

OFFICIAL DERBY RULES

The Phoenix and Tucson Chapters collaborated on drawing up a basic set of rules to be used in future fish derbies. The only changes that need to be made from year to year will be the date and time. These rules were presented to the Council at its September 1967 meeting and after some discussion and a few minor changes were ratified.

<u>Classes of fish--Seventeen classes</u> of fish will be eligible for prizes for hook and line fishermen. These are:

1.	Grouper	9.	Yellow Fin
2.	Pinto	10.	Dolphin
3.	Sea Bass	11.	Red Snapper
4.	White Sea Bass	12.	Pargo
5.	Rock Bass	13.	Skipjack
6.	Sea Trout	14.	Flounder
7.	Pompano	15.	Sailfish
8.	Mackerel	16.	Cochi

Types of Prizes--There will be prizes for first and second place in each class for each day of the derby. Grand prize will be for the largest fish caught. Also a Grand Prize for the largest fish caught by a lady fisherman. Additional prizes will be first, second and third place for "odd ball" fish. A prize will be given the oldest fisherman with a valid Derby ticket. Prizes for shell fish will be in two categories -- Skin Divers and Beach.

17. Corvina

Team Prize--A cash award will be made each day for the boat with the greatest weight of fish caught per person on hook and line. Fish must be in the 17 categories listed and must be bagged or strung. The weight of all eligible fish caught by the

"team" including any prize winners will be used in determining weight of fish caught per person.

Judging-Judging of fish for prizes shall be done by judges appointed by the Council with an equal number from each Chapter. The Derby Chairman is not to be appointed as a judge. Judging of the largest fish will be by weight. Fish will be weighed on a set of P Cotton scales. No one fish can take two prizes except that fish that have trophies donated for the first caught of the season, such as Sailfish and Dolphin.

<u>Tickets</u>—Each contestant participating in the Derby must have a valid Derby ticket before starting to fish. Only boats with valid Team Tickets are eligible for the Team Prizes.

Time-Dates and official times will be established by the Council. The official closing time will be posted at the scales. All fish must be weighed in before closing time. There are to be no exceptions. Two (2) men will be responsible for closing the scales each day of the Derby.

Awards--Presentation of awards will be made the evening of the last day of the Derby. Winners do not have to be present to receive their prizes.



If you do a little bottom plowing or rock busting with your prop, you can bet its out of pitch, and if any of the blades have any part of them missing, then the propeller is out of balance also. Once the blade is bent out of shape (pitch), it can only be repaired by a prop repair shop.

Engine R. P. M. is controlled by the size of your prop in relation to the size of your boat and load. If your boat is equipped with a tackometer, check manufacturer specs and prop accordingly. In your spare parts kit you should carry a spare prop, prop nut, drive pin and cotter key (if used).

The propeller is to the boat what the wheel is to the car. Its purpose is to get you where you are going by the power transmitted to it by the engine. The wheel has an advantage over the propeller. If its out of round, bent or out of balance, it will keep you from driving very far or very fast. Not so with a boat propeller, it will keep on doing its duty and right well, too. But what is happening to the propeller shaft seals and bearing??? Running a propeller out of pitch will cause vibration that will damage the lower gear housing, screws, bolts, and engine hardware will loosen from its mountings.

FISH IDENTIFICATION AND THE DERBY LIST PART TWO

The derby list of eligible fish has 5 kinds of basses on it. Every fisherman at Cholla Bay knows the pinta: Every fisherman at Cholla Bay knows the rock bass. The "rock" bass is more correctly called the spotted sand bass because he spends most of his time on the sandy bottom. I'll wager it would be difficult to call it anything but "Rocky" because the fisherman always catches him on the reefs off Cholla Bay.

What is the "sardinero"? It is a Mexican name. It is better called leopard grouper because it varies its color, spots, stripes and circles. As a scuba diver, it took me 5 or 6 years to always recognize him. Sometimes he has spots and stripes and spots like a pinta. Sometimes he is completely golden. Yes, he is the "golden grouper". At about 10 inches a few of the leopard groupers change to a golden color. The most obvious difference between a pinta and a leopard grouper when they have similar spots and stripes is that the pinta has a rounded tail fin. The leopard grouper's is straight.

The black sea bass is a good name. He is a big fish and has a square end to his dorsal fin. Don't confuse him with the big (but not as big) gulf grouper. The gulf grouper has a rounded end to his dorsal fin. There are a number of "groupers" in the Gulf. So lets call this one, gulf grouper and not just grouper as on the derby list.

