Bringing Dogs Into U.S.

Public Health Service Foreign Quarantine Regulations 71.154 detail the restrictions on bringing dogs into the U.S.A. Please note that these regulations apply to any dog being brought into the U.S.A. --even if you took it out the U.S.A. for just a few hours or even minutes.

All dogs (except puppies and "wild dogs") must have a valid and current Rabies Vaccination Certificate. If the antirables vaccination was less than 30 days prior to entry into the U.S.A., the dog will have to be kept in "confinement" until the 30 day period is completed.

Puppies will have to be kept in "confinement" until three months of age, then have an antirables vaccination and this followed by "confinement" for an additional 30 days.

"WILD DOGS" do not require antirabies vaccination, but must be kept in "confinement" for six months.

"Confinement" as used above means "restriction of an animal by the owner or his agent to a building or other enclosure in isolation from other animals and from persons except for contact necessary for its care, or, if it is allowed out of such enclosure, muzzling the animal and keeping it on a leash."

You are expected to observe these requirements as a safeguard against the introduction of rabies. A person violating United States Foreign Quarantine Regulations, which provide for these requirements, is subject to a fine up to \$1,000 and/or imprisonment up to one year.

Incidentally the editor had one of his dogs die of rabies. Fortunately the dog had bitten a boy trying to climb in a window and was in confinement when she suddenly went "mad" ten days later. That dog had wild and furious rabies and there's no telling how many persons she would have bitten, if she hadn't been locked up. Rabies is definitely nothing to fool with and just remember that the above regulations are written - and enforced - to protect the public of which you are a part.



The Cone Shells of Cholla Bay

The members of the genus Conus, lamily Conidae, are freemoving animals that creep a cross the ocean floor on a flat disclike foot (figure 1). The shell of a typical cone is broad at the top of the body whorl and tapers gradually to a narrow base (figure 2). The spire is steplike or turreted in some forms, Ornamentation with blunt nodes at the shoulder, known as coronations is frequent, or there may be beads. The aperture is long, narrow, and mostly of uniform width. The outer lip is thin and sharp and is very easily broken or chipped as is easily attested by the frequented marked growth flaws. Sculpture varies -- some have axial stripes and some are very smooth

over the entire body whorl. Most cones have spiral lines or grooves on the base of the shell. Most cones have color patterns which make them beautiful and colorful shells. Most frequently cones are most colorful when in the younger days of their growth, changing as the shell reaches its full growth. Often this variation of coloration and even pattern causes the collectors difficulty in identifying species. Spire sculpture and height variations are also a confusing feature.

Most cones have a well-developed periostracum(a skin or horny covering on the exterior of the shell)often so thick it obscures the pattern and for this reason most collectors re-

move it using caustic solution, usually chlorox. Apparently most species have a small, slender, noncalcareous operculum, a plate serving to close the aperture, with a terminal nucleus, which is much smaller than the aperture and therefore offers little protection to the retracted animal. It is said to be absent in some species but possibly has been overlooked, being so small.

Most gastropods travel in search of their food. A great proportion of the marine gastropods are carnivorous. but some are detritus feeders. others are vegetarians. The mouth parts among the flesh-eating snails have modifications including the proboscis or snout. In some the snout remains very simple and the animal merely pushes the end of its mouth against its food and tears off bits with the tongue - like radula or row of teeth. In others a remarkably long, tube-like extention is developed which, when not in use, is retracted within the snout or head of the snail. The animal of the genus Conus has aroused much interest due to their unique possession among mollusks of a weapon which may cause death to a human being. In all species the radula has developed into a bunch of loosely attached, sharp, hollow teeth, often barbed, each of which is connected with a poison gland (figure 1). The animal is able to extract one of these teeth from its proboscis and "sting" its prey, which consists of such marine animals as annelid worms, small fish and other mollusks -- even cones. A number of painful injuries and a few fatalities have resulted in unwary collectors. This has not been known to occur to collectors in American waters, but it is advisable to handle the larger

species with care and not hold a live cone so that its aperture is in contact with the hand.

from the Gulf of California. Only three species, however, have been collected from the Cholla Bay -Puerto Penasco area.

Conus (Conus) princeps Linnaeus, 1758 (figure 2). The Princely Cone is of an orange or pink color with dark-brown wavy axial stripes that extend up onto the low spire. It has a heavy dark periostracum with wide-spaced bristly spiral lines. Length is up to two inches. It is usually found intertidally on rocky ledges.

