





I must say the New Port Captain ALT. J. Heriberto Salinas is a fair man. He is only doing his job.





FLOUNDER PLUGGING (Old trick in a new bag)

Best practiced in 30' to 60' of water over a sandy bottom, the method is based on a complex terminal set-up and a


FLOUNDER PLUGGING (Old trick in a new bag)

Best practic ed in 30 to 60 feet of water over a sandy bottom, the method is based on a complex terminal set-up and a heavy weight to keep the plug on the bottom. First the main line is tied to a 3-way swivel, then using an eight inch leader, a torpedo weight of about 6 to 8 ounces is tied to the second ring of the 3-way swivel. Next tie an 18 inch leader to the third ring. This leader connects to six inch long, shiny bass dodger, a chrome plated attractor with a swivel at each end. Then comes another 18 inch leader, which is tied to the other end of the dodger. Finally a 4 inch shallow running Rapala to the end of this leader. The silver, black, white minnow pattern has had excellent results.

With this complicated set-up ready, the boat is brought to trolling speed, three to five miles per hour, and the rig is lowered to the bottom. Fairly stout gear is required to handle the trolling weight.

A great many respectable flounder have been caught with this technique, however keep in mind this is a fish finding method. Once two or three flounder have been caught in this manner in a general area, the trolling lines are brought in and we begin to drift live bait over the area.




In our part of the gulf the largest Sardinera run up to 3' in length and 40 pounds.