There are other basses caught at the derby. I have seen the

FISH INDENTIFICATION (cont'd) broomtail grouper, the soapfish, the spotted bass and occasionally some of the other 35 or 40 species of bass.

This suggests another question to my mind. An 80 pound broomtail grouper is a record catch. A gulf grouper of 90 pounds is not a record catch. He goes at least to 200 pounds. What fish gets a derby prize for "grouper"? In this case the broomtail of 80 pounds should be the prize catch.

"Derby" is becoming a dirty word with those who are concerned with the future fish populations. So let's keep our derby clean. A few ideas which come to mind are as follows:

Do you eat your bony ladyfish and spotted sand bass? If not, throw them back.

Do you release your sailfish and marlin?

Are you wasteful in fileting?

Do you ever make fish chowder of head and back bone after filets are removed?

Someday scientists may be able to tell us what part of the food chain is the best from which to take our catch. There may be a size which is too small or too large for which to fish to protect future generations. There are some sizes we should throw back. There are some we should tag.

The present derby names need updating. They have served well in the past. With the help of the University of Arizona and the American Littoral Society, we are now able to better identify the fish we are catching.

At this November's derby you might be interested in watching the identification chart at the check-in station. It may tell you what names on the derby list you would like to have changed. Let your C.B.S.C. Council know.

The Cholla Bay Derby, since it's inception way back when, has sure had a variety of 'taking place' dates. When Al Scott started the annual affair, he picked February 22nd, Washington's Birthday, as the time when everyone should get loose for a competitive weekend at Cholla. At this time of year. the bottom type fisherman is at his best. Big grouper, pinto, snapper and even occasional black and/or white sea bass would be brought to the weigh-in scales. Us lighter tackled - smaller-type fish fishermen, had pretty slim pickin's, altho some of those years, the warm weather kept the sea trout and mackerel within our range.

I'll never forget one year, when my fishing partner and I decided that we'd wipe out the mackerel division. I had a 141 plywood boat (the Miss Maricopa) at the time, powered by a 30 H. P. Johnson. We roared out of Cholla Bay bright and early on a glassy sea, headed for far off Bird Island, On the Way to Cholla Bay

to slay some of the big macks that seem to hang around the rock all year long. Boy, did we ever load up. We completely filled our fish sacks with these razor toothed rascals, ranging in weight from seven pounders up thru husky twelve pounders (the derby winner weighed seven pounds). We thought that we had it made, till we headed back toward the bay. A 14' outboard in a 3' chop is not the fastest outfit in the world, and even tho we left the island about 3:30 P.M., it was practically dark by the time we -

limped damply back into the long closed up weighin scales, much too late to qualify. After drying out and cleaning up a bit, we found that the hungry derby participants had already eaten everything offered at the free fish fry, but, god love him, old Seth Smith had taken some prime elk steaks down to the bay, and he took pity on us two half drowned clowns, and fed us. Those were the good old days. No one had a depth finder in those days, but the way Al Scott, Bill Blair and some of those other old timers could plank their boat over a productive reef was uncanny.

One of the biggest derby thrills I think I ever got, was when I took a third place prize for a fish I wasn't even fishing for.

As I recall, Paul Schoonover was chairman that year. Realizing that I was completely outclassed in the bottom fishing divisions, I conned Bill Hammer and Lyle Underdown to join me on a boat trip to the First Estuary for some sea trout hunting. We beached inside the 'slough' and started working the shore line looking for trout. After about two and one half hours of flawless flinging fish foolers, I had a big fat zilch while Hammer and Lyle



FINDING DEVIATION OF A BOAT'S COMPASS

Most methods of finding the compass deviation are based on taking bearings on objects shown on a nautical chart. I have three government charts of the upper Gulf and unfortunately landmarks shown on all three charts are not shown as occurring at the same place. There is a difference of from two to five miles on the various charts. (1' of latitude equals 1 nautical mile.)

Pinacate has been moved around less than either Pelican Point or Rocky Point (possibly because of its size) and since it is approximately twenty-five miles from Cholla Bay using it for finding deviation will not introduce very much error. Preferably the boat should be anchored, but it can also be done with the boat underway, but remaining in as small an area as possible while making the observations. By observing the bearing of Pinacate on the compass as the boat heads in various directions, the deviation can be obtained for each heading for which an observation is taken, by comparison with the magnetic bearing taken from the chart








