A SNAKEY FISH STORY CALLED ADVENTURE

On Sunday April 14th, Darrell Hardy of cabin 20-A and Emil Nasser of Cabin 14-A took Darrel's little boat out for some off-shore fishing.

We launched the boat on Tucson Beach and headed out around "Pelican Point". We caught several nice rock bass and a few "Cochi" (Trigger fish). I had reeled in a large cochi when Darrel said he had a "big one" on also. After several minutes it finally surfaced about 15 ft. from the boat. We saw right away that it wasn't a fish, but a large snake!!! or Sea Serpent.

Darrel reeled it in so we could get a better look at it, and grabbed the line about 18" from the snake. It was over 4 ft. long and about 4" in diameter. It was tan or light orange color with dark brown or black spots on it's back and sides. The underside was white. It had a 3½" mouth with plenty of round 1/4 inch teeth. It had a dorsal "ray" (fin) about 1½" high that ran from 4" behind the head to 6" from it's round hard tail. It was very firm and Muscular, about 12" back from it's mouth was a large round bulge about 6" thick. It looked as if it had swallowed something whole.

The snake eel was lying calmly in the water when Darrel lifted the line and snake up out of the water. It pushed it's tail against the water and was lunging or striking at his hand several times, barely missing it!

Darrel stood up and lifted the snake's tail out of the water and it started thrashing around thumping the tail and lower body against the side of the boat and it finally got it's lower body inside the boat, whipping the tail against Darrel's leg and my forearm several times before we were able to get it back outside the boatrail. The hook was still embedded through the lower jaw. We debated cutting the line or trying to subdue it and bringing it in to study and observe it more thoroughly. Darrel "vetored" cutting the line. He admitted later he didn't want to lose his favorite lure, a Kastmaster chrome with a red and white jig. At the time I would have bought him (5) six of them. Darrel got a secure hold on the lower jaw with a pair of pliers. We tried to hold it's head on the rail so we could club it, but it kept thrashing around and trying to bite his hand. We were finally able to hold it up and

slit it down the belly almost to the big bulge. Darrel tried to get a better grip with the pliers when the snake started around again and flipped off the hook. It bounced off the rail into the water and swam off and down out of sight without showing any sign of distress. We were both very disappointed after loosing our "trophy" but thankful it landed in the water instead of in our small boat!

Later back at the cabin, we conferred with Rayma Sharber of cabin 12A and her fish books and determined that it was a Pacific Spotted Eel or Tiger Snake Eel.

So ends another sad, but true story about "THE ONE THAT GOT AWAY!"

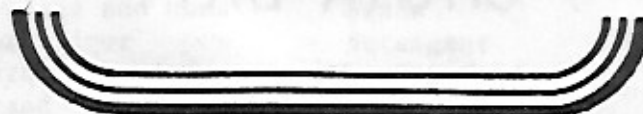



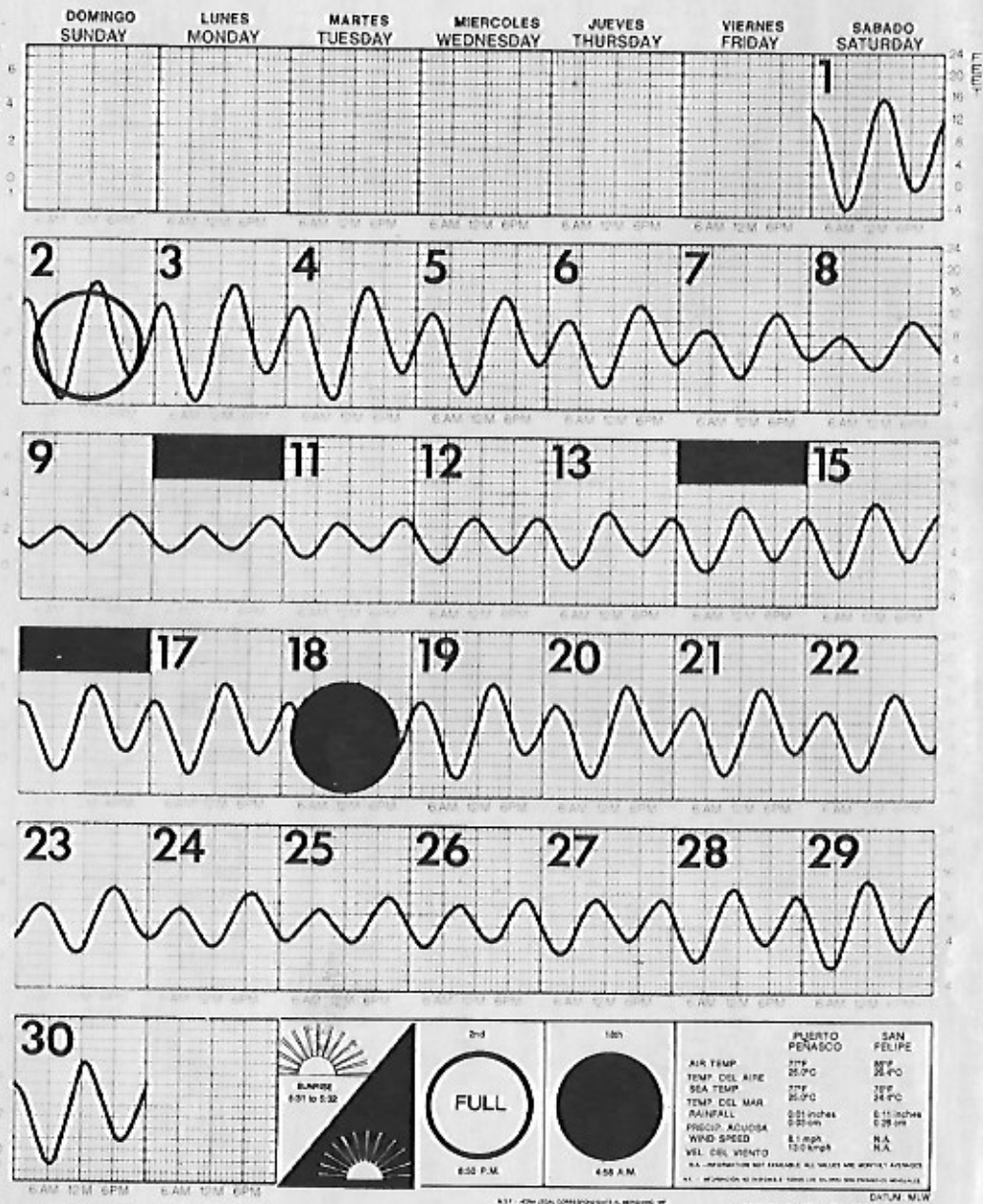
