

After reading January's radio reports it may surprise you to know there were 54 more boats checked out this year than last year January. January 1973 145 checked out and January 1974 199 checked out. If this is any indication of what's to come this year then I hope all the skippers have taken the time to go over their rigs to make sure everything is ship shape.

With the great weather we have been having the call of the reefs is hard to over look.

If you haven't used your rig since last fall or it's been in storage for one reason or another then before you make the long pull to Cholla there are a few pointers I'd like to remind you of that may save your weekend.

First of all the fuel system If its an outboard, to be on the safe side pull down the carburator and put it in the

cleaner. It may save you a lot of trouble. The engine may start and it may even run, until a hunk of hardened oil and dried up gas gets loose and floats around in the carburator until it finds the spot that will give you the most trouble.

Check the fuel pump and look the fuel lines over. Bend them, try to tie a knot in them. If they won't take that, then they should be replaced.

Check the rings in the fuel line connectors, see if they are cut or have hunks out of them. They are very easy to replace. In fact, they should



be part of your spare parts kit.

If you forgot to clean out the six gallon gas tank last fall and left a gallon of gas or so in it, check it close. A varnished gas tank can really foul a fuel system. About the only way I have found to clean a tank, is to take it to a radiator shop and let them boil it out in their caustic tank overnight. You'll have to repaint the tank, but that is better than having lost a weekend.

On the OMC 1/0's, the carburetor is in a hot spot 120 and 150-155. Carburetor pumps dry out and will cause a flat spot in acceleration and hard starting.

Lower units and out drives should be serviced. If you check and find water at the lower drain plug, depending on how much, it may be wise to have the unit down and change the seals, for thats how the water got there in the first

place. If you have to use a Phillips screw driver to change the grease in your out board lower unit, you are taking out the wrong plug.

Most anyone can check out their engine in their driveway. All it takes is a flushing device. If you have an outboard



do not run the engine above a fast idle or 1000 R.P.M.'s. On the 1/0's, high R.P.M.'s are O.K. on the engine. I do not recommend running the outdrive at high R.P.M. for any length of time, as there is no load on the gear train, and could cause damage to the gears. If a trip to the Bay was your last time out last fall, and you have had the rig in storage all winter, how about pulling the prop off and shining up the prop shaft. You know, if you do this every three or four trips, it's an easy job to replace a drive pin or prop, if you should ever have to.

Life at a U.S. - Mexican

CACTUS I work 4 to midnight. Tonight a big full moon lights Arizona skies and Mexican landscapes. At the present moment I am sitting on our station's park bench on an island of cactus and trees in front of our station, which divides the departing and arriving traffic. On one side are a barrel cactus, about 18" round, and crimson blossoms on top; a beavertail on the other side loaded with dark red "plums" all around their edges; oleanders, some pink and others white (these are our favorite); ocotillo with a cluster of long stems, 4 to 10 feet, and clothed with thousands of clinging leaves (no stems); century plants; mule ears, barbs and "plums"; small saguaro; cholla; organ pipe; night blooming cereus (one bloom a year, but a champion for odor -- I missed it); and some others I can't name, besides a couple good-sized Chinese elm.

CREATURES

The flag is down, lights on, and it is now 9:30.

Doves (or small hawks) flutter after bugs under and around the pole lights, without any noise of flapping wings or fast maneuvering. Later our village tiger (la gata) makes her nightly visit to hunt and devour crickets, grasshoppers, etc.; the toads (some can run like puppy dogs and approach miniature sizes) eat from copious supplies of bugs and insects, ad infinitum (i.e., something is always eating something else-



including the vultures, which daily sail in beautiful patterns constantly looking for unfortunate prey on the desert and mountains, but hardly flapping a wing, gliding and soaring, or resting after a meal on some high, dead cactus or dry tree limb.) All other creatures seem to be nocturnal, except small lizards which move quick as shadows.

Mexican buses operate day and night; 4 at a time sometimes, 1 coming, 1 going, and 2 sitting. Sonoyta is the checkpoint for leaving and entering their border free-zone between the coast and the interior.

Most passengers appear to be laborers who have or had jobs in California orchards and fields. The Mexicans have a big crew of officials and boys (porters, etc.). They love Lukeville--some call it "Coorsville" (Coors beer, Denver). One bus just pulled for Guadalajara, which is supposed to be very beautiful. Round trip to Mexico City is \$40 (1600 miles one way). These are all nice buses, probably made in U.S.A., and all the drivers are handsome, black-haired caballeros, with an apparent status similar to commercial airline pilots.

SOUNDS

Muchachos and muchachas ride by and around the island on bikes; others walk by and ask "Permiso?"*, "A la tienda"**, "A la cantina"***. Then my ear almost constantly hears Spanish spoken across the line between officials and tourists and each other. One quiet night a romantic hombre was singing plaintive and romantic songs for a couple hours, putting his whole soul into it. But all these Mexicans (or 80%) seem cute and handsome, especially the children--all * Permission friendly and cheerful. ** To the store

FIESTA

We had a dinner party at the home of the Mexican insurance agent, along with a merchant, a customs inspector, and their wives. A wonderful meal was served -- avocado salad, a shrimp-rice dish, a couple other vegetables, delicious ribs with a very good sauce, not too hot, enchiladas, sweet potatoes, and jello. We had a real fun time. We were short on Spanish; they were short on English; but we enjoyed a lot of humor regardless.

OPEN RANGE Much of the Lukeville traffic is to and from the California Gulf--65 miles from here, where they fish. Most of these use pick-up trucks, campers, and house trailers. The Organ Pipe National Monument, established in 1937 because it contains the peculiar and rare Organ Pipe, is about 500 square miles and has open range over its entire area for one family of ranchers. Almost nightly some of the White Face come to the island to eat the grass and maybe find some precious water. There is a faucet here used for watering the plantings and it leaks enough to

keep toads supplied, and the more desperate cattle. Sometimes some of the wiser ones will stand bawling in the hope that some friend will turn it on. Last night they were really roaming and moaning--midnight by moonlight. They can almost come into our house. The fence is only about 50' away, so it sounds at times like we own a ranch. It is a very "Zane Grey" picture to see the rancher's Mexican rider make his usual fence patrol, an impression that lingers for its strange demeanor.

At this station, 150 miles south and west from both Tucson and Phoenix, on the edge of the Papago Reservation--Lukeville--opposite the Sonoran town of Sonoyta, there are 2 Customs, 2 Immigration, and one Public Health Officer, in addition to one GSA man. About 30 people live in homes, trailers and not-sohomey-homes (old, stuccoed adobes). The winter season brings quite a pack of trailers, folks living on Social Security and pensions. The Immigration families and we live in homes built in 1960. The deputy collector lives in an older home near the station and has done a beautiful job of landscaping, giving him comfort and fragrance unimagined possible in desert areas. The GSA man, single as is the deputy, lives in a trailer, as does the family of the Public Service official. Border officials here know what frontier conditions really were like, and that was not so long ago. These trailer dwellers endure the smells and noises from convoys of buses 24 hours a day.



Saute for about 5 minutes, or until onion looks transparent. Taste sauce, make repairs necessary, pour over fish. Overall, pour one-half cup Taylor's Sauterne, or any other good quality white wine.

Bake in 400 0 oven about 20 minutes and when meat flakes, after being pricked with a fork, it is done.

If you prefer to make more sauce to pour over rice or potatoes and add a crisp salad, your gourmet dinner is complete. I have found that the above is the best way to cook mackerel - to fry it is to ruin it -- but baking enhances its distinctive flavor.
