SEARCH AND RESCUE

Chairman: Lou Bock

On October 10, 1983 I received a phone call at my home in Tucson from Rojo, Paul Edge, in Rocky Point. He informed me that a jeep had rolled over on the sand hill in Cholla Bay and the people riding in the jeep were thrown out. One person had severe cuts on his leg and the other, David Brown, could have a possible broken back and internal injuries. Rojo said the doctors were with David at the present time and I should call and get a helicopter on standby. The Search & Rescue continued as follows:

7:09 P.M. I contacted John Glenn with Arizona Medical Transport and made sure we had a helicopter on standby. Mr. Glenn asked if there were any communications with the customs agents in Lukeville and I told him we had phone communications only.

7:19 P.M. I called Rojo and asked if there was radio equipment on the ambulance. Rojo checked with Wally Schmerfeld and was informed that the ambulance had channel 9 on CB radio.

7:25 P.M. Called Lukeville and talked with Robert McBroom, customs agent, and informed him a helicopter was on standby and an ambulance may be dispatched from Rocky Point.

7:50 P.M. Rojo requested that the helicopter be dispatched.

7:55 P.M. Called Arizona Medical Transport and told John Glenn to dispatch helicopter and meet the ambulance at Lukeville. I told him the ambulance would have its lights on and customs agents would instruct the helicopter where to land. (There are no landing lights in Lukeville or radio communications for aircraft.)

8:18 P.M. Rojo called and gave the estimated time of arrival of the ambulance in Lukeville as 9:30 P.M.

8:25 P.M. Arizona Medical Transport informed of the E.T.A. of ambulance.

9:31 P.M. Lukeville informed me that the ambulance had arrived.

9:45 P.M. The helicopter had arrived and were loading the patients.

10:24 P.M. Arizona Medical Transport informed me that both patients were stable and would be at the hospital shortly.

The next day, October 11, I phoned the hospital and found that David Brown had a punctured lung and several broken vertabraes but he would be all right. David was released from the hospital one week later.

I have received several phone calls from David and his father Gus Brown thanking Search & Rescue and the Cholla Bay Sportsmen's Club for all their help.

I want to thank Rojo and Wally very much for the three full days, October 8th, 9th, and 10th, that they donated their time and efforts to Search and Rescue. Both Rojo and Wally are the backbone of Search and Rescue and it would not be a first class operation without them. Again, we all thank you.



"21 JEWELS" TRIP TO REFUGIO BAY By: Hilda Erkert

After three years and rebuilding of an outrigger on our trimaran, the "21 JEWELS" finally made it to Refugio Bay on Guardian Angle Island. Monday afternoon, the 20th of June 1983, Gene decided to go on the trip the following Wednesday. I packed on Tuesday and began taking my sea-sick pills. We watched the weather report on Cable TV and it seemed to cooperate. No major disturbances. We left Phoenix on Wednesday morning at 9:30 and pulled into Cholla around 1:45 P.M. and looked immediately for a launcher. We found Tico and launched at about 3:30. Glen and Doris Davis saw us off and wished us luck, I felt from our previous experience that we could use some good luck. With the outriggers extended and everything secure, we lifted anchor about 5:00 F.M. and when clear of the Bay, set a southerly course of 162 degrees for Guardian Angel Island. With a light wind coming out of the South, we set the engine at 2100 RPM's, about 6 knots and turned on the auto pilot, our best buddy. We set the radios to monitor CB channel 3, VHF 26 and AM Marine 2182. As we motored away and looked back toward Cholla Bay and the Pinacates, we saw one of those fantastic mirages we often see along the beaches. The evening was beautiful and the ocean very calm. At 7:55 P.M. we called "Wild Goose" on the CB and reception was very good. Tojo called us back on the VHF 26 to advise that they would monitor the radio 24 hours. As we have mentioned before, it is such a comfort to know our friends are no further away that the radios, thanks to everybody!


At 8:00 P.M. we cooked dinner and made coffee for the thermos to keep us awake during the night watches. I made it to bed around 11:00 and Gene was to wake me at 1:00 AM to take watch until 3:00 AM. Shortly after midnight, the ocean began to get restless with whitecaps all around. With the aid of the sea sick pills, I had fallen soundly asleep so Gene decided not to wake me because I would probably make him turn back to Cholla and his adventure would already be over. At 1:45 he slowed the engine to 2000 RPM's, about 55 miles out of Cholla then he slowed it again around 2:40 AM to 1200 RPM's. This would keep the boat on course and the ride would be easier, maybe I wouldn't wake up and make him go back. By 3:00 AM Gene was


very tired and decided that we were the only on the whole Gulf anyway and we were not going anywhere, just holding course, he would lay down on the cockpit floor and get a little sleep. He felt that he would not fall into a deep sleep because a big wave would hit every 5 to 10 minutes and give him a cold shower keeping him alert enough to check for any problems. He swears to me that it was working very well but I'm not all that sure.

At 5:00 AM, we received a call from "Super Grouper" checking to see if everything is 0.K. The ocean seemed to have calmed down again and at 7:00 AM, resumed a full 2100 RPM's. At this time we could also see the Mountain of Ginasoho de Angel Island, altitude 4315 feet. At 1:00 PM we dropped anchor at the Island, 115 miles and 20 hours. What a delightful trip compared to the first one three years ago!

Now first things first, our German Shepherd had handled the whole trip very well but it's time he needs to hit the shore. Then we anchored in about 20' of water which was so crystal clear we could see the different varieties of rays settling into the sand on the bottom. The next morning after a full nights sleep for Gene, we took our rubber raft with the outboard motor and explored the coastline to the East side of Refugio Bay. One chamber of the inflatable leaked badly but that was solved by putting the air pump in permanently then gave the raft a shot of air every so often. We also paddled part of the time in order to take in more of the scenery. Refugio Bay is larger than Cholla Bay and Deeper. It also has an intersesting rocky coast with small intimate beaches. There were no other people around, we snorkled, esplored around the rocks and Gene tried to spear fish. They seemed smart enough to keep just out of reach. We saw beautiful colored fishes of many different species. I just don't know enough about them to tell you what they were. It was like diving in an aquarium.

"Just keep pulling - don't dare stop."


My arms are tired, my breath is short "Gotta get this fish back to port." I pulled that line with all my might Prayed I'd done everything right.




