



MEXICO'S NEW REVOLUTION By Former Arizona

La Revolution is the name of one of the three gigantic rigs drilling for oil today in the Sea of Cortez, two off Rocky Point and one off Guaymas. Rocky Point, Cholla Bay, Pelican Point and even Sonoita and Luckville will never by the same if the drilling is successful. These erstwhile sleepy little villages will turn into boom towns.

Our visit to La Revolution took us four hours out of Rocky Point on a broad-beamed, twin diesel, 35' craft which sped along about 10 knots an hour. Enroute, the craft not only swayed from side to side, but tilted up and down, bow and stern, as well as cork-screwing thru the rather big waves. Its primary use is to transport crew members. Below were rows of kirplane type seats that could be tilted back for a nap. The gulf was hazy and the gigantic oil rig suddenly looming up in front of us was abrupt ans starting. A great aircraft carrier couldn't have looked any bigger and the drilling tower appeared as tall as the statue of liberty. Guyed down by hawsers to huge concrete anchors, the part above the sea consisted of a series of platforms with slippery metal gangways going up and down, like stairs. We hauled up close and threw some ropes aboard to haul us tight. We were bobbing like a feather in a gale alongside that huge contraption. Of course, our diesels kept roaring and the screws kept turning. There was a maelstrom of foam and water, surging over the beams and girders of the rig; and a torrent of sea now and then between our craft

The transfer was made with difficulty; but we all climbed on the narrow platform and then hauled ourselves up the gangway to the second level of therig. I quickly observed that if the OSHA folk were ever to see La Revolution, they'd have a lifetime of work cut out correcting safety factors.

It was built in 1946 and wore itself out, drilling off Tampico; before being hauled thru the Panama Canal in 65 days and finally put in place off Rocly Point. Early this year they were down about 12,000' and can go as deep as 25,000 feet. sea bottom where they were drilling is about 180 feet. Our host told us if they don't find oil where they are drilling now, they have five other locations to move to. But, it takes about a year to put the rig in position. The size and complexity of the hugh platform was mind-boggling. Anchored by giant corcrete blocks, the rig extended under water with a base series of platforms compartment, a rising high above sea level. Metal stairs or gangways, worn and slippery from use, enabled the crew to go from one level to another. A coating of oil didn't make the ascent any easier either! Everywhere was rust and grim and oil and although the platform were decked by metal screens over which one walked, now and then a hugh gap appeared and one had to gingerly tight-rope walk along a girder. But, laid out in neat piles could be seen the drilling pipes that when connecte together plunge into the sea bottom with a drill bit on the end. Hugh cranes, cavernous areas with twenty foot ceilings, great containers of cement, cable, chains, a hugh drill bit with tungesten teeth that rotate, machine shop, store room, and over everything the grime and rust and debris from over three decades of work were everywhere to be seen.

A visit to the crew quarters was a delightful surprise after the rust, grime, oil and dirt of the rest of the rig. It was neat and comfortable The men spend 14 days on the rig and 14 days off. Sixteen tons of water are made and used daily for drinking and sanitary purposes. We made use of some of that water to wash up, and then survey the neat shining walls, the tables and chairs and the galley where we had some coffee and a donut.

Then came the ghastly trip back from the rig down to the little cork we were to ride back on. There it was, bouncing up and down, yawing out from the rig and then smashing against it! I gingerly climbed down, tried to sit and put a foot over. "Stand up, Stand up" shouted some helpful soul. I stood up, ducked under a wire cable; stood with one hand grabbing the rig and the other reaching out for the rail of the shore boat. I finally grabbed the rail and jumped. Somebody caught me and cinched me with a bear hug.

Four more hours back to Rocky Point and then an additional five hours back to Phoenix and complete exhaustion; but the trip was a revelation and if La Revolution hits oil, there will be a revolution indeed all along the West Coast of Mexico -- a good revolution for it will bring benefits to everyone.




