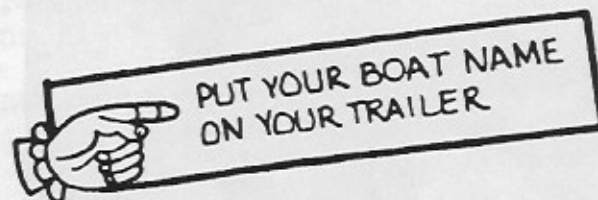

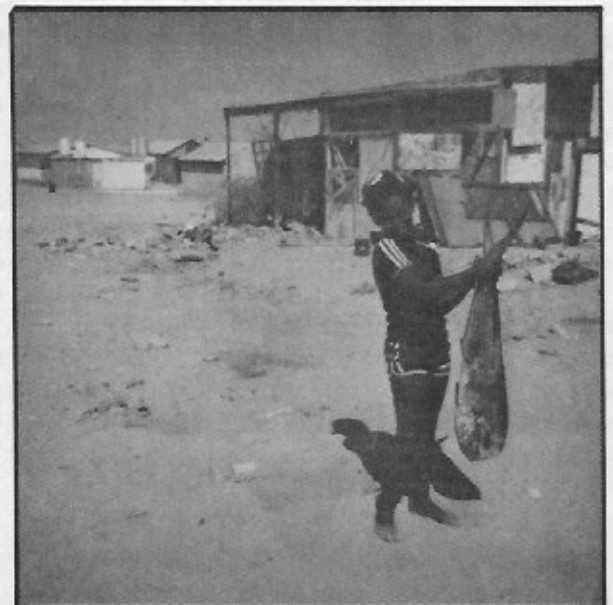
THE 1981 FISHING DERBY--PHASE II

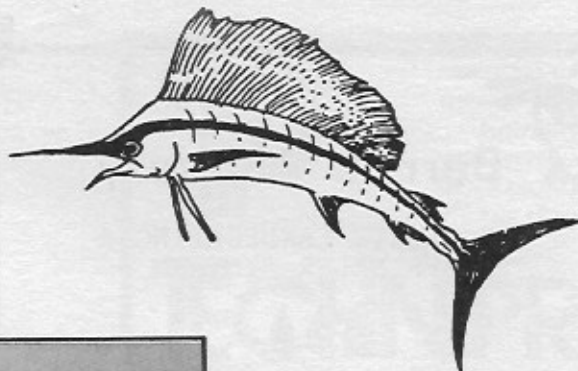
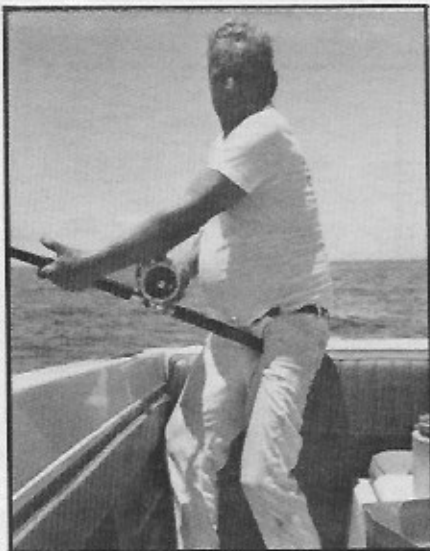
The Sailfish and Dolphin fishing derby is now history.

Special thanks to Lew and Rosella Frazier for their help in selling tickets and H.O.T.D.O.G.S - as you heard Lew calling out all during the evening.

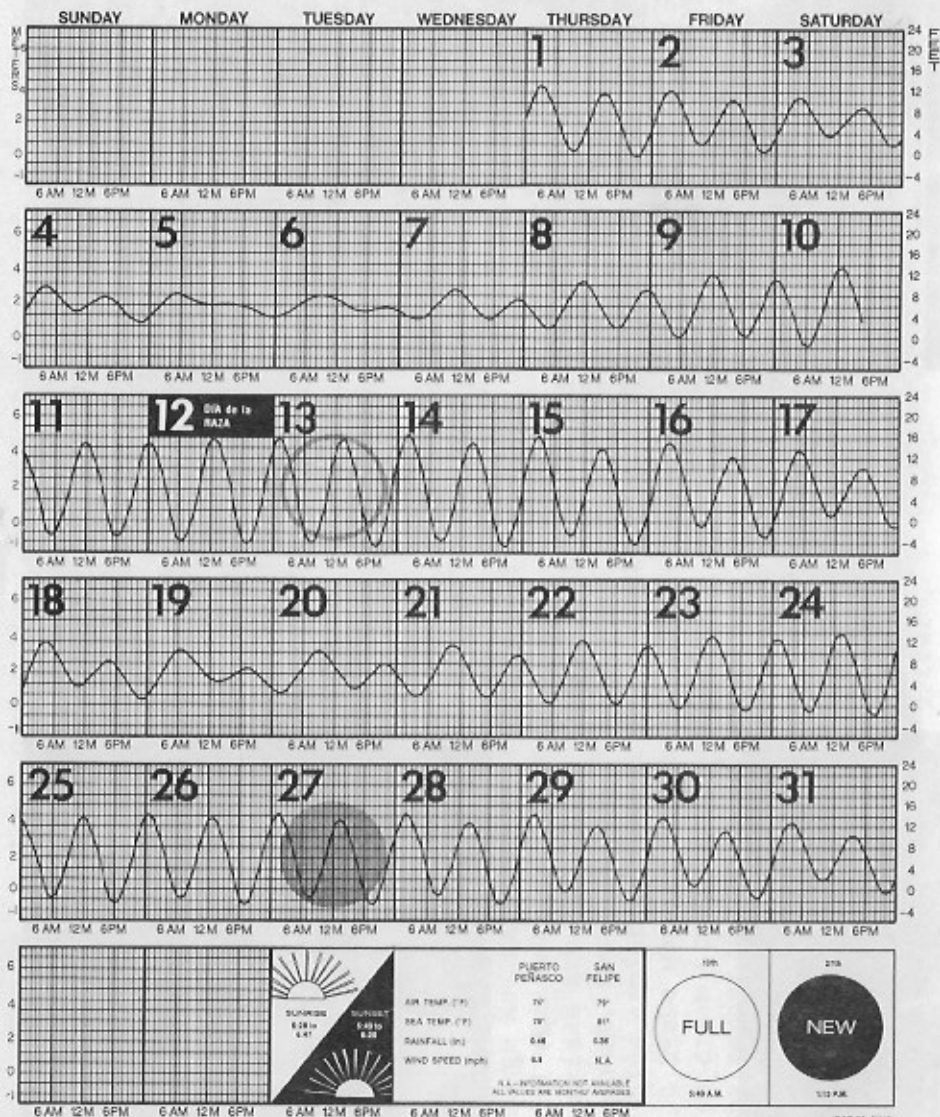
All the final bills aren't in yet, but we anticipate a \$200 profit - isn't that GREAT!
