life of the impeller. Also, if for any reason you have to turn the engine over by hand, always turn it in the direction of its normal movement, reversing the direction can put a kink in the blades causing them to break off.

Grease in the lower unit — check often. Use only the manufacturer's specification type grease. If you use just any old type grease, you can get in big troubles. Some grease will not mix with water without causing a build up of gas and pressure in the gear case. This will cause failure of seals, and it can also be dangerous to anyone working on the gear case.

A.C. charging circuit, alternator model — If your unit does not charge, check the fuses. Remember that there are two — one 20 amp. and one 60 amp. The 60 amp. fuse you will find on the engine or junction box. If the fuses are good, I would suggest you see the man with the equipment to check it out.

You guys that keep breaking the

reverse lock lever on your .75, there is now a new type reverse lock lever available that is spring loaded. This new lever will solve this problem.

I've been asked about the location of the fuel line primer bulb. You can put the bulb anywhere in the line since you can hook either connector to the tank or the motor. Care must be taken that the arrow on the primer is pointing toward the motor.

On the engines with the new type hot air choke, you will find an air inlet hole at the rear of the engine. This opening is threaded, but must not be closed off, since the choke will not work if it is covered.

On the 90 and 100 H.P. engines that have the 4 barrel carburetors, we find that poor engine performance is caused by some fisherman playing with the 4 low speed adjustments. The adjustment on this carburetor must be set by the use of a tachometer and not by ear. Misadjustment can cause hesitation or a flat spot and also a smoking condition.

If you must adjust the carburetor for some reason, start by closing the needles, then open them ¼ turn each; this will get you by until it can be done by a shop or the right equipment.

If you keep fouling the #4 spark plug on your V 4 engine, look for a bad fuel pump diaphragm for one of the causes.

On an alternator equipped engine, always disconnect the battery when changing or working on the electrical system.

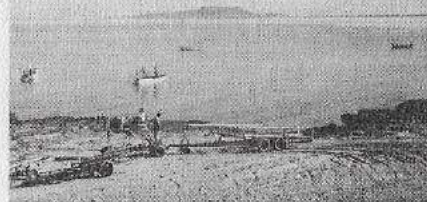

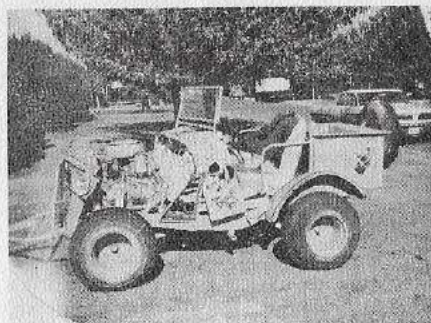

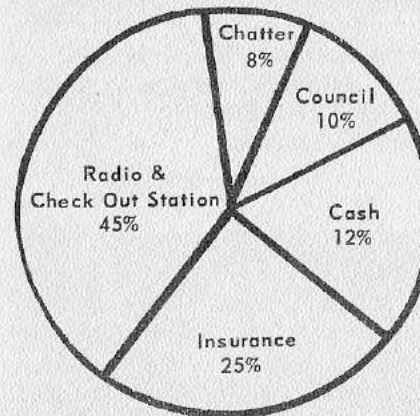

If you have ever wondered what the Council does with it's portion of the Chapter dues this will answer some of your questions.



CHATTER 8%

The Cholla Chatter is almost self supporting thru the advertising revenue collected by the Editor. An effort is always made to keep the cost of publishing even with the advertising income, but this could not be done every month. The Chatter needs more advertisers particularly from Tucson.

COUNCIL 10%

The Council members were reim-

bursed for a minimum amount of expenses, phone calls, stamps, etc. Travel, food, and lodging expenses were paid by the individual Council member. Contributions, in the name of the Club, legal fees, and items that could not be fairly charged to either Chapter consumed the Council's 10%.

CASH 12%

Cash or current operating funds is simply the check book balance. It is never large because the Council pays the operating costs or bills of the Chatter, the Radio Station and almost all other Club activities. The Council would like to have a larger balance but never at the expense of the Chatter or giving the membership less protection while fishing at the Bay.

INSURANCE 25%

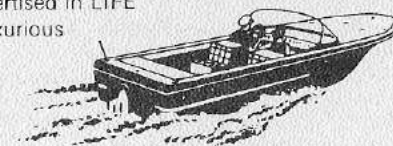
This is the next to largest expenditure of the Council but as important an any. It includes a form of protection for Council Members when they are acting on behalf of the general membership.

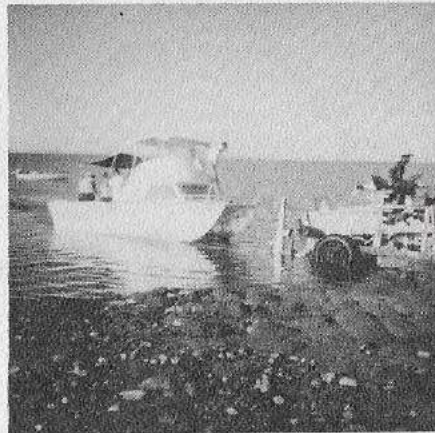

See you at the December meeting!

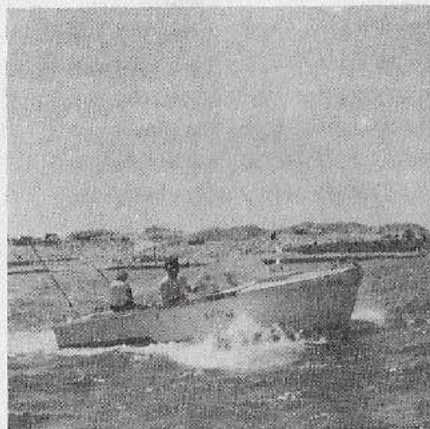

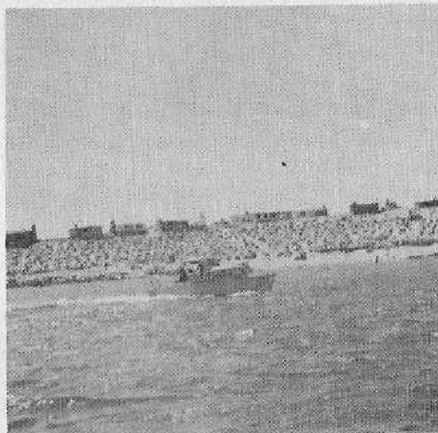
