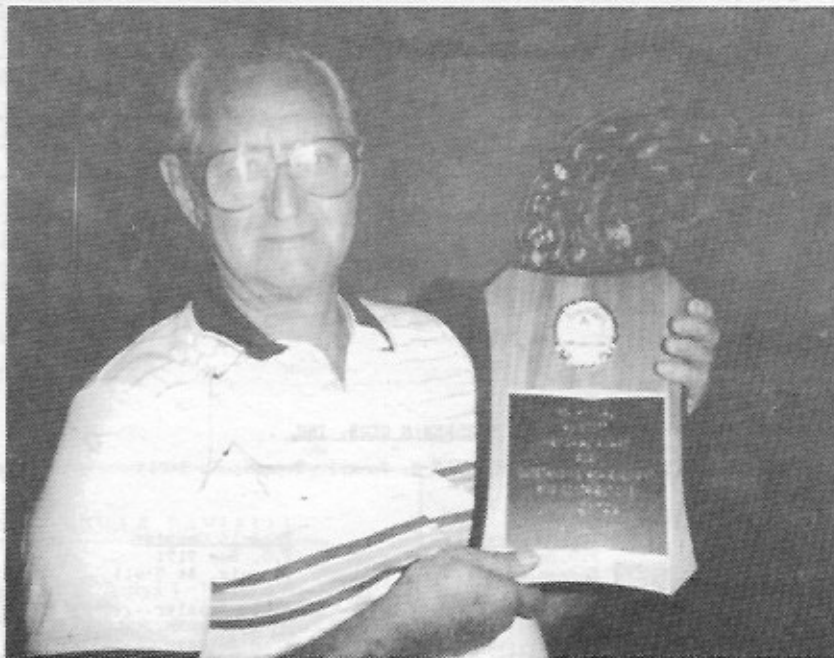

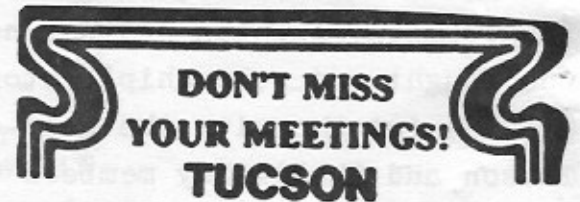

Ask Vi how they do it, and she'll say most folks just don't fish hard enough. The Schmerfelds do.

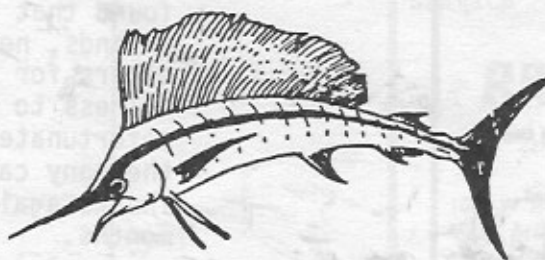
I don't know about you, but I'll be out fishing harder next year.

A LESSON FROM BOMBERO - -

I have a 1976 Ford truck that I bought new and have never put anything in the radiator but distilled water and antifreeze/coolant. I was a little upset when the freeze plugs started to leak a while back. I replaced two of them and figured as soon as I got the time I would replace all of them. Well, the engine decided that 130,000 miles was enough of this and a valve broke and the engine puked on the way to Mexico on of our trips. I bought another engine and had it put in, however the mechanic Horatio in Puerto Penasco said for me to take the old engine to see if I could salvage some parts. Upon getting it back home I started removing those items I could use. I discovered the freeze plugs behind the motor mounts, which are protected from road debris, were in good condition. I then set about removing and inspecting all of the freeze plugs in the engine and discovered - -THE FREEZE PLUGS HAD BEEN DESTROYED FROM THE OUTSIDE. The moral to this is - if you are going to drive your vehicles to Mexice, coat the OUTSIDE of the plugs with something to prevent the salt water saturated road film from getting to them.

LORAN?

Is there any reason a boat which goes to sea should not carry Loran?

"Absolutely none," states Jim Bartell. That's easy for you to say, Jim. You've been in marine electronics as a retail store owner for 28 years, and now as a factory rep with the E.M. Ballard Company in Costa Mesa. Before that you were in the United States Navy using and developing many of the electronics that we civilians have available today. You are at home with things like Loran (LONG RANGE Navigation).

Me, I'm just an average guy with a boat. I can work an electric toaster, but my microwave oven sometimes stumps me. How long do you think it would take me to learn how to use something as sophisticated as Loran?

"About 10 minutes," says Jim. Of course he's talking about basics. Push these buttons and your latitude and longitude will flash onto the screen. Look on the chart and pin-point your location. That's it.

