In the past years the Christmas party has been mainly for families with children, or so I have been told, this year we tried to see that every family got something as well as single people and married couples without children. There was a lot left over for Senora Castillo, the Mayors wife, to help with her party in Puerto Penasco. We also had two turkeys and some other food for the Orphanage in Sonoita, with I might add is in dire need of help. They had been living mainly on tortillas and beans for the last few months, and had had no meat at all. Ann Faulkenberry, my co-chairman delivered the food there, and she was very distressed with this situation. She is deperately recruiting food and clothes for the orphanage.

We delivered a turkey, some food and citrus to the hospital, and they were very happy to get it. Dennis Holencamp (Vice Chairman of the Council) had a box so heavy that one of the Doctors, at the hospital, helped carry it back to the kitchen.

Every family and single individual received two boxes, and if they had children, toys and candy also.

Boxes consisted of:

1 dozen buns, 2 or more loaves of bread, 2 boxes of Cookie Crisp cereal, 5 lbs. four, 5 lbs. masa harina, 5 lbs. powered milk, sack of peanuts, 3 lbs. rice, 4 lbs. lard, head of lettuce, 1 or more heads of cabbage, potatoes, onions, green chiles, bananas, oranges, grapefruit, lemons, #10 can of fruit or vegetable, plus a smaller can of something. All families received a turkey, the size determined by the number in the family, couples with no children and individuals received a chicken.

The toy sack consisted of various toys with all girls, up to 13 receiving a doll. Boys from 3 up received a toy car. Small boys and girls were given a stuffed toy. Older girls received a comb, brush and mirror set, and older boys were given a Karate aftershave and soap set. Sand pails, shovels, toy boats, and chalkboards were added to the sacks.

We also thank Francisco "PANCO" Villa for portraying SANTA CLAUS, Betty Munro for delivering cards to our MEXICAN friends, who do so much to make our visits in MEXICO enjoyable.

We, Ann and myself, would like the C.B.S.C. to recognize all the people who helped assemble and deliver the gifts of food and toys donated by generous club members.

Our special thanks to those that displayed their talents in making, or furnishing things for the Christmas party. Special thanks to Jane and Wimpy Jaskowiak for the use of their home, away from home, for storage and assembling of gifts and JANE'S own CHILI for the work crew. Special thanks to Joanne Dernberger for refurbishing about 100 old dolls, and sewing new clothes for them. Thanks to all donors of food, clothes, candy, toys, cash, and other things that made this a very successful CHRISTMAS PARTY. Rubin Ortiz for allowing us to use the patio of the Cantina for the children to meet Santa and receive their candy.

Phil and Jane Huntzinger served tamales and drinks for all weary workers. It was a pleasant get together, because most of the GRINGOS in Cholla were local residents, or people that came down special for the Christmas Party. It was a fine climax for a joyous weekend.
