

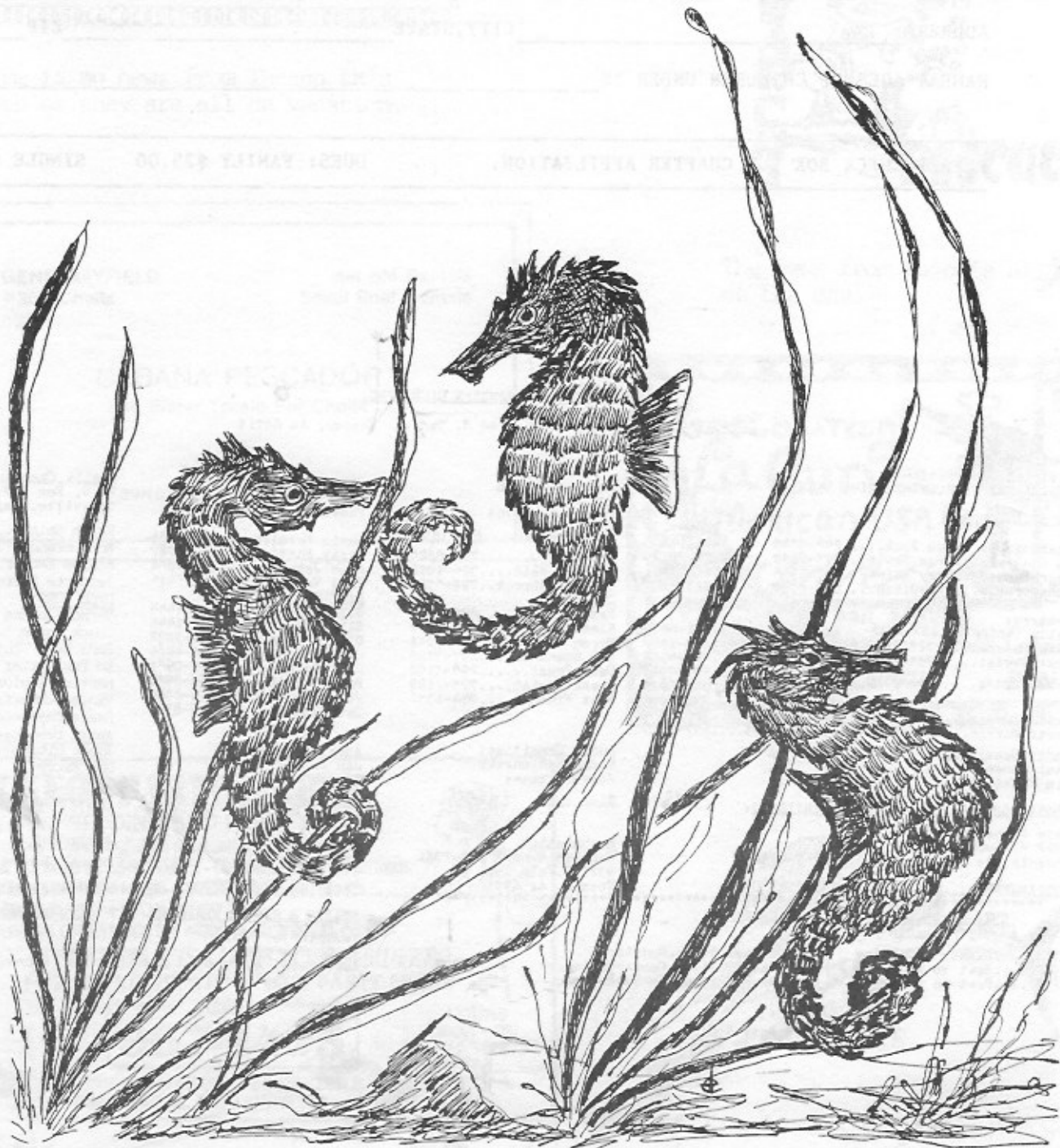

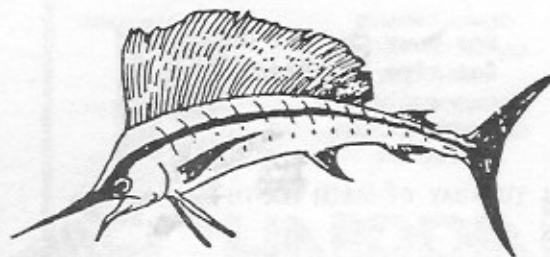

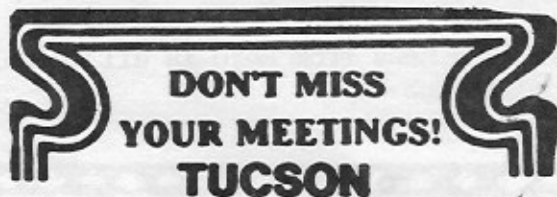
## CALENDAR OF EVENTS SPECIAL

# Pair's day of fun in Mexican gulf turns into tragedy

She was 75, a year older than he, and they had the nerve to go for it.

