

SEARCH & RESCUE

WEAR YOUR PFD'S

Reprinted from USCG Boating Safety

LONG BEACH, CA. The Coast Guard search and rescue log read: 19 foot P/C Capsized, Naval Air Station WHIDBEY advised this 19 foot pleasure craft had capsized with 4 occupants. Coast Guard Air Station PORT ANGELES dispatched aircraft to assist and the Cutter POINT RICHMOND took the capsized boat in tow. The Navy aircraft recovered 3 of the persons from the water. The fourth person was not wearing a personal flotation device and was not located. ACTIVE SEARCH SUSPENDED PENDING FURTHER DEVELOPMENTS. This report is typical of many filed by the Coast Guard each year. "Person not wearing PFD was not located".

Drowning takes more lives in recreational boating than any other form of casualty, over 1000 last year. The Coast Guard estimates that 60 to 80% of these could have been prevented if the victims had been wearing personal flotation devices, the same PFD's that each operator is required by Federal Law to have aboard his boat.

Federal Law requires one serviceable Coast Guard approved PFD for each person aboard a recreational boat including any towed skiers. Most people comply with this law but the other law, the law of self-preservation, is the one that most drowning victims ignore. PFD's are aboard to be used when needed; to be put on when a dangerous situation threatens.

For some guidelines, when should the PFD's be broken out and worn? For children and non-swimmers, ALWAYS. No non-swimmer.

or young child should be aboard a boat unless wearing a PFD. For skier, ALWAYS.
Water-skiers move at high enough speed to
be knocked unconscious if they fall and
hit the water head first. Being unconscious, face down in the water is just inviting death by drowning. For others; any
time the water gets rough or anything, and
that means ANYTHING, goes wrong with the
boat. If the engine fails or your sailboat is becalmed, get your PFD's on. If
you are taking on water for any reason,
get your PFD's on. Even if you are just
navigating in strange waters, wear your
PFD.

Some people think PFD's are just for kids and somehow a man wearing one is some kind of sissy. But think a minute about this: which would you rather give up; a little of your ego or all of your life?





HAZEL'S PIE CRUST

4 cups flour 2/3 cup water

1 tsp salt 1 egg

1 Tbs sugar 1 Tbs vinegar

1½ cups crisco

Combine dry ingredients, cut in shortening. Mix water, egg and vinegar together then add to flour and shortening mixture. Blend and roll as usual.

CRANBERRY CRUNCH

1 cup uncooked Quaker oats-1 minute

½ cup all-purpose flour

1 cup brown sugar

½ cup butter

1 - 1# can whole cranberry sauce

Mix oats, flour & brown sugar together, cut in butter until mixture is crumbly. Pack ½ of mixture in bottom of 1½ qt. greased baking dish. Cover with cranberry sauce, top with remaining crumb mixture. Bake 350° for 30-40 min. May be frozen prior to baking for later use. Place in oven frozen and bake 5 minutes longer.





Because of the proximity of the boarder, you will find more and more holiday customs of our countries intermingling. A good example of this is the celebration of the Mexican "Dia de los Muertos", on November 2nd and the American Halloween. Traditionally, the "Dia de los Muertos" has always been a big festival in Mexico, mostly in the south where the Indian influence is stronger. In Penasco, the families go to the cemetery to remember their departed friends and family members.

This is not an occasion of sadness and tears, but a day of happy thoughts and fond memories. The whole cemetery is decorated with flowers, paper streamers and lovely candles. Everyone brings food as if on a family picnic. Vendors sell cotton candy and hot corn on the cob. Sometimes you can hear the Mariachis play as they go from family plot to family plot.

In keeping with the spirit of the Dia de los Muertos and Halloween, Memo Munro, brother of Hector, directed and appeared in the title role of "Dracula". This spooky play was put on by his little theater group with the benefits going to a local Rotary Club fund to establish a childrens park and playground in Penasco.

Contributing to the progress and future of Penasco, the Mexican company TEMPSA, in conjunction with the stateside hauling company RELIANCE, has brought another shipment of reactors for the nuclear power plant in Palo Verde. This is quite a sight to see as it seems incredible that these huge reactors can be moved by human means. The equipment is slowly moved to it's destination on huge trailers, each one measuring 300 feet and having

384 wheels, each individually controlled. The caravan moves very slowly but pull-outs have been provided to allow the traffic to pass.

Another sign of the growth of Penasco is the new department store "El Grand CH". From the main road in Penasco, turn left by the Fruiteria Figueroa and continue about 4 blocks. The big white building on your right is the new store owned by Sr. Louis Celaya Mendez. It carries a wide variety of merchandise such as car parts, tools, paints, tires, clothing, shoes and toys. They also have a special service for installing carpets and curtains. You may want to give the old cabin a new face for the holidays. Don't worry about pesos or dollars as they will accept Mastercharge or Bankamericard.

By the time you read this, the Black and White Ball will be just a fond memory for our lovely CruzElena Villa, CBSC's Cholla representative to the Ball. This is the social event of the season in Penasco and Cruz, who has worked for the Cafe Ranita since it opened 4 years ago, is naturally very excited. As the oldest (at home) of 13 children who lost their father 3 years ago, these festive occasions don't come very often. We are all looking forward to seeing her all dressed up and smiling, courtesy of the club.




