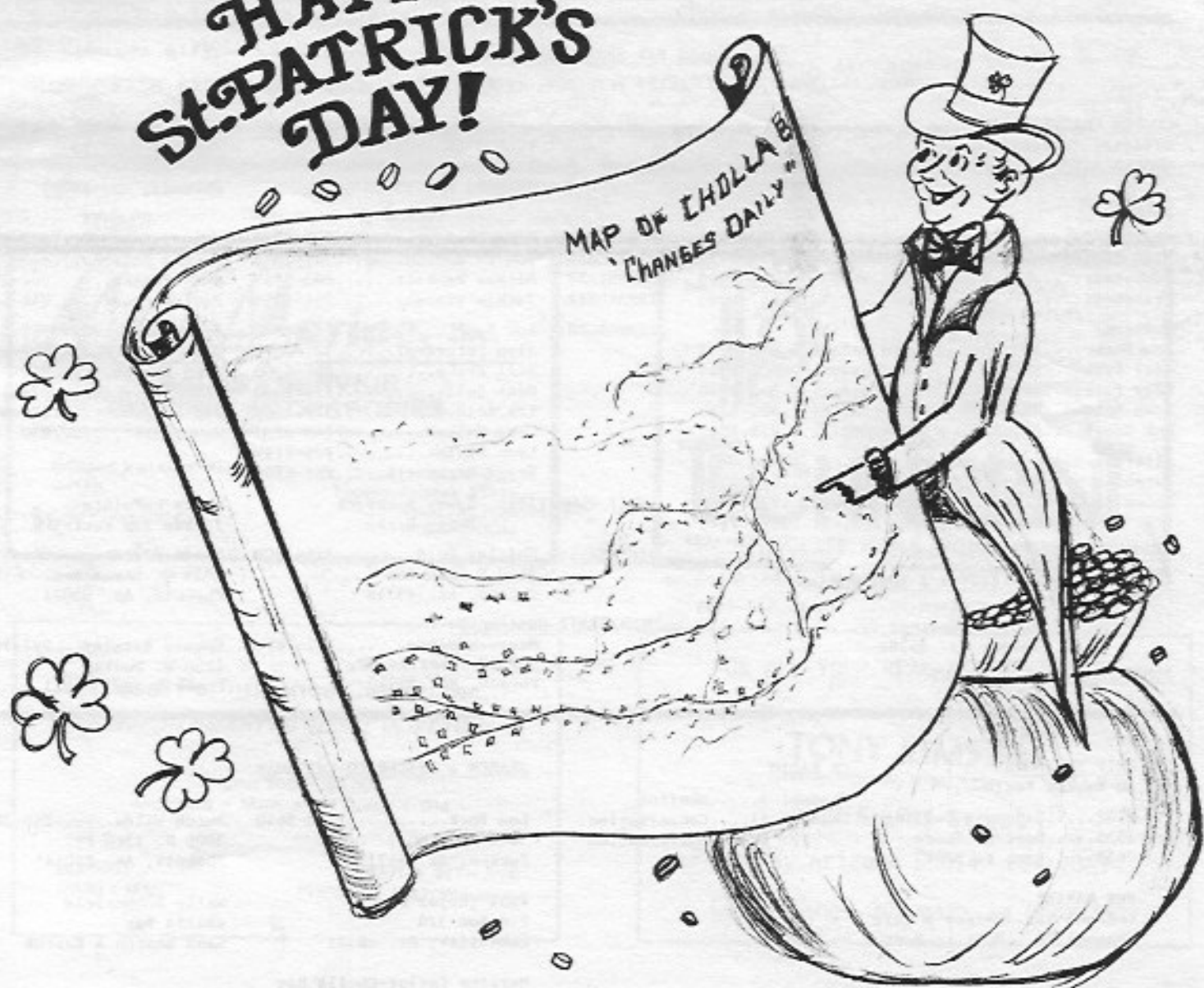

Our entertainment for the evening, a movie of the Cholla Bay Christmas party, was postponed until next month due to equipment failure.

