QUEEN CINDY HALL

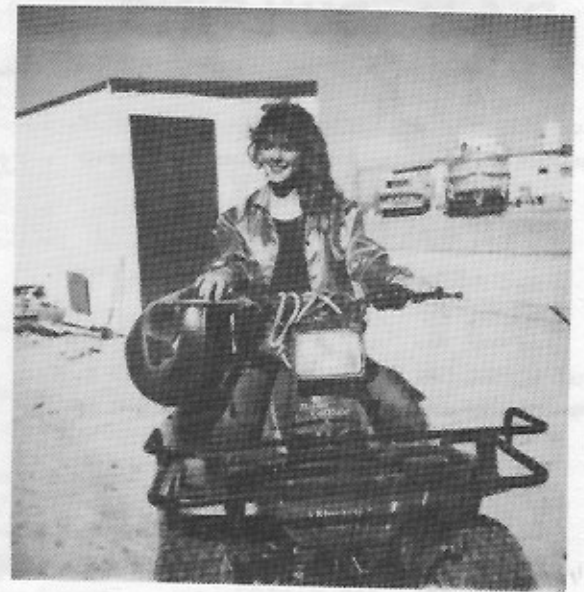

• Should I swim for shore?

Bounty, a 33-foot sea urchin dive boat, sank in high seas with three persons aboard October 30. Some 17 hours later, two of the Bounty's crew were sighted and rescued when searchers found them floating amidst the boat's debris. The men, though tired, were in good health. The third crewman, who elected to swim away from the debris, was never recovered and is presumed dead.

The sea has always been a dangerous environment. Possibly, part of the sea's allure is drawn from that very danger. Though things are considerably safer now than in the past, even experienced crewmen, aboard modern seaworthy craft with the best possible lifesaving equipment, can find themselves in the water and a long way from safety.

This brings up a good question. Should I swim for shore or stay with the wreckage?

The decision to swim or not to swim depends on many variables. Some good swimmers have been able to swim quite a distance in 50-degree water before being overcome by hypothermia. Others have been unable to swim 100 yards. A person who elects to swim will rapidly use energy, become exhausted and may drown before reaching shore. Another consideration is that distances on the water are very deceptive. You might think you're much closer to land than you are, and currents and tides oftentimes work against the swimmer.

Whatever you think you are capable of doing, remember that the statistics for survival are overwhelmingly in favor of those who choose to stay with the boat. So...STAY WITH THE BOAT! Even a capsized boat is easier to see than a person in the water. Search vessels and aircraft can spot a boat or its wreckage far more easily than only an individual whose head is above water. Remember that if you swim away, chances are that you're **NOT** going to make it.

Drowning is listed by the National Safety Council as the third most frequent cause of accidental deaths in the United States. Generally, drowning has been defined as death by suffocation due to water in the lungs. There are many types of drowning: Wet drowning, dry drowning, near drowning, trauma, hydrocution, and hypothermia. Outside of drowning by water ingestion and subsequent suffocation, or wet drowning, hypothermia poses the greatest threat to those in the water off Southern California. With the onset of winter, even "summer warmed" Southern Californians need to be aware of the increased hazards of cold water exposure, or hypothermia.

Acute or rapid-onset hypothermia is generally associated with immersion in cold water. Water conducts heat more than 25 times faster than air. The colder the water, the faster the heat loss. Therefore, depending on the water temperatures and other conditions, acute hypothermia may affect a person in the water in as little as ten to 15 minutes or take as long as several hours.

The body is electrochemical in nature and can only function properly within a very narrow temperature range centered on 98.6 degrees Fahrenheit. A few degrees over and the person has a fever. A few degrees under and the person is hypothermic. A person's physical characteristics also affect the time required for hypothermia to set in.

The larger the person, the longer the cooling time. A heavier person's physical make-up also affects the time required for hypothermia to take effect. A heavy person will cool more slowly than a thin person. A tall, thin person will cool faster than a short, heavy person. Women, because they have a layer of subcutaneous fat, tend to cool slower than men of the same body size. However, since women are generally smaller than men, they still usually cool faster.

