COUNCIL REPORT

The following actions were taken by the Council at the May meeting:

Funds were approved for the purchase of binoculars and a good barometer for the radio

Approval was given for funds to improve the steps at the fish fry shack. The present steps are very steep and narrow and are a safety hazard. Safer steps will be built.

Construction of an additional length of retaining wall at the radio building was authorized.

Establishment of an award for a MINI - 5 in addition to the BIG 10 award was approved. The MINI 5 card will cost \$5.00. All fish must be verified at the radio shack. Requirements for this award are:

The radios in the radio shack will be upgraded. The first action will be to improve the VHF radio performance. Funds were approved to purchase new equipment for the repeater located on the mountain in Rocky Point. This up to date equipment will improve reliability and enable us to cover substantial areas around Cholla Bay.

If you have been to the Bay recently, you may have noted that some of the authorized improvements have been completed.



DAY THREE - SATURDAY MARCH 19, 1983

Boy was our trail boss mad!! Well you see the sun was shining; it was the first day we saw a blue sky; we only had 46 miles to go; it was the last leg of the trip and we were slow in moving.

But the magic words finally worked and we were in the river bottom (dry today) at 8:50 A.M.

A visitor joined us on this leg of the trip using the spare ATC from the support truck (see credits on Page 13) and Shay, also, took on a passenger.




A FEW PARTING WORDS.....



NAVIGATOR'S NOTEBOOK

Last month, in talking about speed, time and distance, we mentioned the nautical mile. The length of the nautical mile was determined by dividing the circumference of the earth (131,241,600 feet), by 360°, then by 60 to find the length of one minute arc. One minute (01') of arc on the surface of the earth equals 6076 feet. This is one nautical mile.

The location of a point on the surface of the earth is described by it's Latitude and Longitude.

Longitude is the distance East or West of Grenwich, England defined in degrees to a maximum of 180° and labled East or West.

Latitude is the distance North or South of the equator defined in degrees to a maximum of 90° and labled North or South.

For instance, the location of Pelican Point at Cholla Bay is 30°21.5' North and 113°40.2' West.

On a nautical chart of an area, the longitude scale is drawn on the top and bottom of the chart. East is on the right hand side and West on the left hand side.

The Latitude scale is on the sides with North at the top and south at the bottom.

Because one minute of latitude equals one nautical mile, regardless of your location, the latitude scale of your location may be used as a mileage scale. Do <u>not</u> try to use the longitude scale. The Latitude scale is usually drawn to .01'. Therefore the scale is to .01 nautical mile.




