sand


I love you ocean, your promise was true You washed away the sorrow and filled my heart anew





President, Dave Conner reported that the Fall dance will be chaired by Teresa Conner, Jane Ebert and Shirley Hemphill.


The avid fishermen are now catching Pinto at the Bay. Paul Schoonover said that he caught some nice ones a few weeks ago.

FIVE REASONS WHY...

The major reasons why everyone who goes to Cholla Bay should be a member of the Cholla Bay Sportsmen's Club are as follows:

- Most people are probably not aware of the fact that some years ago the
 members of the Club took dynamite, air compressors, drills, etc., to the
 Bay and drilled and dynamited all the big rocks from the launching area
 to make it what it is today. If this had not been accomplished it would
 not be possible to launch 115 boats in a week, because at that time there
 was only room for one boat to go in the water at a time between the rocks.
- 2. After a particularly difficult windy weekend of boat-launching in 1958, which included pushing, roping, chaining, wading and struggle, L.B. Stewart and I took a good look at what seemed to be the answer to boat launching. We came home with plans to build a better boat launcher. We bought two model-A Fords and took them to L.B.'s shop, and we started working on our idea. Other members have adopted our ideas...
- 3. The radio alone is one of the best reasons. The many trips to Cholla by many people to see about getting the license, trying to get batteries, finding operators, repairing and bettering the equipment... has resulted in our having a real working safety factor. Who can say how many lives our radio has saved?
- 4. Search & Rescue...what a wonderful feeling to know that if you are having trouble someone will be looking for you before long. You don't even have to be a member of the Club, S & R will come anyway. But if you were a member, it would mean that you were helping with the expenses.
- 5. The check-out system, required so that we know where you are and can send help if you do not come back when expected, is one fine reason to belong to CBSC. It would work better if everyone remembered to fill out a slip...




SUPER NACHOS


21b 8oz can refried beans



Nacho's Cross...

The large white cross atop a rocky hill near the entrance to Cholla Bay is a familiar land sight. It used to gleam brightly in the sun in the olden days when it was kept freshly painted white by the man who erected it. our old beloved friend, Nacho, of whom we have now but a memory and his cross. Many have asked the significance of this white cross that greets all visitors coming to the Bay, why it was put there and by whom.

This is the story as told by Nacho a few years before his death:

"My full name is Ignacio C. Quiroz, of Castillian Spanish descent and very proud of that. I was really the first person to live at Cholla Bay. I came first in 1931 with the intention of building a trailer court at the Bay and my original cement slabs are still there at the foot of the cross - that is what is left of them. I did not stay very long

this first time, returning to Sonoyta and Ajo where I lived until 1938 when I again came to the Bay, but again I did not stay very long. My trailer park plan did not work very well. In 1941 I came to Cholla Bay to stay and here I have lived most of the time since then. I was a very sick man when I came here but I gradually regained my health and here at Cholla Bay is where I feel the best. In 1941 I secured first a land grant on the Cholla Bay area for rental purposes and in 1945 negotiated through officials at Hermosillo for the purchase of the property.


"I prospered in my business of rentals and operating a general store and was very happy. I appreciated the many people who came from the United States and were responsible for my prospering as I did. As a token of appreciation and a symbol of friendship I decide to have a cross built and placed on this high hill where everyone could see it. That cross is my way of saying 'Thank You' to my American friends."

Nacho told also about the people of Puerto Penasco coming to the Bay on May 5th of each year, the day of the Cinco de Mayo celebration - the Day of the Holy Cross. They would decorate the cross with flowers and kneel there to say their prayers. A priest, whose name Nacho could not remember, came from Phoenix to bless the cross, It was used for years also at Easter Time by the Mexican natives as the Holy Place where they came to say their rosary and prayers.

That cross meant much to Nacho. Now he is gone and can no longer see that it is kept freshly painted and gleaming white in the years to come. 
