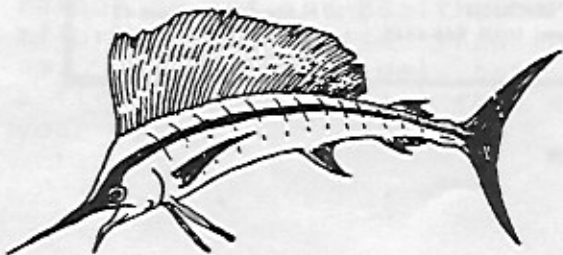

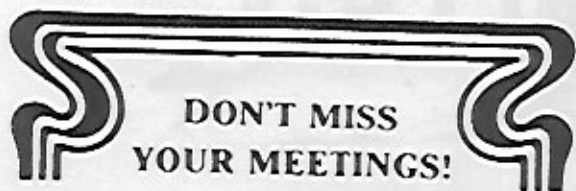



Stay Safe In The Water

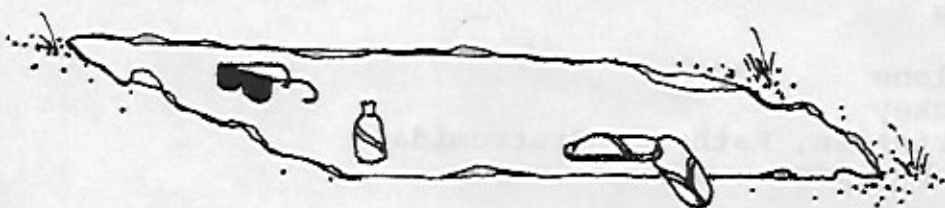
- Don't swim alone.

• Don't depend on a tube or other recreational floating aids for non-swimmers.

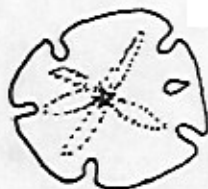
- Wear a life vest while waterskiing.