Conus (Chelyconus) perplexus Sowerby, 1857 (figure 3). The Puzzling Cone is grayish white to pale violet and is covered with numerous spiral rows of brown dashes or dots. Axial stripes or blotches may appear on the spire and body whorl. This is the smallest of the Cholla cones being only about one inch long. It is common on sandbars such as those at Tucson Beach.

Conus (Chelyconus) ximenes Gray, 1839 (figure 4). This is a narrower shell than Conus perplexus and has a higher spire with a row of brown dots both above and below the suture. This species is about one and a half inches long and occurs intertidally in Cholla Bay and Nores Beach.




Figure #3 Conus perplexus Cholla A58-3




Figure #4 Conus ximines Cholla A58-12

There are more darn fish and more ways to catch them in the Sea of Cortez, than the average fisherman can get to, in the limited time of a usual weekend fishing trip.

For instance, starting at the North end, and working south, from El Gulfothrough Guaymas, the surf spin fisherman can cast lures to a variety of sport fish ranging from the tiny spoon-whapping Pompano up to the gigantic reel peeling Totuava.

In between these two extremes, all of which will readily make a pass at a casted lure, are Sea Trout, Mackerel, Yellowfin Corvina, Sardineros (species of Grouper) Bonefish, Lady Fish, Cabrilla Bass, Rock Bass, Cotchi, Barracuda (rarely), Flounder, small Halibut, Croaker of several types and even an occasional Roosterfish. There are undoubtedly many others I've failed to mention, but the point I'm trying to make, is that there are willing gamefish in just about any type of Gulf salt water you can cast a lure into, be it off a sandy beach, or deeper water surrounding shoreline rocks.

The boat fisherman has such a variety to fish for, that it would take a ream of paper to list them. When I first wet a line in the Gulf, back in '46, I'd fish out of Cholla Bay or Rocky Point from a 14' outboard for small type fish, such as Sea Trout,

Pompano, Sierra Macks, 2 to 10 lb. Pinto, and once in a while I'd luck into a California White Sea Bass or a Grouper.

When I graduated up to a 16' outboard, it opened up new vistas for me. With this seaworthy monster, I felt brave enough to venture far offshore in search of some 'rillee' big game.

I nailed my first Sailfish in 1950, and shortly thereafter my first Dolphin. If anybody ever figured out a way to get more hair raising fishing thrills than hooking either of these blue water beauts from a small outboard, I'd have to be shown.

Besides the thrill of these fighters, the smaller game fish found cruising the blue actually make the journey offshore worthwhile.

With the right (light) kind of tackle, the battle a 5 to 7 pound Skip Jack gives, you wouldn't believe. And these scrappers roam the blue during the summer months in tremendous schools, just itchin' for a fight. Larger (up to 15 pounds) Sierra and Spanish Mackerel use blue water as their hunting grounds, and if you don't think one of these babies can blister a thumb in one helluva hurry, try stopping his initial run with your pinkie.

Besides these surface gamesters you cannail from a boat in the Gulf, there are bottom fish galore to put a bend in a rod. Giant Black Sea Bass, the heavyweight of the Bass family seasonally roam the Rocky bottom off Cholla Bay, and hooking one of these babies is much like tieing a line to a Brahma Bull heading to pasture.

Yessir, the Gulf of California has something to offer to just about any fisherman looking for a fight--me, I'm a lover, and I'm still lookin' for that first merrimaid to be landed from Cholla Bay.

Wash and scrub clams well and place in a pan with 1/2 cup water. Steam for about 10 minutes. Remove from shells, save liquid, chop and combine with clam liquor. mushrooms, parsley, salt and pepper. Chop the bacon and add to mixture. Add enough bread crumbs to thicken. Mix thoroughly and fill clam shells. Sprinkle with bread crumbs, and place small piece of butter on each. Bake in moderate over (350°F) until brown on top. About 12 minutes.





a set of tools. Your battery is another thing that should be checked regularly.

Things you should carry: flashlight, compass, fire extinguisher, first aid kit, anchor with plenty of line, radio, flares and smoke pot, food and water for two or three days, life jacket for everyone in the boat.

If you get in trouble, drop anchor first thing. If you don't you could drift several miles one way or another which makes it harder to find you. Hail the first boat that comes along and let them know. Most boat operators are more than happy to help.

Be sure to file your "Float Plan" at the Cholla Bay Radio Station. When you do this the Search and Rescue team will know where to start to look, if you don't return in a reasonable time.

If you come in at night, watch out for the shallow tide and the rocks along the shore line. The red light is up in the air so it can be seen a long way out. When coming in to the landing the blue light should be directly under the red one. That will bring you in to the landing for the launcher to pick you up.