In addition to the basics, there are many refinements built into all available Loran sets. There are off-course alarms, waypoint stations, conversions from true to magnetic compass headings, and a multitude of other conveniences (bells and whistles, Jim calls them) which make Loran sets the versatile and valuable instruments they are. Learning how to play tunes with the various bells and whistles offered by different manufactures does take practice and time. Surprisingly though, you can use a Loran set in the comfort of your living room enough to get acquainted with it. However, to build your confidence that Loran is no toy, you should practice with it at sea.

OK, I'm convinced I can handle a Loran set. What about the cost?

"Anything from \$399 to \$2600," replies Jim after mentally searching through his latest Loran catalog. The more expensive sets have more automatic functions. All are accurate as far as determining position is concerned. The least expensive sets

have about 95% of the position accuracy of the most expensive models. The extra five percent in accuracy is achieved by building in better clocks and including more detailed corrections for radio wave reception. Is the extra accuracy worth the extra cost? We may be talking about being exactly on target, or 100 yards away, or 200 yards away. How much are those yards worth to you? As for those costly extra bells and whistles - are all usable and worthwhile, but oddly enough, many skippers fail to learn to use what they have paid for. Think over what you expect to do with Loran before committing yourself to the most expensive set - or the least expensive.

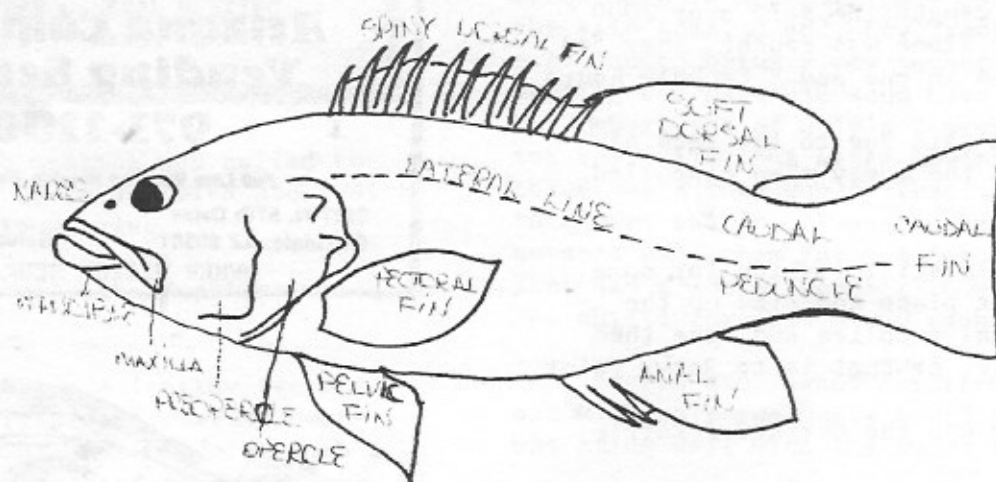

GLOSSARY OF TERMS USED IN IDENTIFYING FISHES

ADIPOSE FIN - a soft, rayless, fatty fin located behind the dorsal and in front of the caudal fin.

BARS - any vertical markings along the sides or head.

BARBEL - a thread-like or flap-like growth on the lips or chin.

CANINE TEETH - strong, conical, sharp pointed teeth, usually along the fore part of the jaws.

CIRRI - fringe-like skin flaps on the top of the head.

FIN-RAY (SOFT RAY) - a stiff but flexible bony rod in a fin; segmented and often branched at tip.

FIN-SPINE (SPINE) - a rigid, usually hard and sharply pointed bony rod in a fin.

GILL RAKERS - long and slender or short and stout, rod-like projections from the anterior surface of a gill arch.

GILL SLIT - opening from the gill chamber to the outside.

INCISORS - front teeth with cutting edge.

INFERIOR MOUTH - mouth opening on ventral side of head.

LATERAL LINE PORES - openings of tubes of the lateral line sensory canal.

OCELLUS (OCELLI, pl) - "eye spot", a round spot usually edged with a ring of a different color.

PAPILLAE - small, soft, flap-like growths on the skin.

PREMAXILLARIES - paired bones at front of upper jaws.

PROTRUSIBLE MOUTH - jaws capable of being thrust forward and retracted.

SCUTE - a thin bony plate or keeled scale.

SERRATED - having sawlike notches along the edge.

STRIPES - narrow, horizontal markings along sides or head.

SUPERIOR MOUTH - mouth opening directed upward.

TERMINAL MOUTH - mouth opening directed forward.

