We're missing someone in Cholla Bay. That someone is Butch Heldt. He was known to all of us in Cholla as "Firecracker" the unofficial mayor of Cholla Bay. He was a big man, like Black Mountain and everywhere you looked you saw him.

He'd race around from his home in "Old Town" to Pelican Point, Tucson Beach, Boracho Flats and Rocky Point as if there was a fire lit under him.

If you wanted to know something, "ask Butch". If you needed something, "go to Butch". Have water retention? He had something to eliminate it. A cough? The syrup. He knew all about it and had everything. Even the cure for Montezuma's Revenge.

He could go on for hours telling jokes, and did! No one enjoyed them more or laughed harder. He was a master at it.

He loved people more than most, and because he wore his heart on his sleeve, was hurt by them at times. Holding grudges didn't set well with him tho' and were soon forgotten.

Considering the many things that happened to him such as a broken neck, hit by a train plus God knows what, Cholla was probably the safest place for him to be. (Discounting the time he was doing some re-roofing, got his pants caught, spit out the mouthful of nails to keep from choking, the ladder fell away from him and so too his pants. He liked to say it was the biggest moon ever seen in Cholla Bay).

There were many stories about him and they were true. He had that wonderful capacity to laugh at himself.

The door to his home which he shared with his wife Ethel was always open for he was a generous man, and gentle too, for he loved to feed the birds and was quite knowledgeable of them.

There was always a drink waiting for you and something wonderful to eat. Many was the time we were there for Ma's great macaroni and cheese. (She's known for it). I guess everyone in Cholla ate there at least once, and the more they could fit into their kitchen the merrier.

He was proud of his service record, of having been a bodyguard to the late Jayne Mansfield, (you've all seen that picture), and of being a Mason and a Shriner.

The hat I loved best on him was the two-way double billed yellow one.

I can see him now in my mind's eye, standing there. This great huge un-born mountain of a man.

Rotund tummy, shorts, thick legs, socks, shoes (for his feet were tender) usually a T-shirt with some saying on it. A hat perched atop his butch hair cut that looked too small for his massive head that sat on bear-sized shoulders.

Yeah, that's how I see him to my mind's eye. He called me daughter, my husband son, and he loved our kids.

He was a "Firecracker" alright.

Look at the glow and brightness he left behind for us to see.

He was a sparkler!  
Firecracker clear.

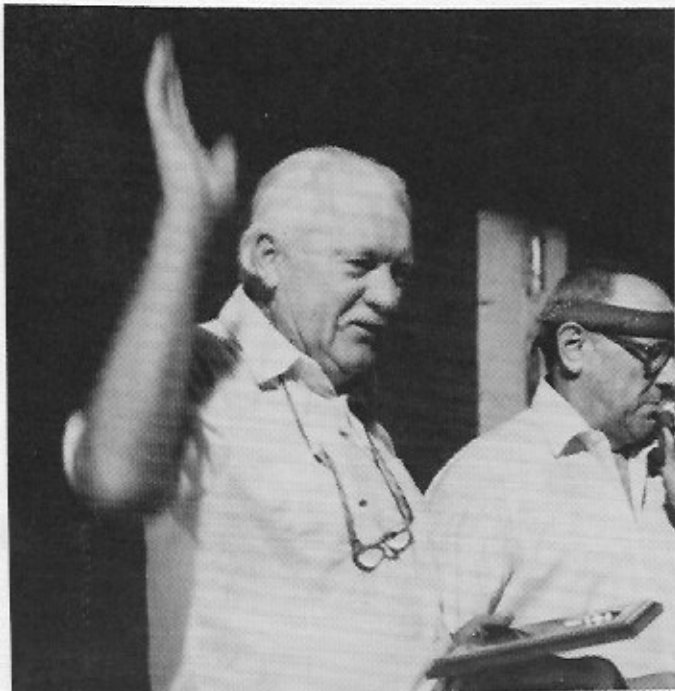

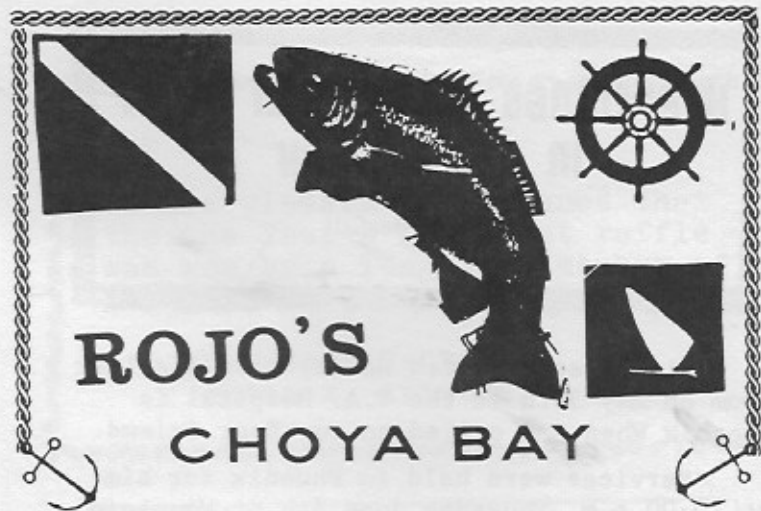

Fire Cracker(Butch Heldt) made his last Boom on May 30th in the V.A. Hospital in Phoenix When God called on our Dear Friend.

