

- 1. Each contestant participating in the Derby, must have a valid Derby Ticket before starting to fish. One Derby ticket per person is good for both days of the Derby. Fish must be caught with hook and line.
- 2. Teams: Each member of a team must have a valid derby ticket. Each team must have a valid Team Ticket: a separate Team Ticket is required for each day of the Derby.
- 3. Judging: Judging of fish for prizes shall be done by judges appointed by the Council with an equal number from each Chapter. Fish will be judged by their weight.
- 4. Prizes: There will be a Grand Prize winner for men, women, and Juniors 15 years and under. Additional prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place for each category of Fish. Prizes will consist of Trophies, Cash, and Merchandise.

Team Prizes: A cash award will be made each day to the team with the greatest weight of fish per person. Total Team Weight will be divided by the number of persons on the team to determine weight of fish per person. Team catches must be bagged or strung when brought to the scales for weighing.

5. The 1974 Derby will be held May 25 and 26, Saturday and Sunday.







One of the first things we should understand is that our radios are not telephones and should not be used as such, on channel 16 V.H.F. or 2182 M.F. I know I'm guilty of this myself, I've done it many times, but I should and every one else should switch to some other working channel. All this information is on this card, every member that is operating a boat with a radio on board should have one of these cards.

Our thanks to Mark Giebelhaus from the search team for standing by and operating the radios the week end Betty and Hector were under the weather and a big thnaks to Danny, Mark's sidekick, for getting a boat off the sand after it went aground at high speed in the bay. Mark, not seeing any movement in the boat after it hit bottom sent Danny out to see if anyone was hurt or needed help. Danny ended up helping get the boat to deep water, by that time it was dark and too far to swim so with no place else to go he had to spend a long cold night aboard the boat. We must say, Danny, that above and beyond, thank you.

At 11:30 a.m. Tuesday morning I received a call for help from Rocky Point, planes were needed to fly three badly burned people to Phoenix hospital. I called Clint Yates and Jerry Skowsen, both search and rescue pilots and they dropped what they were doing and were in the air by 12:30 and back in Phoenix by 3:30 p.m. that afternoon with Mrs. Pat Lovely and daughter Rene (7 yrs.) and Pat's sister Freda Hamilton.

Mrs. Lovely had gased her car in Penasco and was headed to Phoenix and about 45 miles out of Penasco a fire started in the rear of the car and by the time they got the car stopped it was engulfed in fire. Both the adult ladies were burned very badly, the little girl was only burned on her hands; we feel the adults must have gotten the child out of the car before the car was completely engulfed. I also called the sheriffs department and asked them to coordinate with us in getting the burn victims to a burn unit in a hospital. Believe me they did. Action and organization, they have it. The planes no sooner down, and doctors and ambulance were at the doors of the planes.



Life at a U.S. - Mexican Customs Border Station

PHOENIX

Until we got the '59 in shape for this unaccustomed climate, and recently acquired a '61 Country Sedan with built-in desert cooling, lots of power and a stick shift with overdrive, it was a risk to do any driving without having some breakdown. We have, nevertheless, enjoyed our monthly weekends (Sunday/ Tuesday) in Phoenix. 80% of the city seems new. The motel, shopping center, clinic and hospital area we check in were a dairy farm location 12 years ago. The mountains, palms, and general landscaping are very attractive, and the construction is well spaced, giving one that open-air feeling. Barry picked a little mountain near Camelback, with only one neighbor (3 million dollars worth of hacienda) and a full view of the whole valley. Seems like 9 out of 10 folks here, by sample count, are Democrats in this state, so it is a wonder he ever got to Washington.

CITRUS AND SUNSHINE Arizona's economy now rates manufacturing as the number one industry, mining number two, agriculture third--alfalfa, barley, cotton, dates, sorghum, vegetables, wheat, citrus, cattle, and sheep--tourists fourth. Sunshine is a year-round product, with elevations from sea-level (Yuma and the Colorado R.) to 14,000 feet (Humphries Pk.) at Flagstaff. Lakes, natural or Otherwise, and the ocean, are only a day's drive from any spot in the state. Forests are abundant in the eastern Apache and northern Grand Canyon areas. Side by side in several areas are mines, rich irrigated fields, and desert retirement developments. The several Indian tribes are a top interest subject for history or sociology students. Also, right now, read Mark 6:31, and think of us. In this verse, Christ addressed his disciples and instructed them where to go for a very special purpose. As a tax collector myself, I think of Thomas who collected taxes for the Romans but found the influence of Christ greater than Caesar, and ending up going the way of Christ. Let me ask what we ask Spanish border crossers -- "Donde va?"*



I hope I have impressed you on the importance of taking the time to check the gear housings on your outdrives and board engines, now don't misunderstand me, cause if you do you're sure to be in to see one of us that make our living repairing your equipment and anyone of the repair shops in Phoenix will be happy to see you, but none of us wants you to loose a fishing trip, or be hung up somewhere out there with your gears hanging out.

