We will have free hot dogs, beans and pop at the awards ceremony May 24th.

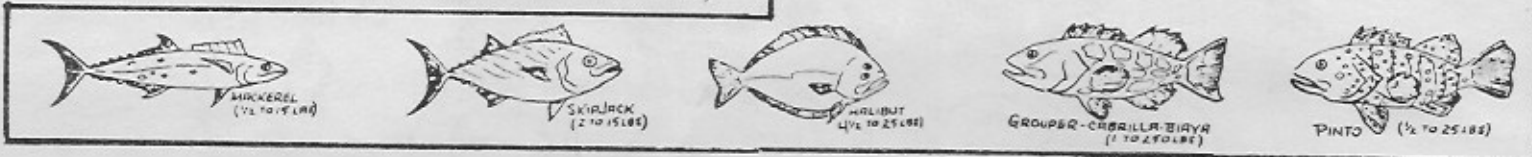

DERBY RULES - - 1981

1. Each contestant participating in the Derby must have a valid Derby ticket before starting to fish. Participants must also have a valid Mexican Fishing License and all boats must have a valid boat permit. All fishing must conform to Mexican Law. One derby ticket per person is good for two weekends of the derby. Fish must be caught with hook and line.
2. Derby entries will be accepted on weekends only, starting May 16. Scales will be open Saturdays and Sundays from 10:a.m. until 6:p.m.
SUNDAY - MAY 24: Fish MUST BE WEIGHED AND REGISTERED BY 5:p.m. ABSOLUTELY NO EXCEPTIONS....
3. Judging: Judging of fish for prizes will be done by Judges appointed by the Council with an equal number from each Chapter.
4. Prizes: There will be a Grand Prize Winner for men and women. Additional prizes will be awarded for First, Second and Third Place in each category of fish. Prizes will consist of trophies, cash and merchandise.

5. Presentations: Awards will be presented on the evening of the 24th of May - the last day of the derby following the dinner to be held at the "Fish Fry - Weiner Roast" building.

6. Classes of fish eligible for prizes will be as follows:

Grouper	Pargo
Pinto	Skip Jack
Black Sea Bass	Flounder
Sea Trout	Cochi

7. Jack Pot: Jackpot tickets will be sold prior to and during the derby and will be available to anyone wishing to purchase them. It is not necessary to participate in the derby in order to purchase a Jackpot ticket. Cash will be awarded to the winning jackpot ticket holders. Winning tickets will be drawn at the awards ceremony. Winners need not be present to win. There will be several drawings of \$100, \$50, and \$25.

VHF - CHANNEL 16

A special committee recently completed the installation of a remote base station for VHF Channel 16 at Rocky Point.

The purpose of this installation is to give clear reliable contact between the Cholla Bay radio and boats at sea. VHF Channel 16 is the international distress calling channel and for making contact boat to boat and boat to shore.

This channel must be kept clear of conversation...after original contact... immediately change to another channel for conversation.

All VHF radios should be monitoring Channel 16 at all times when not talking on another channel.

The club radio committee is in the process of changing the existing repeater from Channel 20 to 26 as some radios do not have Channel 20. This channel is the appropriate one for boat to boat and boat to shore conversation. The repeater should pick up and rebroadcast any signal in the Rocky Point area to give greater range and coverage.

The remote base station was assembled by Larry Hittle and Tom Mills with the cooperation of Pete Petersen. Les Ormsby worked with this crew to make the installation.

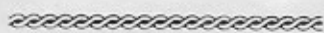

Paul reported that the expansion of the radio shack is coming right along as well as Migeulto's office (which is being done at no expense to the club).

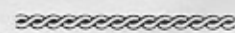
George Rodgers reported on the Derby and there is more information coming. (you can find it in the CHATTER this month)

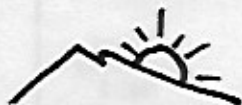
