79-lbs. grouper wins for Guinns

CHOLLA BAY, Mexico - Doris Guinn, a resident of Cottonwood for most of her life, won the Cholla Bay Sportsman Club Fishing Derby women's trophy for catching a 791/2 pound grouper Saturday, May 22.

The 25th annual Derby ran for two consecutive weekends, May 22-23, and May 29-30, although the winning fish were caught on the first weekend

The grouper was caught 22 miles out from Cholla Bay, which lies on the Baja Peninsula in Mexico.

Her's was the largest grouper caught in five years, Guinn said, but the next day another contestant caught one that weighed in at 82 pounds, to win the men's and the overall winner trophy.

Guinn is an avid deep-sea fisherman. "Our boat doesn't leave the dock without me," she said. Two years ago it didn't, and she won the women's trophy in 1980 with a 38pound grouper.

"That was just a little baby one," Guinn said

The fishing had dropped off the last few years, Guinn said, but seems to be picking up again in that

Guinn's husband, Harley, caught a 59-pounder during the contest, which was also one of the bigger groupers to be caught in recent years. Several years ago, he caught a 327-pound black sea bass in the same area, although not on a contest weekend.

Groupers are tough fish to pull out of the water, Guinn said. They are bottom feeders, usually found from 85 to 180 feet down, and since they're too large to be reeled in with conventional tackle, they have to be "hand-lined" up.

Guinn was using a deep sea rod, and a 9.0 reel with 300-pound test line. "You feel a quick jerk," she said, "and you have to head them up as fast as you can. Otherwise they'll sound and swim in among the reefs. If they do that, the only thing you can do is cut your line."

With her husband on hand to help land the fish, Guinn said it didn't take more more than 10 to 15 minutes to bring it up.

The Guinns are members of the Cholla Bay Club, and often fish that area on the Baja. She has many stories about what can happen on expeditions of this nature.

"I remember one time we were there, and some guy was out past dark," she said. "You are supposed to sign in and out so if you're late getting back you'll be missed and looked for

"Anyway, this guy went out with no buddy boat, and somehow his batteries went dead, so he couldn't start his engines. The wind came up, and the fog rolled in, and he was really in a dangerous situation. He finally found a flashlight to signal with, until the batteries in the flashlight went dead. Then the battery that powered his radio went. too. They finally found him around 3 or 3:30 in the morning.


"The search and rescue team down there has got to be one of the finest in the country," Quinn said.

Until next month. Be good to yourselfvisit Cholla Bay.



27th ANNUAL FISHING DERBY By Betty Munro

It was May 22nd, opening day of the 27th annual Fishing Derby held by the Cholla Bay Sportsmen's Club. Approximately fifteen boats were scattered over the 22 mile reef. Everything was running according to schedule except for the water and it was kicking up swells three to four feet high. You could hear the slich slouch of the boats as the swells made their anchor ropes taunt and put the anchors to a test. Occasionally you heard the pop of a cervaza can giving in to the hands of an eager early morning drinker. About 8:15 a.m., from the decks of HARLEY GUINN'S boat the RIVER WITCH came a war hoop that would make any Indian take a back seat. The source of this cry was the usually sedate DORIS GUINN. Capt. HARLEY and his guest crew GLEN & DORIS DAVIS snapped to attention. Fast thinking GLEN jumped off his seat to assist DORIS, who by now had that, "I've got a whopper on my line," look on her face as she bent in half over the side of the boat. GLEN moved but his swim trunks didn't. They were caught on the seat GLEN jumped out of. Have you ever seen "a streaker" in 22 mile reef? Yep - GLEN DAVIS "mooned" every boat around him before he got command of the situation and lend a helping hand to struggling DORIS. Whatever the price of pride paid off, as DORIS brought to the surface a 792 pound grouper. GLEN was ready with the gaff and helped to flog the giant on the That $79\frac{1}{2}$ pounder won DORIS top decks. honors for the biggest fish brought in by a woman. We all thought DORIS had the whole derby sewed up including the GLEN DAVIS \$100 pool. For those of you who haven't heard about this pool, it all began four years ago when GLEN got the idea and talked a small group of guys into uptting up \$100 wach to enter their boats in the contest. boat bringing in the largest fish during the derby won one-half the pool money and the other half was donated to the CBSC to purchase special equipment for the betterment of the radio-search and rescue operations. One year they bought the solar panels to generate power to keep the radio batteries charged. Last year's money was turned over for a new directional finder for the CB radio in the radio room. Almost

every boat now has a CB aboard and if a person gets in trouble on the water and can transmit a radio signal, the home base radio operator can pick up their signal and pin point their compass heading out of Choya. GLEN says this year's money, \$1000, is going towards beautifying the launch area and make it more enjoyable for the spectators and more eye appealing. Watch for some interesting changes. GLEN also said his is open for good, concrete suggestions. If you have one, get in touch with him.