On the out board engines there is only one gear housing to check, that's the one with the prop sticking out of it. Always take the bottom most plug out first. If there is water in the unit that's where you will find it. NOTE, do not remove any plug or screw that you have to use a phillips screw-driver on. If you find water or the grease looks like coffee with cream in it, drain and refill the gear housing and talk it over with your marine dealer repair shop.

The same goes for the I/Os only there are more gear housings to check; if you're not sure ask your repair man.

SAFE BOATING TIPS

- 1. Gasoline vapors are explosive. All doors, hatches, and ports should be closed while fueling, galley fires and pilot lights extinguished, smoking strictly prohibited, and the filling nozzle kept in contact with the fill pipe to prevent spark. Do not use gasoline stoves, heaters, or lights on board. Portable tanks should be fueled out of the boat at all times.
- After fueling, ventilate all compartments and check the machinery and fuel tank spaces for fumes before starting the motor. Remember, the electrical ignition system could provide the spark to an accumulation of gasoline vapors. Keep fuel lines tight and bilges clean.
- Do not permit persons to ride on parts of the boat not designed for such use. Bow riding and seatback or gunwale riding can be especially dangerous.
- 4. Keep an alert lookout. Serious accidents have resulted from failure to use your eyes.
- 5. Be especially careful when operating in any area where swimmers or divers may be. Divers are easily recognized by the red flag with a white diagonal slash which marks the approximate center of their activities.
- 6. Watch your wake.
- Keep firefighting and lifesaving equipment in good condition and readily accessible at all times.
- 8. Obey the Rules of the Road.
- Always have children and non-swimmers wear personal flotation devices.
- 10. Know your fuel tank capacity.







SAFE BOATING TIPS from p. 13

- 11. If you capsize, remember that if the boat continues to float, stay with it.
- 12. Good housekeeping is even more important affoat than ashore. Cleanliness diminishes the probability of fire and tripping hazards.
- 13. Have an anchor and sufficient line to assure a good hold in a blow.
- 14. Know the various distress signals. It is recommended that you carry a mirror, flashlight, flares, smoke, etc., to insure you can be seen if trouble develops.
 - 15. Learn the weather warning signals.
- 16. Water ski only when you are well clear of all other persons. There should always be two people in the tow boat; one to watch the skier, the other to operate the boat.
- 17. Be extremely careful of your footing. Falls are one of the chief causes of accidents.
- 18. Always instruct one other person on board in handling your boat in case you become disabled or fall overboard.
- 19. Before departing on any boat trip, always leave a "Float Plan" with someone ashore. This "Float Plan" should indicate a description of your boat, number of passengers, destination, proposed route, and other information which you feel would aid in finding you should an emergency develop. Always advise the person you left your "Float Plan" with on your arrival or return.

LOADING YOUR BOAT

There are several things that should be remembered when loading a boat. Distribute the load evenly; keep the load low; don't stand up in a small boat; don't overload. The weather and water conditions should be taken into account, too. If the water is rough, the number of persons carried should be reduced.

The U.S. Coast Guard requires that manufacturers of certain boats display on each boat a "U.S. Coast Guard Capacity Information Label". This requirement applies to all monohull boats less than 20 feet in length manufactured on or after November 1, 1972. Exceptions to this rule are sailboats, canoes, kayaks, and inflatable boats. The "U.S. Coast Guard Capacity Information Label" is intended to provide safety information to the boatman, who may not have expert knowledge of a particular boat's characteristics, in order to reduce the dangers of inadvertent overloading or overpowering. These recommended values are for fair weather and do not relieve the boatman of the responsibility for exercising individual judgment.

In the absence of a capacity plate, there is a simple rule of thumb to help prevent overloading of boats. To determine the number of persons you can safely carry:

_(Number of Persons)

L=Overall length of boat

W=Maximum width of boat (both dimensions in feet and tenths of feet.)

The result, or the next smallest whole number if the result is a fraction, gives the number of persons that can be safely put aboard, in good weather conditions.

You should verify the capacity of your boat before load-




