





There were 2 other boat builders in Phoenix. Michey Boats and Beismeyer a company headed by Pete Barker the latter, A Cholla Bayer for years. Under taps in the Arizona Legioner last issue, S. Smith was listed. So he had to be younger than the 21 year draft age, hence a volunteer. like myself, who enlisted at 19 and I was one year before I.e. 1896. So he must have joined up by 18.

But what I am really writting about is Grace Schoonover's letter (which I have read, and re-read, I don't know how many times) and I urge everyone to do so-and then get together and do something about it.

For 20 years we lived at #70 on Cholla in winter and also in Homer, Alaska for 6 Mo. In summer we had a half way casa a motor sailer at the live aboard Silver Gate Yaeht Club, in San Diego.

When I sold #70 to Dell trailor, Gus Brown wrote me a very nice letter. stating that I had been his first and longest renter, and thanks me for the advise I had given him during the years, to make Cholla a better place to live, much of which he had followed.

THE NIGHT OF THE BIG CHOLLA BAY BLOW

Sunday, May 4, 1969 is a day many of our good members will long remember as the day the real estate at Cholla Bay was rearranged.

The day started out with what we would normally call one of those blasted days that the wind kept every one earthbound. Clouds built up and the wind grew worse as the day progressed. The only fishermen out were the dirty dozen with Mush Manley, Bill Valentine and others that had chartered large shrimp boats the previous Thursday. Most of us at the Bay either loafed around or made sandbuggy excursions to pass the time. The majority left for home as it became evident that there would be no fishing that day. This was fortunate for if the Bay had been full of people Sunday night we probably would have had some serious injuries and even possibly some deaths.

About five o'clock a front came through with hurricane force winds accompanied by extremely heavy rain. This was just a warning of what we had coming.

Apparently the storm split up in passing and then returned from two directions about eight o'clock and managed to bump heads right over us. The first warning came out of the dark with gusty winds of hurricane force and rain approaching cloudburst proportions. It did not take long for the storm to turn into a full-blown tornado with winds between 80 and 125 miles per hour. The rain changed to a cloudburst of no mean proportions.

When the full force hit we lowered our bamboo shades inside each window to dissipate any glass that might be flying should any window give way. The corrugated aluminum roof loosened up at each joint and the water came in as if we did not have one. Even with what had been a tight roof we had over two inches of water on the floor. My south wall is supported by 4 x 4s buried in two feet of concrete at four foot intervals with the roof strapped on with steel strapping; this wall gave as much as three to four inches when the gusts hit. In spite of this we were lucky. The tornado did not touch down on us.


The funnel capriciously touched down hither and you and everything it touched was demolished. Fifty foot house trailers were picked up, toyed around with just like feathers. Concrete block houses were completely disintegrated and roofs ended up flying through the air damaging anything in their paths. Some just broke up and fell in the Bay in small pieces.

I found one 4x4 with a splinter driven right through it. Another place a 16x32 room lifted off the foundations to disappear, leaving the furnishings untouched, not even a feather pillow moved. Howard Coffinger had his boat setting on its trailer in front of his place. The force moved it across the road and into the cabin of Oscar Newman.

The places that were damaged are too numerous to mention. On Monday morning in the light of day, the people left at the Bay were able to assess some of the damage done. Every available person, Mexican and American, started going around closing up the damaged places to prevent further loss by either water, wind or pilfering. All our Mexican friends left their jobs and closed and repaired any place that needed it.

This was my first experience with a tornado, being an old desert rat, but believe me I hope it will also be my last. I don't mind admitting that I was literally scared out of my wits. I am glad that I am here to once again enjoy the peace and tranquility that we all enjoy so much at Cholla Bay.



Such a Beautiful day was before us that Saturday.

We departed for 18 mile reef as we has heard that white sea bass were being caught. Four miles enroute the water pump went out on # 1 engine. Back to pelican point we cruised on # 2 engine. Where our mechanical genius Clive replaced the water pump so- off again to 18 mile!

On arriving, three or four fishing boats were on the reef. Some anchoned some drifing. No fish so far.

We decided to drift and "uo uo" our lures. All at once we "cought the world!" We started our boat to freee the snagged line; we freed it- suffenly the other line had a strike! What a strike it was! The adrenalin was high! The steel line was in the running propeller! We'd cought the boat We shut off the motor and climbed onto the swim platform and bobbed up and down untangling our line for a half hour, what fun! By now it was afternoon-we said PHOOEY to reef fishing and set our heading for Shell Cliff Bay our sign out for the night. Shell Cliff is a beautiful but isolated estuany some 27 miles from Cholla Bay across adnr Bay. When the high tide is in one can navigate several miles into the Bay. At least we could catch some small reef fish for dinner and some crabs for hors'd ourves. We also love to windsurf while the tide is in.

Upon anchoring we found the outgoing tide too strong to windsurf. Also the current was too swift to let the brab trap settle to the sand! Then our anchor dragged! We reset our anchor and I went ashore on the surf board with a paddle. I had a beautiful walk seeing fresh coyote tracks in the wet sand.

At dusk with the tide almost out leaving as beached at our expected high and dry-we got out the stove for dinner we lit the stove to cool fish---- "went out! No fuel in the stove!Oh those cold canned goods! YUM. We had a beautiful night sleeping-awaking at 4:00 A.M. to get out of the estuary before low tide cought us.

