

## COMMON SEARCH & RESCUE COMMON

#### CHOLLA BAY RADIO OPERATIONS

The radios operated by the Cholla Bay Sportsmen's Club are essential to providing for effective communication and boating safety in the Puerto Penasco area. It is important that the radios be operated in a manner which meets the needs of our users. Frequently, especially on busy weekends, conversation on our primary frequencies is so heavy as to jepordize their effective use for handling normal boating operations and ensure safety needs are met.

In the event of an emergency when time is of the essence, the radio is often the only way to "sound the alarm" and obtain needed help. For this reason we ask that you monitor our safety and calling frequencies and use them to make initial contact with your party, then unless your conversation is with Cholla Radio, SWITCH TO ANOTHER CHANNEL FOR CONVERSATION!

Listed below are the channels in use by Cholla Radio:

RADIO TYPE	SAFETY, CALLING & EMERGENCY CHANNELS	
СВ	3 & 9	
VHF Marine	16 & 26	
AM Marine	2182	

You will note that the safety and calling channels are AM Marine 2182, VHF Marine 16 & 26, and CB channel 3. As in the United States, CB channel 9 is for emergency use and should be used for that purpose only. Channel 9 is monitored by both Cholla Radio and the Mexican agencies.

REMEMBER, it is important that our safety and calling channels remain as clear as possible if we are to handle normal traffic and emergencies effectively. After making your initial contact on a safety and calling channel, switch to another channel for conversation with other than Cholla Radio.

As we arrived at their parking lot, Sales manager Chip Speegle was there to greet us with his cheerful and friendly hello. He told us to step inside and Mr. Bob Eldridge would escort us to the dinning room, which was our gathering place. Mr. Eldridge is the SEA RAY Shipping Manager.

After most all had arrived we started the tour with these most gracious hosts. We started with the moulding room where they told us the boats are built from the outside in. The Gell coat is sprayed on the mould, then another coat is sprayed between the Gell coat and the fiber glass, then more roving over and over again until the desired thickness is obtained. A lot more thickness was applied to the bottom of the boat to assure a good strong boat. From there they took us on down the line and showed us the partitions and seat bases and on down to how the transoms were built with layers of plywood and resin. We progressed through the rest of the plant and stopped at different work stations where engines, gauges, carpting and etc. is installed. They showed their nice upholster shop and then we returned to the dinning room where a short meeting was held and door prizes were awarded.

Pete Bernard was winner of a cool cup holder. Lou Frazier won a large Tide Calendar, and Ron Cooper was the lucky winner of a nice yellow Cholla Bay Jacket.







### SEARCH AND RESCUE

On Saturday evening, April 14, 1984, just before dark, Bob Pennington and companions on board "Penny's Pride" radioed Cholla that they were having mechanical problems and were dead in the water about 12 miles out. "Que Pasa" skipper Ken Barnes rounded up a crew as did Shane Taylor for "Martine" and together they headed out with dark closing in.

Well, about that time Bub Allison and friends on board the "Pelican" called in with problems about 14 miles out, in a completely different area from "Penny". Chuck Woodward rounded up some folks for the "Eagle" while Lou Bock did the same for the "Conchita" and they too put in the water just before dark.

Needless to say, radio communications with just one search in operation is hectic, so when you get 6 boats (that's 18 radios) in the water, we kept volunteer Radio Shack operator, Wally Schmerfield, wishing he had a motor on his chair in the Shack. Thanks Wally, you did a heck of a job.

Time to 'fess up - This was a scheduled night excerise co-ordinated by Search & Rescue. Approximately 25 members and interested parties participated, with some of them teaching and some of us learning. We actually went into the water before dark and layed around the Bay on an absolutely beautiful night and waited for the full moon to rise. We could not have asked for nicer conditions for a training session.

We did learn that at night from a distance, shrimp boat lights and pleasure boat lights all look alike. Also, strobe lights are not visible as far as a good, strong spotlight, emergency flares DO get old and malfunction, and a boat with no lights - disappears. Coming around the point into the Bay at night is an all new trip.

All went we well and a big THANKS to all who participated in making it run smoothly. A special GRACIOUS to the launchers for waiting for our late return.

After arriving on shore from the mock Search and Rescue at about 10:00 P.M., we were advised that a 3-wheeler and a sand-rail had collided on the road to Cholla near the entrance to Sandy Beach. Lou Bock and myself made a quick trip to the Clinica in Penasco, arriving just in time to catch the ambulance before it left for the Border. If it hadn't been for Bill Coughlin, who was with us, they would have gotten away before we could advise them that we would have a helicopter meet them. We also needed to know the extent of injuries.

It was quite a shock to look into the ambulance and see Phoenix Fire Dept..

Para-medics Doug Mummert and Charles Rockyvich providing Advanced Life Support to the victim. They had arrived on the scene of the accident almost immediately and are in all probability responsible for saving the victim's life and most definetely his badly severed leg. The helicopter arrived without a hitch and the patient was transported to a Valley hospital.

We owe a debt of gratitude to the Clinica for assisting us with the telephone calls and a large THANK YOU to the Para-medics who were on the job, even when they were a long way from Phoenix.