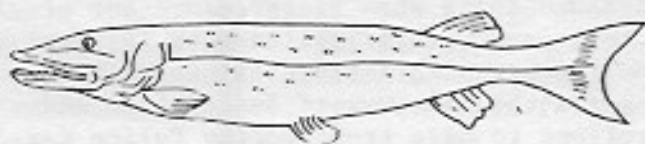

While attending the Derby Labor Day in Cholla Bay - 1960 - Bill Blaire said, whats the matter with Tucson? We've been trying to get a Tucson Chapter formed for a long time. Why don't you guys get on the ball? Wayne and several other fellows came home and started to call all members. A meeting was set up for November 20, 1960. Bill Blair, Al Scott, others from Phoenix conducted the meeting.

Wayne DeVore, President - Joe Rodriguez, Vice President - Frank Young, Secretary-Treasurer - Clark Johnson, Bernie Walker, Directors were all duly elected. The Moose Club on North Main Street offered their building for our meetings.

Our first meeting was held on December 13, 1960 by a group of enthused fishermen. One Hundred thirty one signed members were present. Within a short time membership was doubled.

Many great sportsmen donated their time to form the club. Myron Lusk, Gaynor Stover, Frank Grijalva, Dean Fisher, Les and Verna Cinlish, William Casey, George Medina - just to mention a few of the "OLD TIMERS" that worked so hard.

We never forgot that our main objective was working for a "Better Cholla Bay".

Recalling one week end after coming over a very rough road we decided to tackle the big rock on the road at the East end of Cholla. Eddie Smith borrowed a big jack hammer. We all happily volunteered to help. WELLLLLL! Were you ever on the end of a jack hammer on solid rock? ? ? Nacho, sat on his front porch and said - it's impossible!! Frank Lopez gave us a hand and it was finally cut down some to make a little better Cholla Bay entrance.

Always keeping in mind safety for the fisherman, the frequencies for the first radio at Cholla Bay was announced. Contributions at our meetings started to pour in. The "5 Bar Flys" donated \$25.00 - at that time the largest contribution. The radio was in

the building next to Manuel Cardinas Curio Shop with Gina and Lloyd running it. The raising of the first pole for the radio was something else! A big day in Cholla. Many volunteers, lots of beer and sweat and very soon it was in operation.



Before too long the radio moved to the launch area.

Many changes have come and gone in the club - - many new faces, but always Cholla Bay remains a great spot for sportsmen. Whether fishing or sitting on the porch, greeting new and old friends - and fellow liars!

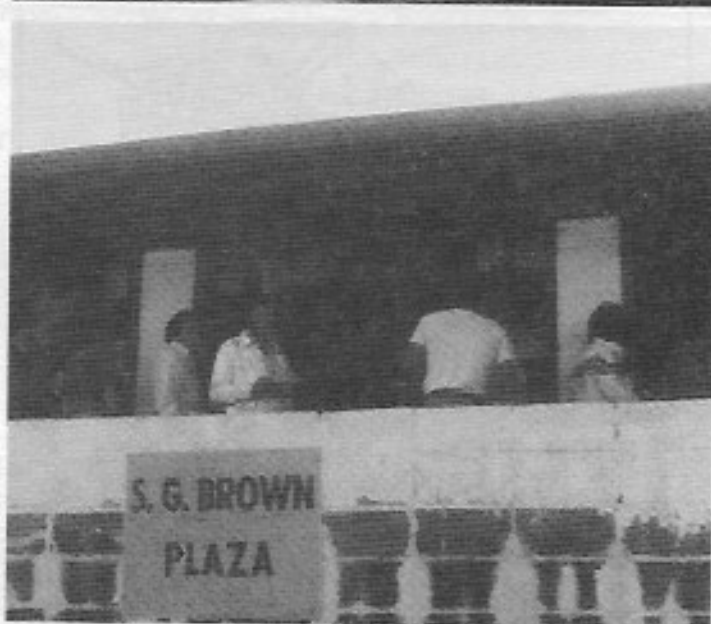
Special thanks to Marty Perlmutter for cleaning about 65 pounds of beans during the week.

