



Ralph and Phyllis Smith have finally started their dream house on Pelican Point. According to the plans it will be one of the Show Case Houses of Cholla.



It was a beautiful, clear, warm day with light breezes. We fished, shelled, snacked, napped or whatever your heart desired. A wonderful relaxing time was had by all. Two weeks later another trip, this time to the First Estuary, known as Espinosas Estuary. Martin (Martine) Taylor constantly wore a water soaked blanket over his head and body went into the burning buildings to keep the fire from spreading. The people of Cholla Bay owe these people and others who helped, a vote of thanks and God Bless you as you truly saved our town.



This is what I call cooperation that all of us appreciate from our Search and Rescue Team. They are the greatest!

The Cholla Boat Yard is expanding their business which now includes scuba tanks filled, renting of surf casting and heavy tackle equipment, wet suits and usual information about fishing conditions. Good luck fellows!


