





FISHING DERBY RULES

- 1. Each contestant participating in the Derby must have a valid Mexican Fishing License and a valid Derby ticket before starting to fish. All boats must have a valid Mexican Boat Permit and must fill out a launch slip prior to entering the water. All fish must be caught on a hook and line.
- 2. Classes of fish Eligible for prizes:

GROUPER PINTO BLACK SEA BASS SEA TROUT POMPANO MACKEREL DOLPHIN RED SNAPPER PARGO FLOUNDER COCHI SARDINERO LEATHER PISH SKIP JACK SAILFISH

IT IS PROHIBITED TO CATCH AND KEEP SPECIES OF TOTOABA (WHITE SEA BASS).

3. Judging and prizes:

Fish will be judged according to weight. There will be a Grand Frize Winner for men, women, and juniors (15 years of age or under). Fish taking a Grand Frize Trophy will not be eligible for any other awards. Additional awards will be given for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each category of fish. Awards will consist of trophies and/or cash.

4. Registration and weighing of fish:


The scales will be open for weighing from 10:00 A.M. until 6:00 F.M. each day of the Derby, except Sunday, May 24, 1987, when the scales will close promptly at 5:00 F.M. These closing times will be strictly enforced. Any fish presented for judging must be accompanied by the Derby Ticket of the person claiming the catch. The date, species and weight of the fish will be recorded on the back of said Derby Ticket at the time of weighing.

5. Derby Tickets:

Derby tickets which entitle the purchaser to fish the entire Derby may be purchased prior to and during the Derby for \$10.00 per Adult and 5. per junior. Daily Derby tickets may be purchased on the days you wish to fish for \$4.00 per adult and \$2.00 per junior.

6. Fish Pry and Awards Ceremony:

THE FISH FRY WILL BEGIN AT \$:00 P.M. ON SUNDAY, MAY 24, 1987. The Awards Ceremony and Jackpot ticket drawings will follow the Fish Fry. Members of the C.B.S.C. and guests, Derby participants and families and Cholla Bay residents are welcome to come to the Fish Fry. Identification will be required.



SUPER JACKPOTS

In addition to the Jackpot ticket raffle mentioned herein there will again be a "Super Jackpot" for men and a "Mini-Super Jackpot" for women.

The "Super Jackpot" prizes will be for the largest fish caught on Derby days and Derby rules will apply.

MEN: a \$100.00 donation per boat (or individual) is necessary to win one half of this Jackpot.

Women: a \$50.00 donation per individual is necessary to win one half of this Jackpot.

The other half of each Jackpot goes to the Club for use in improving the facilities in Cholla Bay.

Anyone interested in entering the "Super Jackpots" can contact Dave Bennett at 968-1112 (Tempe). Registration must be prepaid before the start of the Derby.





Joe Blunk was recovering from a very severe kidney infection and then had a relapse.








LIBRARY NOTES

THE TIDAL

At first glance or from a distance, a tidal or salt marsh may appear to be only meaningless patches of weeds, water and mud flats. Yet marshes are vital in the whole scheme of things. MARSH just as essential as fields and forests.

> Too many salt marsh areas have been lost in recent years to dumping grounds, industrial development and yards of fill in preparation for real estate tracts. People who understand and appreciate the ecological value of marshlands have found them a treasure store of wildlife.

Migrating waterfowl, ducks, geese, even swans, and many other kinds of birds find seasonal refuge in salt marshes. Some use them as feeding grounds, others nest there. 




