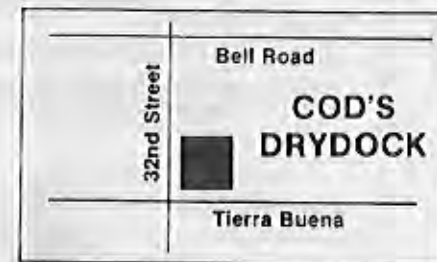

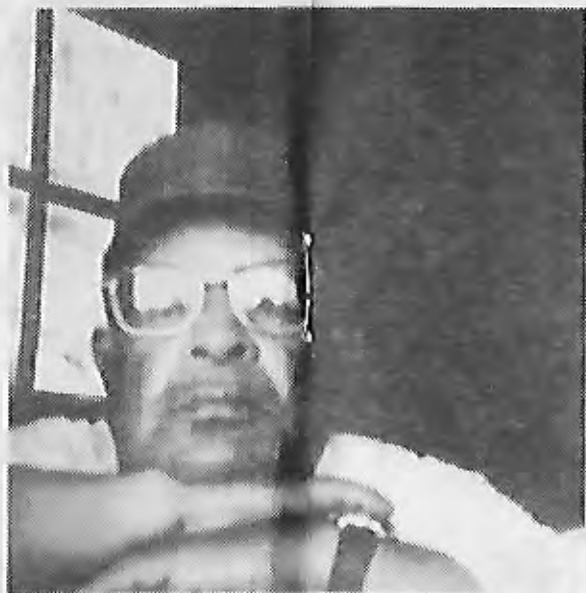

Last time we were at the Bay, I was down on the radio room porch yaking with some of the guys, when a 17ft. or 18ft. open boat being pulled by one of the launchers stopped right in front of us. The captain jumped out and ran up to the window and filled out his launch slip, then off the porch and with one jump was back in the boat and almost as quick, popped the top of a Coors can with one hand starting it in the general direction of his mouth, and with the other hand, reached for the key switch and fired off the engine. His engine must have just had a very fine tune up because it was running almost before that Coors can hit his mouth. I really admire a man with that kind of coordination and also a fine tuned engine like he had, but I do think his timing was off a little. With his boat still on the trailer behind the launcher, two or three hundred feet from the water, by the time that launcher got the little boat turned around and backed down to the water, that captain had his Coors downed and that boat was putting out little white clouds of steam like it was going to sea as a Stanley Steamer.

I don't know if this is the way this captain launches every time but if it is, he must spend a lot of money on water pump impellers for one thing. The other thought that came to me was that he never opened up the motor cover, and I didn't see him turn on the bilge blower. There was an outside chance that the cute thing sitting on the motor cover could have been singing, "Come fly with me" as she and the motor cover went, "VAROOM" up up and away! Had there been gas fumes in the bilge, it can happen so easy.

No outboard or inboard/ outboard, should ever be started and run without water to the water pump or cooling system. Most pumps are small in design and will pump a lot of water but it only takes a few seconds running dry to damage the rubber impella and cause a failure or weak pump action couaing your engine to over heat at higher speeds.
