A TRIP TO REMEMBER

In the early nineteen fifties Bill Blair, Chet Locker, and I had fished the Gulf out of Cholla Bay with some pleasant times to remember, but along comes a guy who tells us about a new place where the fishing is unbelievable with so many fish, Puerto Lobos. Being the three adventurous Wise Guys that we were, it was not long before we had a trip planned for Puerto Lobos. The guy gave us directions that a ten year old boy could follow, but not these three fishermen.

Bill Blair was driving pulling Chet Locker's 16 foot inboard boat, some several hours later, Hot Rod Driver, Bill Blair, and guests came to the Mexican border, and a sleepy little town called Sonoyta, Mexico. In those days one got his visa cross the street from where it is now. The cost was \$3.00. We had not been to Puerto De Lobos before, so did not know it was necessary to obtain a permit for the car and the boat, so we didn't tell them. This was a big mistake. Our visas in hand we checked the boat load, everything seemed okay, so we took off for town and some food.

The bridge across the river in Sonoyta had been out for a couple of years. We wondered if Bill's Ford would pull the boat across the river. When you came to the river, you would go down a hundred yards, going down the bank, cross the river, go up the other bank and on to town. There was a cafe where Vasquez Liquor Store is now. We entered and ordered a steak. The waiter brought a

salad of greens, and across mine, I saw a worm crawling across the lettuce. I called the waiter over and showed him the worm, he laughed, and took his finger and flipped him off, needless to say I didn't eat my salad. When they brought the steaks we had to laugh because we knew some cowboy had lost part of his saddle.

At last we were on our way to Caborca, one hundred miles. The road was undescrivable. It was gravel, and wash to cross every hundred yards. After a very tiring eight miles, we were surprised to see a sign that said Alto Aduana. An elderly officer came out accompanied by a young officer. We showed them our visas, but in broken English, we were told that we must have a permit for both car and boat. Chet Locker tried to bribe them, and the young man would have accepted it, but the older officer became very angry because we were trying to bribe him. At last a taxi driver came by who could speak English and he said the old officer said we better get back to Sonoyta quick. We tried to leave the boat and trailer, but he said, no, no, no, you go. So eighty miles back across the washes we went. We got our permit and started back, when we got back to the station only the young man was on duty. He looked at our permit and waved us on.

At this time you would cross the railroad track several miles west of Caborca, and go into town on the same road you go out on now to go to Lobos. Our directions said go up the main street, and turn right at some street, pass the Old Catholic Church, which was falling apart, through the alleys past houses, until you came to two ruts leading out to the country.

We did fine except he didn't tell us about the canal we had to cross, which was higher than the road. The inboard boat trailer would not make it without dragging. However, by taking it slow and at an angle, we at last got across by the big water tank on the side of the mountain, through the cattle guard, and the fine dust all the way to Puerto De Lobos.

We arrived at Lobos about dusk, and was received by a hundred children and that many dogs, so it seemed. People were staring out their windows, fifty or so adobe houses. The two story ice house had an apartment upstairs--people were hanging out the windows. It was high tide which was fortunate, as we didn't have much trouble getting Chat's boat through the sand to the water. WE WERE TOLD TO GO AROUND the point and fish on the west side. We followed these instructions and we hooked groupers so big, there was no way we could bring them up. We did catch a lot of big groupers. They let us put them in the ice house after we cleaned them. The next day we trolled Martin Flugs along the White Cliffs, and again a lot of big groupers and pintos. The third day we went straight out from shore five miles, and got into a big nest of red snappers.

What a marvelous place to fish, with most of our tackle gone and with more fish than we could take care of, we decided to head for Caborca, outside of Puerto De Lobos. We stopped to have a sandwich, and looked back at Lobos and knew we were hooked and each said we will be back.

Recipe For The Month

SAILORBURGERS

As the block ice starts to melt down, it's hard to keep hamburger meat fresh. But the crew, especially the teenagers, soon get tired of one-dish skillet casserole meals.

The joy of Sailorburgers is that you fry them up from canned goods. You need 1 can each of luncheon meat (12 oz. can), and either 1 can of canned turkey or chicken (5 oz.) 1 can cream of mushroom soup, an egg, some bread crumbs, and a small onion.

SLICE luncheon meat into small bits.

FORK in turkey or chicken, and mash until combined.

BLEND in slightly beaten egg and 1/4 cup of undiluted soup.