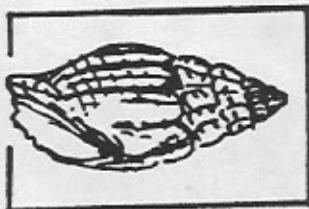

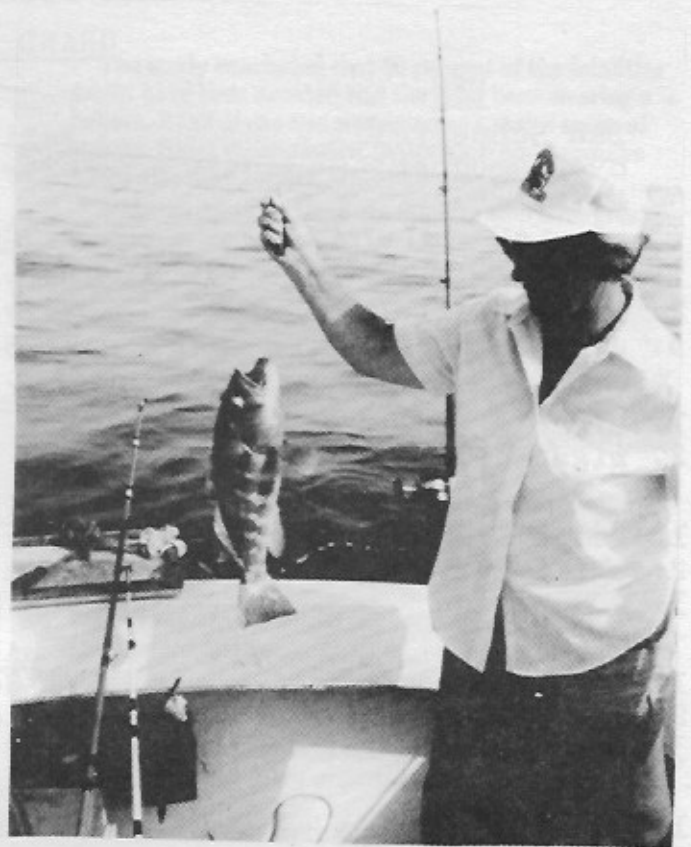

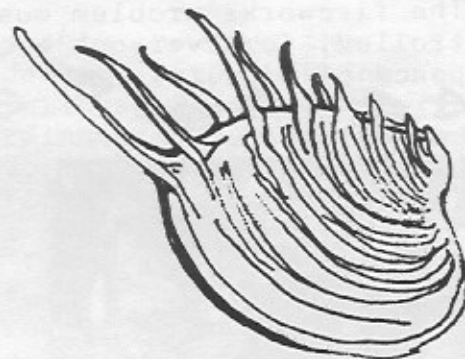

## Needless deaths, injuries call for curbing ATC use

**A** friend of mine died last weekend in Mexico. He was only 38.

In a lifetime, a person has few friends. I take it as a personal affront when I lose one.

Summer "Buck" Schott was going too fast when he attempted a turn on his three-wheel cycle. His neck was broken. It took two days for his wife and two daughters get his body back into this country.

It was easy to kid a guy with a name like Buck Schott. It was too easy. That was work for a dullard. Buck's mother called him that because she hated his first name.

He was no beginner with ATCs. He had owned one or more for years. Buck was a good rider.

We met through the church and immediately became friends because of our mutual love for the outdoors. He loved to hunt.

Buck had only one eye. He lost the other in a BB-gun accident. His one eye was like a hawk's when it came to spotting game, but he lost peripheral vision. Perhaps that was involved in the wreck.

He had no fear of the machine. He talked unemotionally about a friend who had separated a shoulder while riding an ATC. He helped me when I ran into a tree limb on his machine and required plastic surgery.

Buck's death occurred one year to the day after another friend, co-worker Bob Thomas, overturned an ATC in Mexico and broke his lower back. He was in the hospital for months and missed seven months of work.

It seems that I can't talk to anyone who hasn't been injured on an ATC. I'm sick of it.

My first thought is to outlaw these vehicles in Arizona. That's impossible. They have legitimate uses in agriculture and industry.

One can't fault the machines. They are brilliant mechanically.

But here is a machine that can travel at least 45 mph across all kinds of unsafe terrain. It is more unstable than a wider, four-wheel vehicle. It has no roll cage. Most riders refuse to wear a helmet. Even good riders are lulled into complacency.

The accidents continue. Emergency-room physicians can awe you with tales of the many ATC accident victims they have treated.

It's even worse to discover that most of those victims are kids, according to a study published in this month's issue of the *Journal of the American Medical Association*.