We left in swift current dodging sandbars looking for the channel when we saw two silver dorsal fins shimmering in the pale slarlight Two friendly porpoises led us to the channel—and out of the Bay! We felt like the "couple on the dolphins!

With a light southeast breeze at sunrise we trolled by Adair Bay lighthouse to the reefs near double dunes.

We played, trolled and fished with baitcought a few fish and them decided to move on
toward lonsag rock 20 miles distant.
While running at chuising speed we lost a:
fan belt that had aparently been damaged
when the water pump went out. Another repair job! While repairing the belt we
decided to head back in the general direction
of Cholla Bay. This was the "nothing
went right trip-tho we did have a beautiful
time with favorable weather regardless of
the difficulties!

History of Search & Rescue



IT WILL BE THE DUTY OF THE SEARCH & RESCUE TEAM:

To promote and encourage boating safety to the members of the Cholla Bay Sportsmen's Club, and to all fishermen, ashore or afloat, be he club member or not.

To go to the aid of, when possible, boats or persons at Cholla Bay when aid is needed.

To encourage the keeping of safety equipment aboardall boats at Cholla

To encourage the proper use of the Cholla Bay radio, launching checkout procedures, and the use of the club's grid map.

When you start talking about the origin of Search & Rescue in CBSC, you have to go a long way back and talk about guys like Paul Schoonover who in 1959 saw what was to come and realized the need for ship to shore radio. He started the drive to come up with the money to get it. Bill Blair in 1960 with the help of George Gehon and many others put our first radio on the air. In 1961 Eddie Smith started our checking-out system, and with the help of Wesley Douglas, got our group insurance started with the idea in mind to back up the search efforts if the worst should happen.

This was the foundation Search & Rescue was built on. In 1962-63 the radio and check-out system were improved upon, but up to this point there really wasn't any organized search and rescue team. Most depended on the buddy system, or if a boat didn't get back, whoever was handy and would go did

the job that had to be done.

In 1964 and 1965 the Phoenix Coast Guard Auxiliary, Flotilla No. 85, with Ray (Sonny) Kraft as operations officer, took over the job of search and rescue chairman for the club. Ray, Katherine Hitchcock and other Coast Guard Auxiliary personnel did a fine job. On July 4th, 1965, Ray Kraft asked to be relieved of his chairmanship and Wes Douglas took over the chairmanship and finished out the year, doing a bang-up job. In 1966 Dick Miller of Phoenix and Chris Tatum of Tucson were appointed as cochairmen of the radio committee to give Matt Cubitto a hand as more and more demand was placed on the radio, and in 1966 Dick Miller took over search and rescue operations.

In February 1966, Dick Miller, Dan Kenny and Mel Jarvis talked over the idea of setting up a search and rescue team within the club manned by club members and with the idea of a safety program to teach the new members coming into the club safety while at the Bay, and also to ask the club for money to get it started. In March of that year Mel Jarvis asked the Phoenix Board for \$100 to be set aside for search and rescue and that the proceeds of the miss-made pennants be put into the fund also, to help

build the fund for search and rescue.

Search & Rescue was on its way. All through the year 1966, Dan Kenny, Dick Miller, Ferd Esenwein. Mel Jarvis and many others were hard at work improving the radio, trying out new ideas, like flying kites with antenna wire hooked to a balloon and a small GE generator to send out a signal to our search plane. Then they tried to get radio contact with Phoenix by way of Ajo with CAP radio as relay...We finally got Council to authorize new radio equipment. Ferd Esenwein finished the Search & Rescue map and it's still in use.

In 1967 Mel Jarvis took over the chairmanship of Search & Rescue; he made the team's guild book and by-laws, meetings were held and ideas were exchanged, and the team started to show its stuff as a team with the rescue of "Wee Two," and many others after that. Also in the years 1966-67 we had the air search arm of the team in full swing, with Dan Kenny as Search & Rescue pilot. Then we added the 24-hour phone watch, thanks to Harold Niles of Niles Radio Corporation in Phoenix and Tucson; a call from Rocky Point or the border and Search & Rescue was alerted and on its way any hour of the

Bob Blackridge and Bob Cullens of Tucson and Clint Yates and Harold Niles of Phoenix are now

Search & Rescue pilots for the club and have flown many hours of search for us.

Also about this time S&R and the radio got a new home as the trailer was moved onto its slab. Patty, now a veteran operator, was placed on the Search & Rescue team and was the switch that put Search & Rescue in gear. All she did is appreciated, and Ramon too — all the hard work and long hours

In 1968 Lyle Rogers headed up S&R and he had his work cut out for him. That year with the help of Bob Parnell, Harry Capen and Bub Allison, the homing lights were installed on Capen's cabin and the blue range lights were installed on the radio shack. Lyle had some near misses, like the McDowell and Freyise rescues, but Lyle came through the year with flying colors.

In 1969 Bob Parnell of Phoenix and Frank Zimmerman of Tucson took S&R chairmanship in hand and did a great job. Council came up with more operating money, a portable radio, and equipment for

sandbuggies.


The team has been headed up by Mel Jarvis in 1970, 1971 and 1972; there have been many rescues and a lot of hard work, long hours at sea towing and searching, lost fishing time, sleepless nights knowing that someone is out there and helpless until they are found. To put down each of the searches the team has made and the effort each man has put into Search & Rescue would take a ton of paper. S&R has done and is doing what it set out to do: promote safety and encourage the carrying of safety equipment on the boats that fish at Cholla...and to be there to help when needed.


