Search and Rescue has been very lucky thru the years in not loosing any lives or loosing any boats that checked out of the Search and Rescue radio room. This makes us very proud of course but we keep reminding ourselves that we must never let down and think our work is done, we must stay alert and we must keep teaching safety, safety, safety.

The club as a whole is safety minded now because we keep harping on it, teaching it, and practicing it. Everytime I hear a boat calling in from the reefs to Betty Munro saying "I am coming in is every thing O.K?" I know that all our had work thru the years is paying off. Everytime I hear a boat check out with a buddy boat I know our work is paying off.

Now I would like to make everyone aware of another problem that we don't know yet how we are going to solve this one.

It is Scuba diving. We must, all of us that have young people that is getting into scuba diving, make sure they get proffessional instruction and never go down with out a buddie that is a buddie that is knowledgable in this sport.

It is a crying shame that a young man in his early 20's had to die right on our front door so to speak. The very sad part of it all is there is little we can do to control this type of self distruction.

In the case of Gene Farmer, and I'll quote from the Search and Rescue log of May 28, 1978 that Betty keeps up, this was the young mans first attempt at scuba diving, that he was found in 35 foot of water, 10 feet from his tanks and the tanks still had air in them, it was a case of panic and a lack of experience," unquote. Thanks to Hal McKenzie and his crew Robert Read and Mark Maiers they were the First boat on the scene in the, "Honey Too" and diver Earl Greene, and the second boat it was their quick actions that saved the life of the girl diver with Gene Fowler.

Efforts of the Search and Rescue team Doctor and nurse could not save the boy.

He was flown back to the states the next morning.

The point of all this is lets take care of each other and lets not venture into the unknown unless we are experienced or with an experienced person that is able to handle the circumstances into which we put ourselves.
