



FISHING DERBY RULES

- 1. Each contestant participating in the Derby must have a valid Mexican Fishing License and a valid Derby ticket before starting to fish. All boats must have a valid Mexican Boat Permit and must fill out a launch slip prior to entering the water. All fish must be caught on a hook and line.
- 2. Classes of fish Eligible for prizes:

GROUPER
PINTO
BLACK SEA BASS
SEA TROUT
POMPANO

MACKEREL DOLPHIN RED SNAPPER PARGO PLOUNDER

COCHI SARDINERO LEATHER PISH SKIP JACK SAILFISH

IT IS PROHIBITED TO CATCH AND KEEP SPECIES OF TOTOABA (WHITE SEA BASS).

Judging and prizes:

Pish will be judged-according to weight. There will be a Grand Prize Winner for men, women, and juniors (15 years of age or under). Fish taking a Grand Prize Trophy will not be eligible for any other awards. Additional awards will be given for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each category of fish. Awards will consist of trophies and/or cash.

4. Registration and weighing of fish:


The scales will be open for weighing from 10:00 A.M. until 6:00 P.M. each day of the Derby, except Sunday, May 24, 1987, when the scales will close promptly at 5:00 P.M. These closing times will be strictly enforced. Any fish presented for judging must be accompanied by the Derby Ticket of the person claiming the catch. The date, species and weight of the fish will be recorded on the back of said Derby Ticket at the time of weighing.


5. Derby Tickets:

Derby tickets which entitle the purchaser to fish the entire Derby may be purchased prior to and during the Derby for \$10.00 per Adult and 5. per junior. Daily Derby tickets may be purchased on the days you wish to fish for \$4.00 per adult and \$2.00 per junior.

6. Fish Fry and Awards Ceremony:

THE FISH FRY WILL BEGIN AT 6:00 P.M. ON SUNDAY, MAY 24, 1987. The Awards Ceremony and Jackpot ticket drawings will follow the Fish Fry. Members of the C.B.S.C. and guests, Derby participants and families and Cholla Bay residents are welcome to come to the Fish Fry. Identification will be required.





SUPER JACKPOTS

In addition to the Jackpot ticket raffle mentioned herein there will again be a "Super Jackpot" for men and a "Mini-Super Jackpot" for women.

The "Super Jackpot" prizes will be for the largest fish caught on Derby days and Derby rules will apply.

MEN: a \$100.00 donation per boat (or individual) is necessary to win one half of this Jackpot.

Women: a \$50.00 donation per individual is necessary to win one half of this Jackpot.

The other half of each Jackpot goes to the Club for use in improving the facilities in Cholla Bay.







FACTS

Can fish make sounds? How well do they see? Can they distinguish one color from another? Do they feel pain?

These and other questions have fascinated fisherman since primitive man first wet a line. The answers to some of the angler's usual questions are purely academic, while others give clues to successful fishing.

Here are a few facts on which most scientists agree:

Can a fish feel pain when he is hooked? To some extent, but the sensation of pain is probably not as keen as it is in mammals. It's unlikely that a hooked fish would pull so hard on a fishing line if such action greatly increased its pain.


Can a fish make sounds? Some make a grunting noise by forcing air from the air bladder through their mouths. Others gnash their teeth. Fishermen in Malaya put their heads in the water and distinguish the direction and types of fish making underwater sounds (or so they claim).


How do fish manage to support themselves at various depths so effortlessly? Submerged, fish weigh little or nothing, because the total volume of water they occupy weighs about the same as they do. Bottom dwelling species are heavier than water.

How well does a fish see? Most biologists agree that fish see clearly at close range but that their distant view is limited. Fish can tell one color from another. And they have preferences. Bass, for instance, seem to favor red or yellow lures.

An outline of helpful hints that you can do yourself

There exist two reasons ONLY why an engine quits running: lack of fuel $\underline{\text{and/or}}$ lack of electricity. Should you have both fuel $\underline{\text{and}}$ electricity, there is no reason why the engine won't start.

It is my intention to show you how to locate the problem and how to resolve the problem, out in the ocean blue. If you follow the logical sequence of steps, as I have outlined, and the engine still won't start, then you can assume that you have a major problem

I am only showing you the things that you can do on the boat in the water. Any other repairs would have to be done on shore.

I have also provided a list of basic tools/equipment that any seaman should have as standard supplies on board the boat at all times. These tools will enable you to perform the following steps in the outline. Feel free, of course, to add to your list.

FUEL

When an engine cranks BUT won't start, the obvious place to begin would be in determining if gas is present. Don't depend on gauge.

- Remove air cleaner.
 - A. Move throttle to and fro.
 - B. Look for gas to spurt inside center of carbureator.
 - C. If gas is present, proceed to electrical section.
- II. If still no gas present, remove gas line from carbureator.
 - A. Crank engine for approximately 10 seconds.
 - If gas spits out, remove filter from carbureator at inlet.
 Clean OR replace.
 - If no gas, check inline fuel filter (if applicable).
- III. If still no gas present, remove gas cap and gas line from tank side of fuel pump and BLOW INTO LINE.
 - A. If you cannot blow into gas line at all, it is possible that the line is plugged.
 - B. If you can blow into gas line and feel no restriction, you are out of fuel,

- C. If you can blow but feel or hear a bubbling sound, your fuel pump is bad and needs to be replaced. (***Note: When replacing fuel prop, check engine oil to see if it is overfull or discolored... as gas may have leaked into crankcase.)
- IV. If you have removed air cleaner and have gas running out everywhere:
 - A. Tap carbureator at point where gas line comes in and attempt to remove dirt from needle and seat. Crank engine.
 - B. If problem still exists, it may be necessary to remove top of carbureator. (Note: This is not recommended unless you are familiar with carbureators.)

ELECTRICAL

At this point, I am only going to give you situations where engine will crank but won't start.

- Engine cranks and gas is present
 - A. Remove coil wire from distributor or spark plug.

 Hold wire near a ground (CLEAN METAL SURFACE ON ENGINE)

 Do NOT hold near carbureator as this could cause a fire.
 - If no spark, remove distributor cap and rotor.
 Crank engine and observe that points are opening and closing properly. Also check for spark at coil. If spark is present, the coil could be bad.
 - If still no spark, make sure that the engine has stopped with points in the open position. Turn key on and check at points with testlight. If no light, check at sides of coil.
 - a. If you have a light at the coild, but not at the points, there may be a faulty connection either at coil or at distributor OR a broken wire in between the two.
 - b. If no light at PLUS side of coil, run a jumper from PLUS side of battery to plus side of coil. Once ashore, you can determine reason for no light at coil.
- B. Most important is to be sure that <u>all</u> electrical connections are dry and clean, particularly inside the distributor.