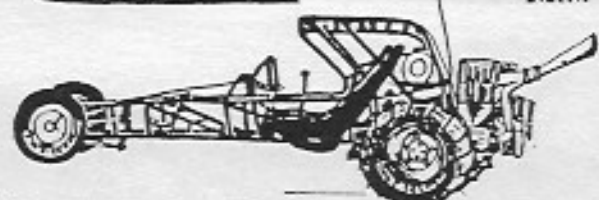

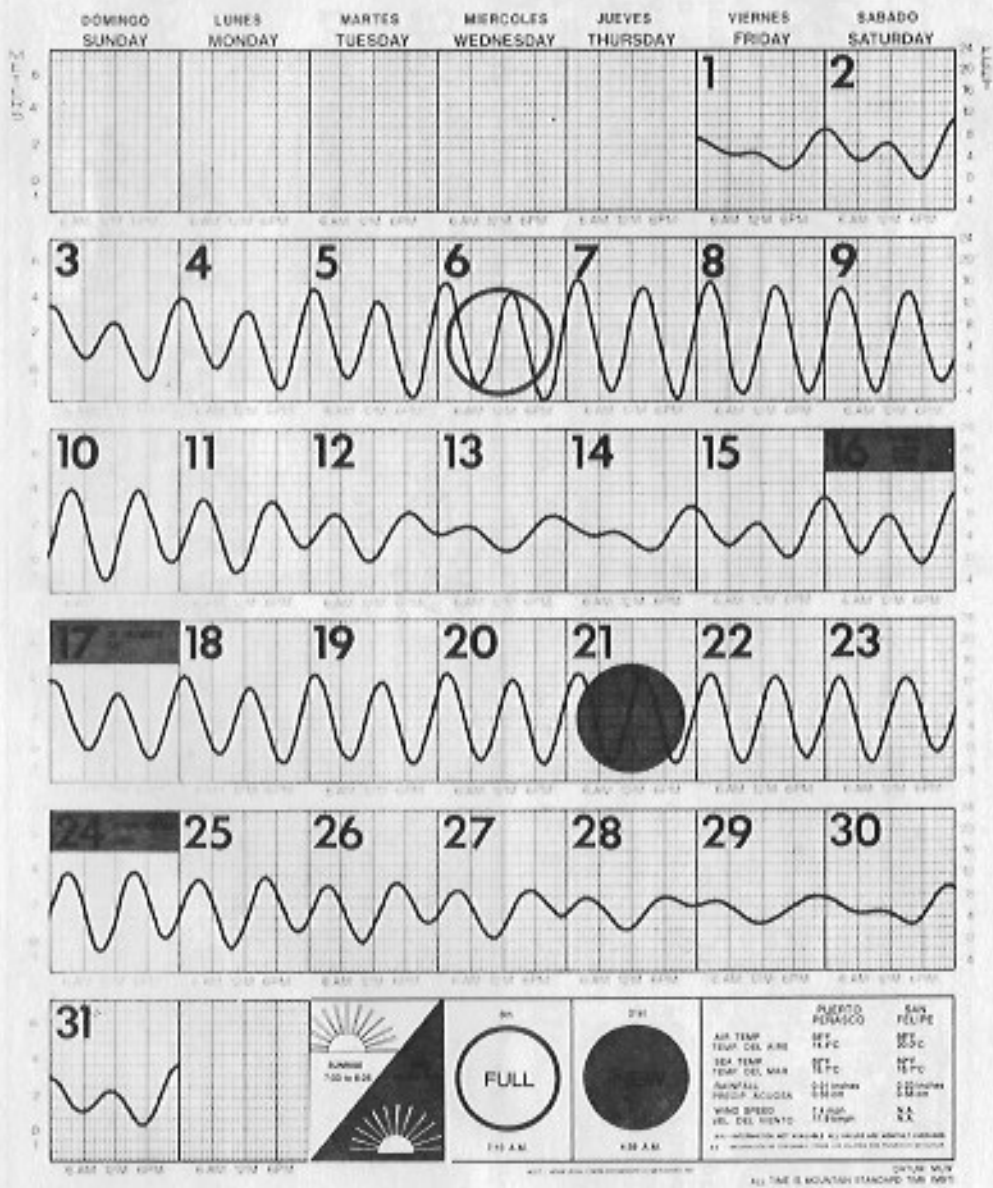
