

The CBSC 28th annual fishing derby is now history, its record catches recorded, prizes awarded and results printed in the last month's Chatter. Keeping this in mind I will try not to repeat stories and bore you. However, between derby weekends, May 23-26, some fish were brought in that can be classified as real belly benders, and they deserve a mention. Some of the guys claim they literally bent in half trying to stay on board, hold onto their lines and land their fish. Their only trophies are their memories, but memories don't collect dust and they do last a lifetime. Every time the memory is relived it's like feeding the fish and the more you feed them the more they can grow--so as the years roll by the trophies and fish grow and grow and grow.

One gentleman who took home to Tulare, Calif. a memory trophy was Martin Moore. This 72 yr. old youngster caught his first 50 lb. grouper. "When that fish hit I thought all of King Neptune's army had grabbed my line", he declared as he relived the story. He did admit that he was lucky to have been fishing on the "Muddobber" because without Art's assistance on the gaff, he didn't think he could have pulled his fish into the boat. It was Martin's first trip to Mexico, but not his last..he hopes. He celebrated his catch by going to Patty and Ramon's curio shop and buying the biggest sombrero he could find. Martin left Choya wearing his green sequined sombrero singing 'Ole!!

Fishing is definitely in the blood of the Moore family. Every morning, for the ten days she was there, before 6 A.M. you would see 73 yr. old Gladys Moore perched on her seat in the "Muddobber" drinking her coffee waiting for the launcher. "I'm not going to be left behind", she notified her group. Her patience wasn't rewarded with a big one, but she did provide the boat with bait for the others to fish with. Using some of her bait, her son Paul from Fresno, caught a 45 lb. grouper. Paul caught it on a light pole with 60 lb. test line. Some battle but Paul won. Nina, Paul's wife caught four sardinersthe largest one weighing 12½ lbs. Salvador Arviso, one of Choya's fishing guides, flopped a 4 ft. eel on the deck causing everyone to do a fancy two step getting out of it's way. They said that eel was one mad, mad hombre. The panic didn't settle until Salvador finally clubbed it in the head. Salvador's plans were to skin it and make himself a belt. Just so he doesn't drop it into a bottle of mescal-that would be some worm to swallow if and when your turn came around.

Sedona-Cottonwood area was well represented in Choya that weekend in May. Bobbie Brewer had his Tih Sepa, Russ Crosen, his Pay Back, and Sam his Tennis Shoe. Turned out he got there just in time to grab on to Keith as a 76 lb. grouper began to give him the fight of his life. Keith landed it, but for his bad luck it was not a derby fishing day. Had it been the right day he would have been some competition for the champ, John Hornick.



Freedom Won did it again. Tim Bottcher brought his father-in-law, Don Gerkin, from Denver, Colo. and Don's buddy from Kansas City, R. E. Adams to Choya for a sensational fishing trip. The first day Tim couldn't find his guide, Pete Salazar, so he took command and they managed to catch 2 grouper, 4 pinto and 6 sardinero. Second day with Pete in command they cought so many fish Tim cried "uncle" and ordered everyone to reel in and save some fish for another day. Don brought in a 56 1b. grouper which he carried around on the beach like it was a sardine. This was his fish..he hooked it, landed it, weighed it and carried it to the slaughter table for the fish cleaner. By the time he reads this back in Denver, he has no doubt eaten it. Don's buddy, R. E. Adams was no novice to the game and he landed a 50 lb. grouper.

All this is to tell you one thing..if you can stand a little warm humid weather, right now is the best fishing of the year. These are just a few of the fish stories told to me and there are many more untold tales happening every day in Choya.

PENPOINT . . . From the Editor



A Trip to the Pinacates....Wonderful!

We(Conners, Eberts, Olsens, McKnights, Hausers, Bushongs, and Hemphills) departed from Cholla Bay on a Saturday morning with our sandbuggies in tow with the exception of one, which had been driven by Bushongs from Phoenix. It was the first excursion into the Pinacates for all of us except the wagon master and tour guide, Dave Conner.


