





FISHING DERBY RULES

- 1. Each contestant participating in the Derby must have a valid Mexican Fishing License and a valid Derby Ticket before starting to fish. All boats must have a valid Mexican Boat Permit and must fill out a launch slip prior to entering the water. All fish must be caught on hook and line.
- Classes of fish eligible for prizes:

GROUPER MACKEREL PINIO DOLPHIN BLACK SEA BASS RED SNAPPER SEA TROUT PARGO **POMPANO** FLOUNDER IT IS PROHIBITED TO CATCH SPECIES OF TOTOABA (WHITE SEA BASS).

COCHI SARDINERO LEATHER FISH SKIP JACK SAILFISH

Judging and Prizes:

Fish will be judged according to weight. There will be a Grand Prize Winner for men, women and juniors (15 years of age or under). Fish taking a Grand Prize Trophy will not be eligible for any other awards. Additional awards will be given for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each category of fish. Awards will consist of trophies and/or cash.

4. Registration and weighing of fish:


The scales will be open for weighing from 10:00 A.M. until 6:00 P.M. each day of the Derby, except Sunday, May 25, 1986 when the scales will close promptly at 5:00 P.M. These closing times will be strictly enforced. Any fish presented for judging must be accompanied by the Derby Ticket of the person claiming the catch. The date, species and weight of the fish will be recorded on the back of such Derby Ticket at the time of weighing.

5. Derby Tickets:

Derby tickets which entitles the purchaser to fish entire Derby may be purchased prior to and during the Derby for \$10.00 per adult and \$5.00 per junior. Daily Derby tickets may be purchased on the days you wish to fish, for \$4.00 per adult and \$2.00 per junior.

Fish Fry and Awards Ceremony:

THE FISH FRY WILL BEGIN AT 6:00 P.M. ON SUNDAY MAY 25, 1986. The Awards ceremony and Jackpot ticket drawings will follow the Fish Fry. Members of the C.B.S.C. and guests, Derby participants and families and Cholla Bay residents are welcome to come to the Fish Fry. Identification will be required.






SEARCH & RESCUE FOR MARCH

Dear Sirs;



1961 Derby

Without a doubt our 1961 Fishing Derby was the biggest in the history of this annual event. High winds kept many fishermen from participating Friday but by evening over 150 boats entered the waters. Saturday dawned clear and calm and the boat launching area was in complete confusion as the boats literally poured down from every direction. Many a boat had to wait in line for hours before they could get out on the water. Had the wind laid low, this Derby would have been a howling success and with no tragedy but the storm came without warning, swiftly and ferociously, and many a boat had trouble coming back to shore. Those fishermen that stayed on shore Saturday were happy that they did.

The spirit of a successful Derby, even with fishing cut short because of the rough water, carried thru the fish fry Saturday evening. Over 2000 poeple were fed by a crew of about 15 people working as fast as they could. The crowd of hungry people formed in line before the food was ready and two and a half hours later the last person had his plate of food and the program of Prize Awarding was underway.


