and the other half will be donated to the Radio Shack for its needs. SORRY about that, Glenn.



OUR TRIP TO EL GULFO by Shelly Bock

Early one chilly November morning, an adventurous group, Bucky and Glenda Maude, Ed and Marty Perlmutter, Lou and Shelly Bock and Wally Schmerfield, left Cholla Bay in search of the great town, El Gulfo. El Gulfo is a fishing village located 90 miles north of Cholla Bay close to the Yuma border. Bundled up and raring to go, in vehicles loaded to the hilt with needed supplies, mostly cerveza, the weekend excursion began.

We were only two miles out of Cholla Bay, on the Black Mountain Road, laughing and talking when suddenly Wally began frantically jumping up and down in the back seat of Lou and Shelly's V.W. Thing. "Watch out.!", he screamed. Swerving quickly, we just barely missed rear-ending Bucky and Glenda's beach buggy. Boy that was a close one. We backed up to the beach buggy to find out why they had stopped, and saw that the dash on the ignition was smoking and Bucky was grasping at wires in the back of the car. Already we had experienced a near accident and an electrical fire, and were not quite sure if we were going to make it. However, after taking the dash board apart, taping several wires together, disconnecting a few others and with spirits high we proceeded down the road. We passed Black Mountain and headed towards the shell cliffs.

As we neared the cliffs, Bucky's beach buggy began overheating, so we pulled to the side of the road to let it cool down. Glenda decided this was the perfect time for her famous" Tornadoes". If you have never had any of Glenda's Tornadoes, you'll have to go up to her cabin and ask her to mix one for you. It is a delicious drink and a real eye opener too, especially at 9:00 in the morning.

Back in the vehicles, after finishing the refreshments, we drove north away from the beach area into the desert toward the first railroad station. On this long barren road, which seemed endless, Bucky's beach buggy began having heating problems again. We stopped about every fifteen minutes to let the car cool down while we drank beer and tornadoes. By 12:00 noon, we still had not reached the second railroad station. We were now approximately two hours behind our estimated travel schedule.

When we neared the sand dunes Bucky took the wrong road, leading him straight into the mud flats, where he promptly became quite immovable. So far none of the problems we encountered had yet to stop us and when we saw a railroad work car with lots of mexican neighborly help coming down the track, we knew it was our lucky day. Of course I'm sure they didn't think the gringos and gringas in the two overloaded vehicles in the middle of nowhere, stuck in the mud flats was an unusual site, so they cheerfully jumped off the work car and came to our rescue. They freed the beach buggy by digging a trench under the back tire, placing a railroad tie into it and pushing the buggy while the V.W. Thing pulled. We offered our new friends beer for their kindness but they turned it down. Today was tequila day for them as they held up their bottle and waved goodbye.

Everyone was sure excited to hop back into the mud-filled buggy, but it didn't spoil our fun and off we went. After crossing several more dunes we finally had the second railroad station in site. It is approximately forty miles from Cholla Bay to this railroad station and the point where we began driving towards the beach. This is a well traveled, graded road which we later learned is the road to the salt mines. Here we passed two, ten-wheeler trucks, both carrying enormous loads of salt. As we neared the beach, we saw several square miles of land where they mine salt. At high tides, ocean water is pumped into these flat lands. When the water evaporates, the remaining salt is picked up by tractors, loaded into trucks and taken to the railroad station. For those of you who fish, the salt mines are located directly behind the double dunes.

After reaching the beach, which is approximately 20 miles from the second railroad station, Wally (the rockhound) Schmerfield, told us all about the fossilized sea shells which lay scattered around the beaches in this area. We also passed a few cliffs which were also fossilized.


About fifteen miles down the beach, we came upon a fishing village. There were fifty or so pongas in this small town which are mainly used for hunting shark. Hundreds of shark heads lay scattered upon the beach. The flies and smell of this town was atrocious. Because none of us had ever been to El Gulfo, we thought this might be the place. Hoping and praying that it wasn't, we left quickly to look further down the beach.

About ten miles from the fishing village, in a bay area, scattered ramadas and a cantina overlooked beautiful, clean white beaches. We had found El Gulfo. We had a few more hours until darkness, so we took a leisurely tour of the town. The homes are very quaint and covered with much greenery. There are also many restaurants, supermarkets and gas stations in such a small town and everything is extremely clean. The people of El Gulfo are very friendly and helpful to the gringos.

After seeing the town, we drove back to the ramada areas to make camp. We unloaded, had a few relaxing drinks and hors-de-ourves (chips) then watched one of the most spectacular sunsets we had ever seen. The bay danced and sparkled as if on fire and held the majestic shrimp boats silhoutted against giant redish orange mountains. We were mesmorized by this sunset until the glowing ball of fire became darkness.
