Has anyone tried the new restaurant in Rocky Point? The Costa Brava at the south end of the street past the pier and fish markets?

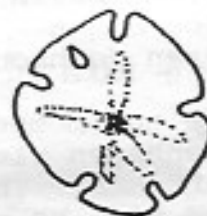

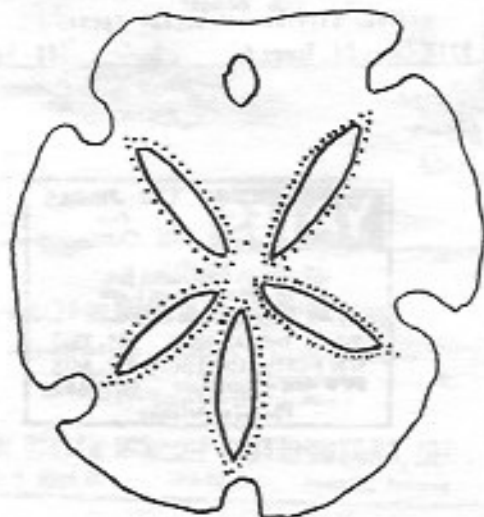
I have enjoyed doing the past 17 issues and will continue to assist Joe and Mary with future issues, by contributing articles and drawings.

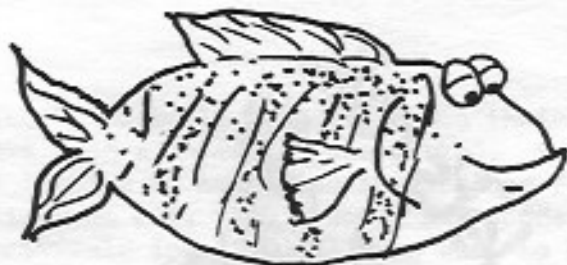

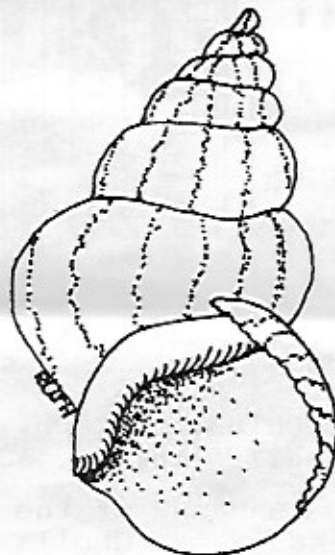

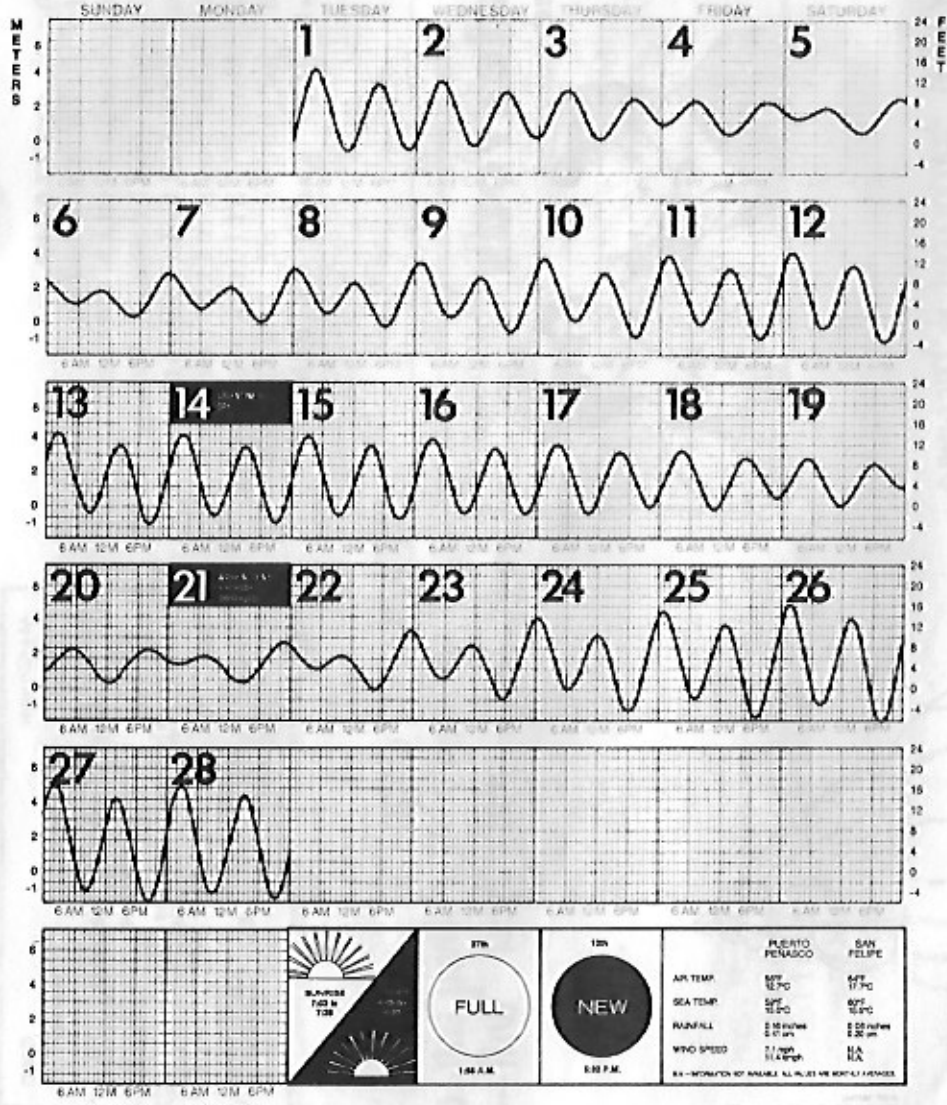