SEASON with 1/4 cup finely chopped onion, salt, coarse black pepper, and 1/4 tsp poultry seasoning (if available).

SHAPE into thick patties, then roll in fine dry bread crumbs.

FRY in greased skillet until heated through.

OPTIONAL: Prepare a sauce by diluting the remaining mushroom soup with 1/3 cup milk, heat and pour mixture over patties.

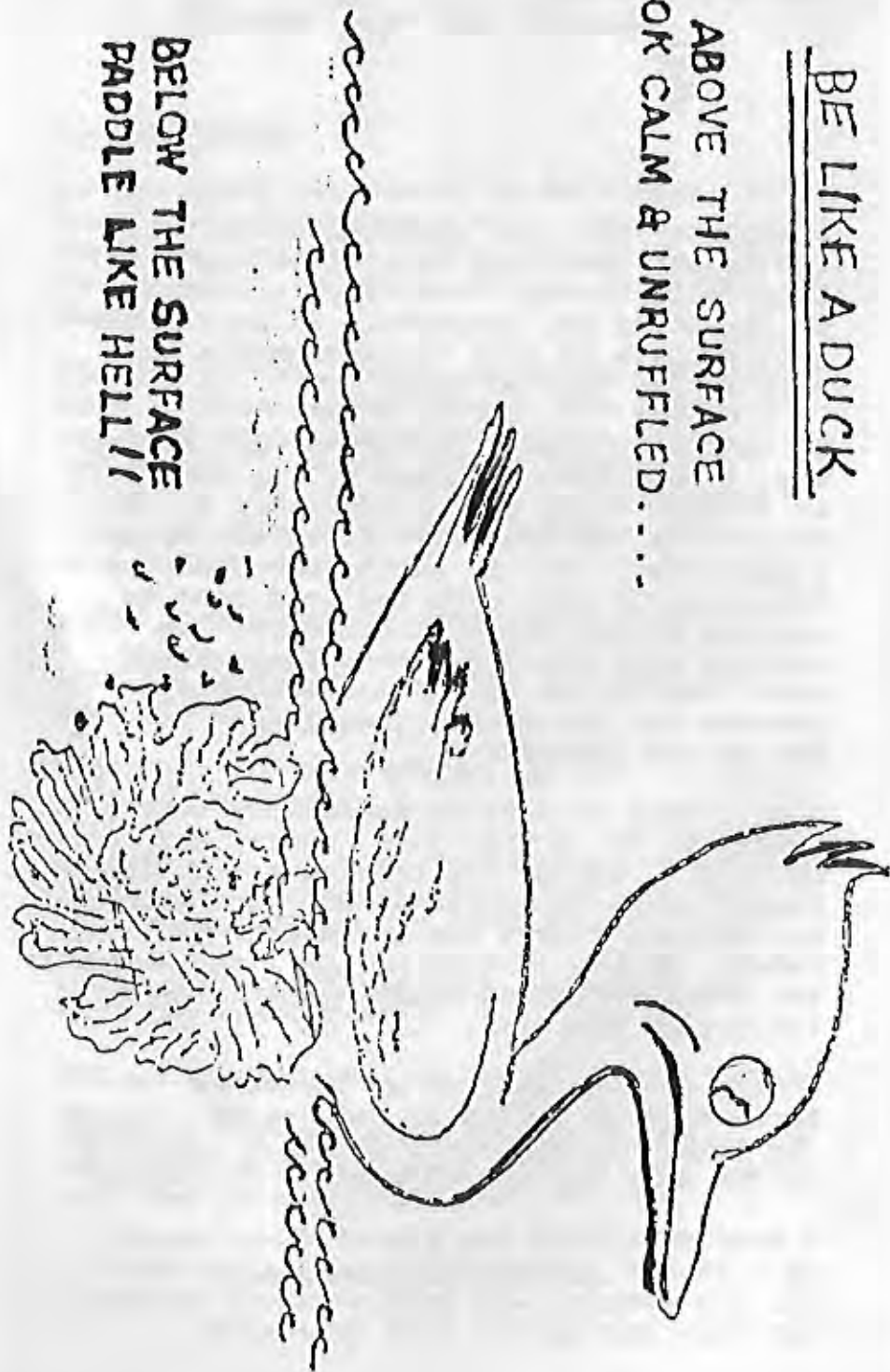
