





#### 1982 FISHING DERBY RULES

- Each contestant participating in the Derby must have a valid Mexican Fishing License and a valid Derby Ticket before starting to fish. All boats must have a valid Mexican Boat Permit and must fill out a launch slip prior to entering the water. All fish must be caught on hook and line.
- 2. Classes of fish eligible for prizes:

Grouper Pinto Black Sea Bass Sea Trout Pompano Mackerel Dolphin Red Snapper Pargo Flounder

Cochi Sardinero Leather Fish Skip Jack Sailfish

3. Judging and Prizes:

Fish will be judged according to weight. There will be a Grand Prize Winner for men, women and juniors (15 years of age or under). Fish taking a Grand Prize Trophy will not be eligible for any other awards. Additional awards will be given for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each catagory of fish. Awards will consist of trophies and cash.

4. Registration and weighing of fish:

The scales will be open for weighing from 10:00 A.M. until 6:00 P.M. each day of the Derby, except Sunday, May 30, 1982 when the scales will close promptly at 5:00 P.M. (Derby days are as follows: Saturday and Sunday, May 22nd and 23rd, and Saturday and Sunday, May 29th and 30th.


5. Derby Tickets:


Derby tickets which entitles the purchaser to fish all four days of the Derby may be purchased prior to and during the Derby for \$10.00 per adult and \$5.00 per junior. Daily Derby tickets may be purchased on the days you wish to fish only, for \$4.00 per adult and \$2.00 per junior.

6. Fish Fry and Awards Coremony:

The Fish Fry will begin at 6:00 P.M. on Sunday, May 30, 1982. The Awards Ceremony and Jackpot ticket drawings will follow the Fish Fry.





- 1 can (10 oz.) condensed golden mushroom soup
- 1 can (7oz) whole kernel corn
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. chili powder
- 1 1/2 C. instant rice
- 1 med. tomato, cut in eighths
- 1 green pepper, cut in strips

Brown beef in skillet, leaving meat in large chunks. Add onion and cook over medium heat until tender. Add water, soup, corn, salt and chili powder. Bring to a boil. Stir in rice. Add tomato and green pepper. Cover and simmer 5 minutes. Fluff with fork. Makes about 5 servings.