VENT (ANUS) - anal opening

VENTRAL FIN - pelvic fin

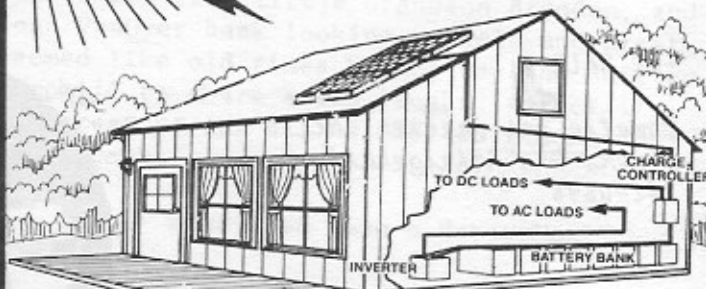

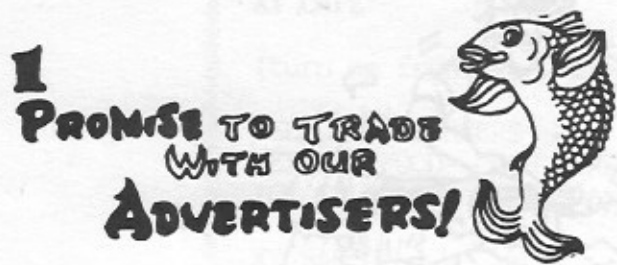

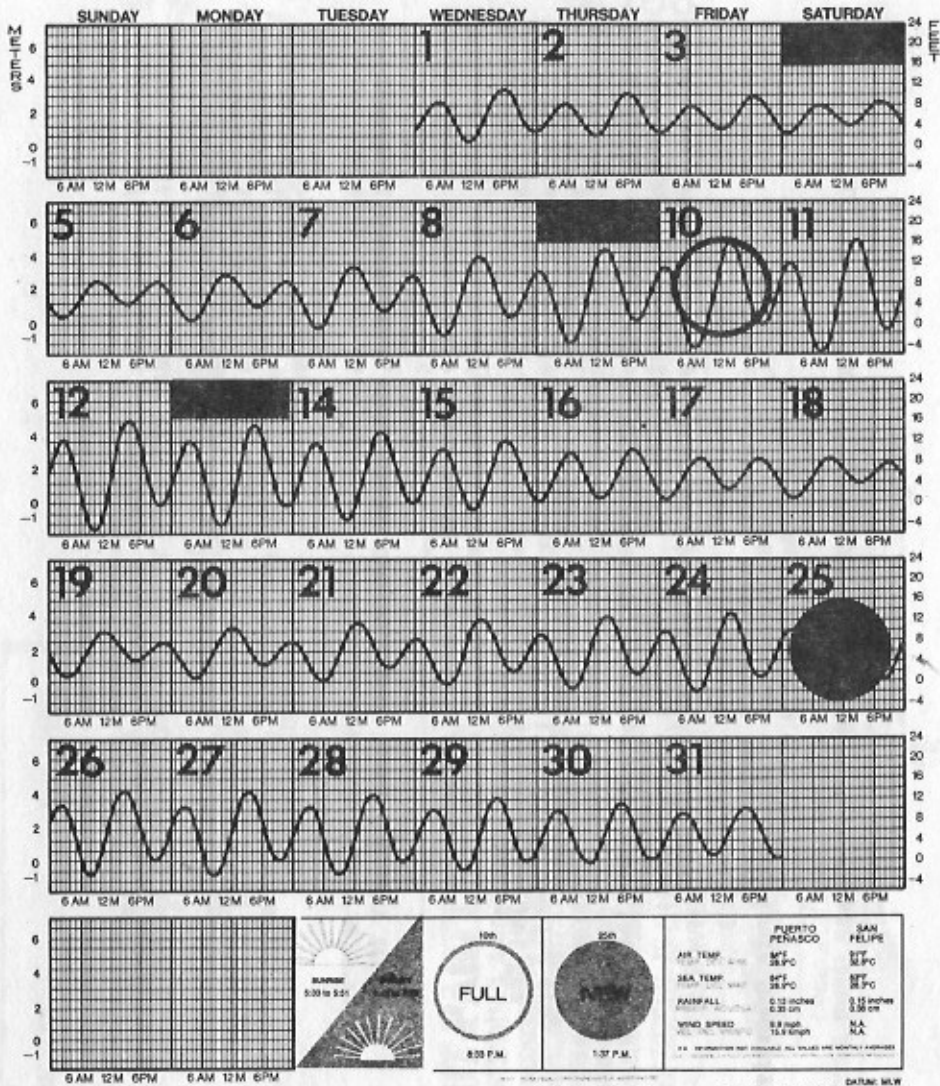
