

Best of luck to the new officers!



The Whales Come 70 The Shore 70 Die by Al Scott



YOU CAN SEE WHY I CHOSE TO STAY ON SHORE.
THIS IS A PICTURE OF A WHALE WASHED UPON SHORE.

I am sure I don't know why they wash into the shore to die, but I have seen several in the years past. One I can remember in particular that was washed upon the shore in the cove behind Cal Taylor's place. He was really a huge one, perhaps sixty or seventy feet long. This was at the time when everyone that fished at Cholla had a tent. The whales wouldn't be on shore very long before the sharks would have a ball, as well as other fish. We took pictures of them, as the body would waste away. The sharks would back off a few feet and swim so fast with their mouth wide open and take a big chunk from the carcass of the whale. Frank Claver has several movies of the sharks eating a whale over by the sand dunes. One killer whale washed upon the shore behind my cabin one time. We all went out to see it. My son cut some of the teeth out to use in his eighth grade class. I am told whales are harmless, but I often wonder if the whales know that.

I remember one time when some of us went out in a couple of boats on the reefs to fish. We had not been there long, when a big whale blew to the left, he almost blew us out of the boat, then one on the right blew, one in front of us and one in the rear blew. Man, my boat motor was already started and we took off slow at first until we thought we were away from them, then I wound my motor up to 3000 RPM. I headed toward El Gulfo. We ran for at least fifteen minutes at that speed, thinking we would be out of the herd of whales. We stopped and started fishing again. We just got our lines wet when they started blowing again. They were all around us. I will admit I am a coward, when something larger than me and my boat apprears, then I am the one who gives in. We took our lines in and headed for the big grey mountain called Cholla Bay.

I have heard a whale won't attack you, but do you recall the story of the couple a few years ago who were out fishing in the ocean and a big whale came up under their boat and took them up in the air a distance, they slid off the whale's back and no damage was done. I would guess they had to change clothes when they got in to Cholla. If you see a herd of whales out from Cholla, be sure to tell them I said, "Hello." I chose to stay on shore that day!

After you gather all of this paraphernalia together, look up Hector Munro, Pete or Marcello Salizar, or any one of the other first class Cholla Bay or Rocky Point fishing quides.

Personally, I prefer using 40-pound mono on a 4/o reel mounted on a limber fast taper rod, and my score of successfully landed black sea bass in a total of 30 years of Cholla fishing is an 18-pound sub-teenager and one gaff breaking 85-pounder. Nuff said.





RODGERS HOOKS FIRST BLACK SEA BASS

Boy, Talk about a buddy, last week I mentioned that the first black sea bass of the winter season should be caught momentarily, so just to keep me from being wrong, good old George Rodgers graciously roared out to an offshore Cholla Bay reef and whapped one.

Duke and Jane Miller hopped aboard Rodgers' 25-foot Glastron blue water machine, the "Oso", with Maxine and George, was Pete Salazar, as guide, for the quest. Pete headed the Oso on a 235-degree heading from Pelican Point, and some 24 miles out in slick, calm water slipped the anchor overboard in water about 180 feet deep for their first shot.

They worked this particular reef four hours, with Duke and Maxine hooking and losing several white sea bass and George losing a King Kom with fins after a tough 30-minute battle. Rodgers said he has no idea of how huge the fish was - it was hooked on a stout roller guide boat rod with a 6/0 Senator loaded with 135 pound test steel line - but he said that there was no way he could control the brute before the hook finally pulled out.

After sacking up several pinto, the group decided to try elsewhere, so Pete hauled anchor and headed the boat back to the 22 mile reef. Always thinking big, George laced a 9/0 hook with a whole chub mackerel garnished with squid tidbits and freespooled the whole glob to the bottom (135 feet) whereupon a cruising black sea bass inhaled the whole thing, hook and all. Rodgers set the hook and the battle commenced.

He really had his hands full with the rampaging brute. After about 20 minutes of straining and grunting give and take, George was almost convinced that he was hooked up with a giant ray, because the fish didn't quite behave like a big black. About 15 minutes later, he managed to crank the still-raging sea bass to the surface where everyone heaved a big sigh of relief, upon seeing it WAS a black. It was expertly gaffed and heaved aboard, to become prime table fare.

Incidently, besides nailing the season's first big black sea bass, this humble, though classy guy, has just been elected President of the Cholla Bay Sportsmens Club, and earlier this year, caught a 17-pound bull dolphin to fill out his required "Big 10" of Cholla Bay Fish species.

Good as he is, wife Maxine is dang close to eclipsing him, as she is the gal who caught the last black sea bass at the end of the last season (and in so doing took top honors at the annual CBSC fishing derby) plus she just has a short way to go to fill out her "Big 10" fish.

The white sea bass are still being taken out of Choll and now that the herds of big blacks are munching up over the reefs, plus the grouper and Pinto, the bottom fishing season is going full blast.
