





we took a 3 week IWA Getaway Tour to Ireland, Scotland, Wales and England; needless to say a tour is not restful or relaxing. We were up early and to bed late. We were sorry to return the middle of August and not be able to sit on the porch at Cholla to relax. First of all, we encountered "jet lag"; many of us don't really know what this means, including us. Leaving the East coast we fly into the rising sun and have about 3 hours of darkness and then all of a sudden it's the next morning. We found that we had been "up-awake" for 26 hours and arrived in Shannon, Ireland at 7:00 a.m., however it was only 1:00 a.m. our time--so we missed one night's steep (not unusual for the party people of Cholla).

We were met by Arthur Hewlett, our tour guide who was a very proper Englishman, having served as a Captain in the British Army in India, an engineer in England and finally as a TWA tour guide. We immediately realized that he wanted to "whip" we undisciplined Americans into shape, especially as to proper dress and being on time. He immediately instructed all the American gentlemen that if they had any respect for their ladies, they would certainly put on a coat and tie for dinner. That of course, made a big "hit" with all the men; and poor Arthur was out-voted. Aside from that, Arthur was a fine guide and showed us through the beautiful countryside of Ireland, including the Ring of Kerry, MacGillcuddy Reeks and and County Cork to Blarney Castle and the kissing of the Blarney stone. Needless to say, I didn't know we had to climb an 85 foot winding stone stairway to the top of Blarney Castle in order to kiss this stone. In order to accomplish this feat, you must drop down on your back side, throw your neck and head backwards until you are able to grasp 2 verticle poles, hold on and look down the 85 feet below and kiss this stone. Believe me a lot of people "chickened out" when they observed what was involved in this maneuver. I heard several Americans (our sanitary lot) say, "we might get herpes doing this".

On to Waterford, where the beautiful crystal is made; after comparing the prices with Levy's, Waterford is almost 50% less (of course if you add the cost of the flight, hotels, meals, etc.) it's cheaper to buy it at Levy's.

We walked across Stephen's Park in Dublin observing some really unusual people with purple and orange hair and mohaw haircuts; they turned out to be punkrockers. They were not indiganous to Ireland, we found them in all the big cities of Ireland and England.

Scotland was really beautiful; the heather on the moors was just coming into bloom with a slight purple color which would be in full bloom in another couple of weeks. Lock(lake) Lomond - you take the high road and I'll take the low road and Loch Ness (of monster fame) are very popular fishing, camping and trailering areas. My favorite city of the whole trip was Edinburgh. Soldiers wearing kilts guard the castle on a hill overlooking the city. We visited Holyroodhouse, former home of Mary Queen of Scots and present resident of Queen Elizabeth when she visits Edinburgh. In fact she had just been there for five days a couple of weeks before we arrived.

We drove through the Lowlands of Scotland to the English border stopping in the Lake District where William Wordsworth lived and wrote; then on into Chester, once a Roman camp now full of crooked, winding streets and Tudor houses. The Hotel Blossoms, where we stayed had a date sign of 1605 on the outside of the building, however since then they have added indoor plumbing. The next day on into North Wales past towns and villages with unpronounceable names. Then to Stratford-Upon-Avon, Shakespear's birthplace and Anne Hathaway's thatched cottage; we also visited Oxford College, Blenheim Palace, birthplace of Winston Churchill, Salisbury, Stonenenge, Bristol and Bath, where the Roman nobility took hot

spring baths. Finally we arrived in London and spent six days there, it is really a wonderful city with many things to do and places to see. We especially enjoyed the English Pubs, also the Irish ones, but since I'm running out of time and space, that story will have to wait.



Incredible Rice Frittata

½ Cup finely chopped onions

I Tbs. butter

8 eggs

& C. milk

I tsp. salt

I tsp. Worcestershire sauce

2 C. cooked rice

I can chopped green chilies, undrained

I medium tomato, chopped

½ C. shredded Cheddar cheese

In 10-inch skillet over medium heat cook onions in butter until tender. Beat eggs wilh milk and seasonings. Stir in rice, chillies and tomato. Pour in pan. Reduce heat to medium low. Cover, cook until top is almost set, 12 to 15 minutes. Sprinkle with cheese. Cover, remove from heat, let stand about 10 minutes.
