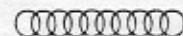

¿QUE PASA AT BARRACHO FLATS?

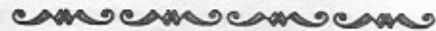

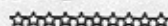

CHEESE CAKE

20 Graham crackers (crushed)
1/8 lb. butter (melted)
1 tsp. Crisco

Roll crackers very fine, mix with butter. Grease spring-form pan with Crisco and line pan with cracker crumbs.

1 cup sugar
2 large and 1 small pkg. cream cheese
1/2 tsp. lemon juice
4 eggs

Cream sugar & cheese together, add lemon juice and eggs, beat well. Pour mixture into pan and bake for 40 min. at 350 degrees. Remove from oven and let cool 10 minutes.

Topping:

1/3 cup sugar 1 pint sour cream
1 tsp vanilla

Mix well, pour mixture over cake and bake 20 min. Refrigerate at least 6 hours.

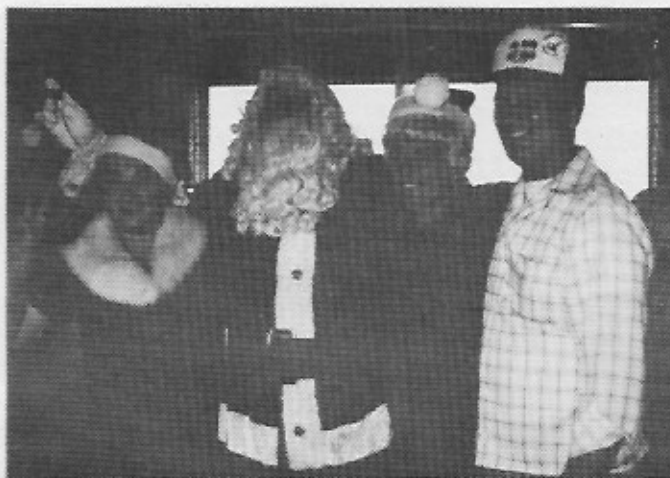

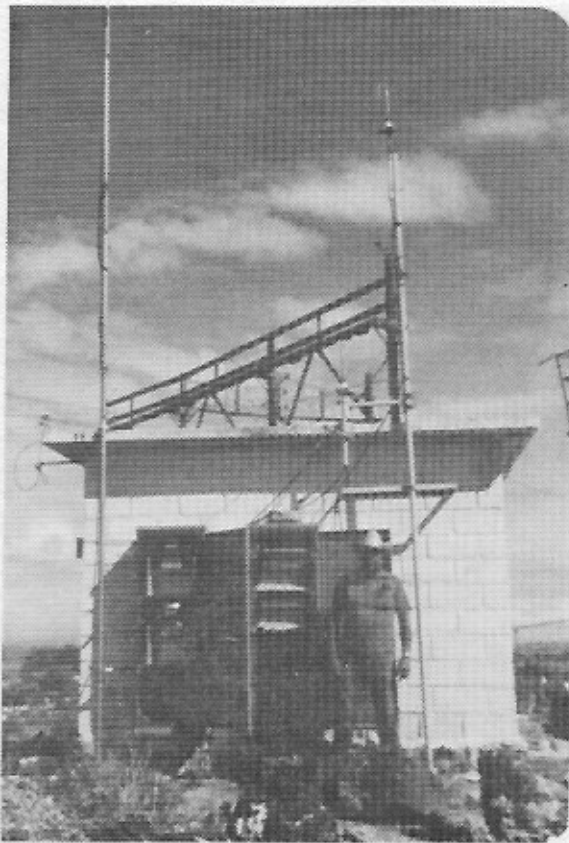

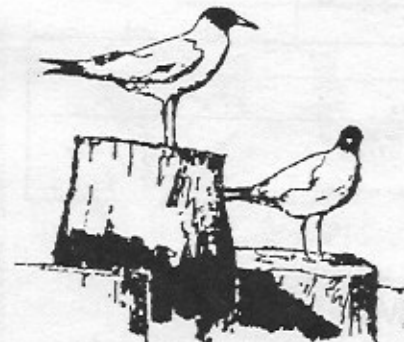