Your behavior in the water is an important determinant of how fast body heat is lost. Stay as calm as possible. Thrashing about in the water is not the way to survive. If you are wearing a Personal Flotation Device (PFD), or as it is commonly known, a lifejacket, you can reduce heat loss by remaining still in the water.

Keep as much of the body out of the water as possible. Since most boats will float even when capsized or swamped, get into, or on top of, the boat. This will increase your chances of survival. Wearing several layers of clothing will also help to reduce heat loss. The areas of greatest heat loss are the head, the neck, the sides of the abdomen and groin. This is because major blood vessels are located closest to the body's surface in these areas. Furthermore, these areas are not generally protected by body fat.

The victim's feeble energies must not be expended warming and drying wet clothes, so take the victim to shelter and remove any wet clothing. It is important to understand that there is a specific way to warm and handle a hypothermic victim. Cmdr. Allen M. "Doc" Steinman, officer in charge of the Coast Guard's Hypothermia Testing Center at Cape Disappointment, Wash., explains that, "with rapid-onset hypothermia it is essential to keep the victim as still as possible. People are shaken and jostled when they are brought from the water. This causes colder blood from the extremities to shunt back to the body core, lowering the overall body temperature and thus defeating attempts to warm the person. This is called 'afterdrop'. Afterdrop can cause the heart to go into fibrillation."

Afterdrop also occurs when the extremities are warmed before the body core is warmed. Warm the victim's body core first, and then let the warm blood from the heart heat the rest of the body. The administration of warm, moist oxygen is a particularly effective way to bring warmth directly to the core of the body and thus speed recovery. Use a rescuer's naked body to warm the victim's naked body. Wrap the victim in warm blankets, sleeping bags, dry clothing or whatever is available to protect him or her from losing body heat.

You'll be prepared to deal with boating accidents and hypothermia if you couple these recommendations with safe boating practices and, of course, use your head. The Coast Guard wants you to stick around for more great boating seasons.

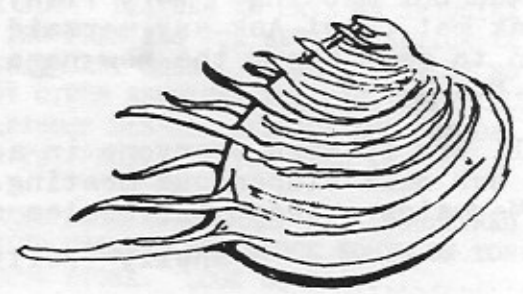

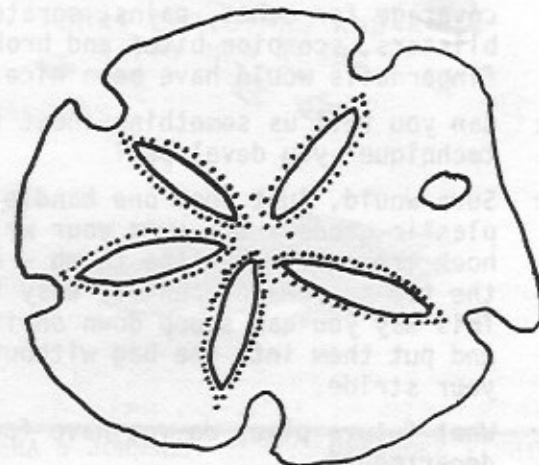

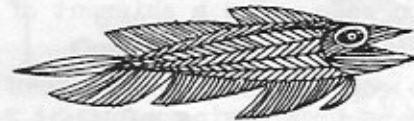
sixth ticket drawn was the winner, and Maxine Hager was the lucky lady.

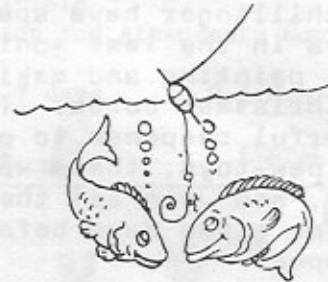
