






STEAK FRY AT CHOLLA BAY



The summer season is here and heat and humidity abound, plus my heat rash has started again. Yuk!! This is also my indicator to start thinking about leaving Cholla for about 6 weeks. We call this exodus, our vacation.

We later learned that he had anchored his boat, at the launch area, on the incoming tide and had stopped to visit some friends. He came back in time to see the boat heading out to sea.

Remember the Super Jackpot at our May Derby, well Glen Davis thought a jackpot for the biggest sailfish and dorado would be worthwhile. By the last weekend of the Derby, Glen had quite a few entries. For those of you who don't know about these jackpots, let me explain; half of the prize goes to the winner - the other portion is donated to the Club for a worthwhile project which the Club couldn't afford without help. A few of these projects are: The CB Direction finder, the walk from the road to the Radio Shack, and now the Fish Fry Shack is being worked on - a concrete walk around the building, a patio and a large barbecue grille will be installed. This will enable the Club to use these facilities for picnics, pot luck dinners, etc.

Nothing to report on break-ins or arrests this month. Everything is quiet, hopefully it will stay that way.

COUNCIL REPORT

The Cholla Bay Sportsmen's Club Council met July 14th. Discussions and actions taken were as follows:

- ·Thanks were extended to Chris Tatum for his efforts in obtaining binoculars and a barometer for the radio shack.
- ·Results of the Fishing Derby were reviewed.
- ·Fans will be installed in the fish fry shack for the comfort of those working the fish fry.
- ·Equipment for the new VHF radio system has been shipped and will be installed in the near future. Funds were approved for purchase of a 60' pole to improve VHF radio performance. Additional funds were also authorized to increase solar energy capacity.
- ·Council was advised that Agustin's contract had been renewed for a period of one year as previously authorized by the council.
- ·Results of a discussion with Mexican officials held the weekend of July 4th were reviewed. Topics discussed with these officials included:
- Operation of the gas station in Cholla Bay.
- Regulations on fishing licenses and boat permits.
- Steps which can be taken to improve tourism in the Puerto Penasco area. Importance of consistant, courteous treatment by Mexican Customs Officials at the border was emphasized.

The Council members represent you. Keep them advised of your opinions and desires on the operation of the Club.





SOUR CREAM ENCHILADAS

Sauce:

Combine the following: 2 cans cream of chicken soup $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sour cream (more if desired) 1-2 cans diced green chilis teaspoon salt

Filling:

2 cups grated long horn cheese $\frac{1}{2}$ cup chopped green onion or chives

Additional ingredients:

1 dozen corn tortillas 1 cup cooking oil

Heat oil and dip tortillas one at a time for a few seconds to soften. Drain slightly on paper towel. Place some cheese, a tablespoon of sauce and some onion on each tortilla and roll. Place side by side in a shallow baking dish. Pour remaining sauce over enchiladas. Sprinkle with additional cheese and onion. Cover loosely and heat 25-30 minutes until bubbly. Serve extra sour cream on the side, if desired.