The study was done in Alaska, using statistics from the years 1983 and 1984. The highest number of accidents for both male and female was the 10 to 19 age bracket. The 20-24 bracket was next. Then the dropoff is drastic.

Sixty-two percent of the injuries were fractures or dislocations. Eighteen percent were head or spinal-cord injuries.

The study concluded that 60 percent of the fatalities might have been avoided had the rider been wearing a helmet. Alcohol use was suspected as a major cause of wrecks. Rider inexperience, inattention and excessive speed also were factors.

Make no mistake, there are families who have great experiences together on ATCs. I know such families.

But there are many more who buy their children ATCs and turn them loose. It's a good way to get rid of them — perhaps literally.

These children and their teen-age brothers and sisters have no training, no knowledge. They endanger themselves, others and the delicate desert environment. They run free, tearing up everything in sight. Leaving trails is a way of life.

I suggest that more damage is done to the terrain by ATCs than all other all-terrain vehicles combined. The situation is sickening.

More enforcement would help. But that's impossible. We have entered a period of governmental budget cuts and austere services.

Mandatory training might help, as it did in the use of firearms by young hunters.

What would help most is the banning of ATCs for recreational use. They present far more hazards than fun.

It honestly is the only way I can come up with to end the maiming and pain.

Rest in peace, Buck Schott.

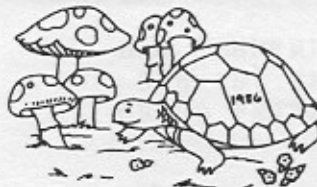

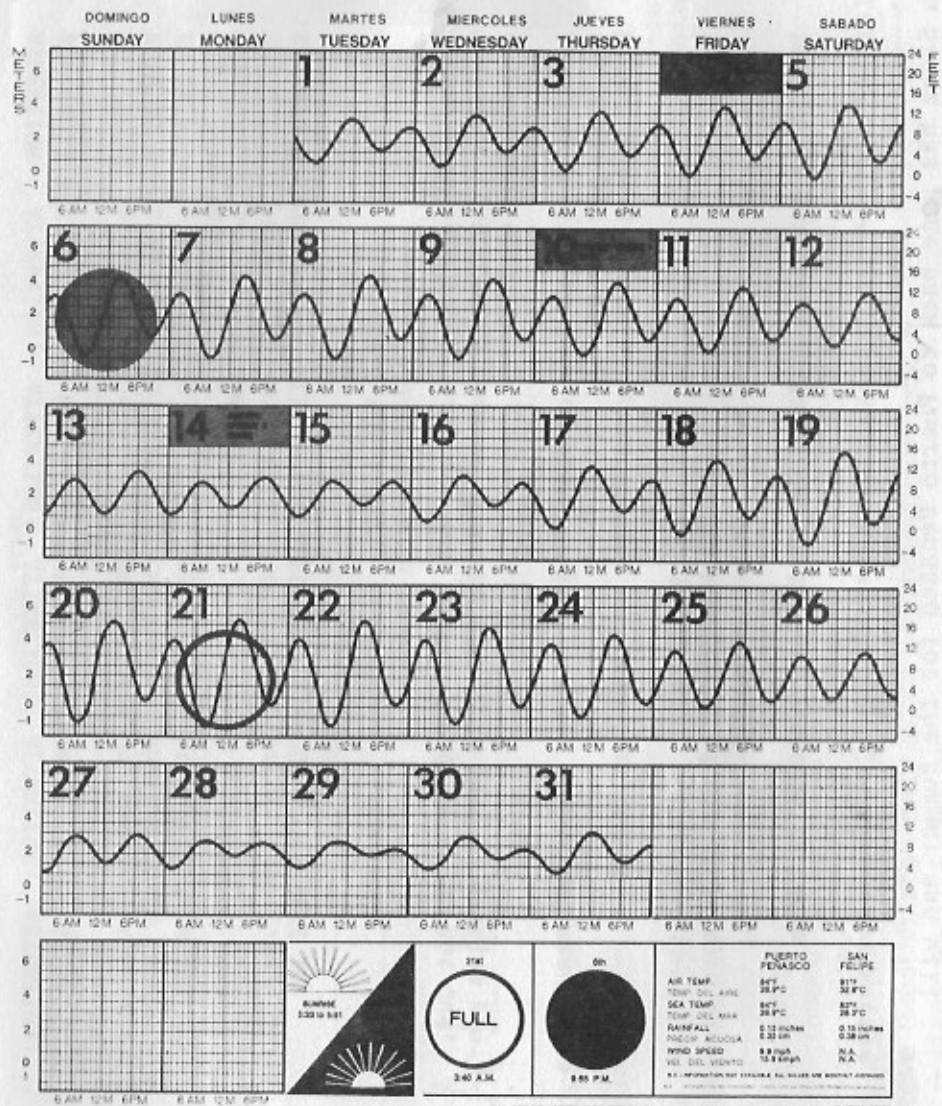