But something went terribly wrong during a sailing trip 11 days ago. Their day of fun and sun and sea turned into a nightmare. And sometime that week, she died in the heat of a desolate rock-and-sand beach on the Sonoran shore of the Gulf of California.

Verona G. "Nonie" McKibbin and Joseph B. Fite, popular and well-liked Tucsonans, were last seen June 14 when they sailed a 14-foot sailboat out of Cholla Bay, near Puerto Penasco (Rocky Point) in Sonora, Mexico. Their destination apparently was Bird Island, a tiny outcropping of rocks about 30 miles out into the gulf.

Two or three days later, searchers found the sailboat, empty and drifting, about 1½ miles from Bird Island, Mexican officials said.

Then on Monday, the decomposing body of McKibbin was discovered on the mainland, about 40 miles southeast of Puerto Penasco. She had a container of water but apparently had collapsed while walking on the beach.

Commander Ruben Soto Figueroa of the Puerto Penasco police said last night he didn't know what caused her death, and an autopsy was to be performed today.

Soto also said that McKibbin had a note, apparently written by Fite since it was addressed to her.

But, he said, he had no explanation of what might have happened.

McKibbin's health problems included a heart condition for which she had had a pacemaker implanted. Fite, too, took medication for a heart condition.

The land, air and sea search for Fite continued without success yesterday and was to be resumed today, Soto said.

And in Tucson, many of their friends kept calling one another, seeking news and offering comfort.

Most of the friends of McKibbin and Fite traveled in

different circles, and since the two had not been friends for long, some apparently didn't know the two even knew one another.

McKibbin and Fite knew Tucson when it was a small and friendly city.

McKibbin came to Tucson with her late husband, Dumont McKibbin, in 1945. He had rheumatoid arthritis, which kept him confined much of the time.

Mrs. McKibbin had graduated from Skidmore College in 1934 and worked as a medical technologist for more than 20 years.

In 1947, she fell in love with scuba diving and became an expert, often making the long drive through the desert to Rocky Point. Not long after, she helped found the Desert Dolphins Scuba Diving Club in Tucson.

She became an authority on oceanography, especially algae and fish in the Gulf of California. She was the co-author of a book on fish in the gulf, a book that is still being sold, said Thomas Van Atta, owner of the Ship's Store, 5042 E. Speedway Blvd.

McKibbin was "a very easy person to know, a wonderful person," said Van Atta.

Not only was she "very adventurous," but also a "very good sailor," he said.

During an interview with the Tucson Citizen in 1967, McKibbin, then 55, said that although she was much older than most members of the diving club, she had no thoughts of ever giving it up.

"I know my limitations and I'm going to keep on diving each month," she said.

"I've heard of 70-year-olds doing it," she said then.

Fite, a St. Louis native, came west in 1952, working as a contractor and carpenter. Among other buildings, he worked on the Kitt Peak National Observatory, said Fite's daughter, Jo Ann Fite.

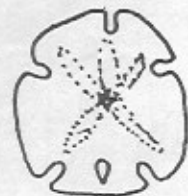
She added that her father once was very active in union activities and other causes.

Ruth Softley, a long-time friend of Fite, said "he devoted most of his time to helping people," mainly through Alcoholics Anonymous and Overeaters Anonymous. Recently, Fite had been helping to establish a program to provide interpreters for deaf people in AA, Softley said.

In the past, "he has done a lot of hair-raising things," including catching venomous snakes for a pharmaceutical company, performing on a circus high wire and teaching martial arts to American soldiers during World War II, she said. He also was a cowboy, an accomplished square dancer and an avid fisherman, she said.

"He was very outgoing and liked everyone," she said.

Friends said McKibbin and Fite apparently met in a writers' group and had plans to write a book on the coast of Mexico.

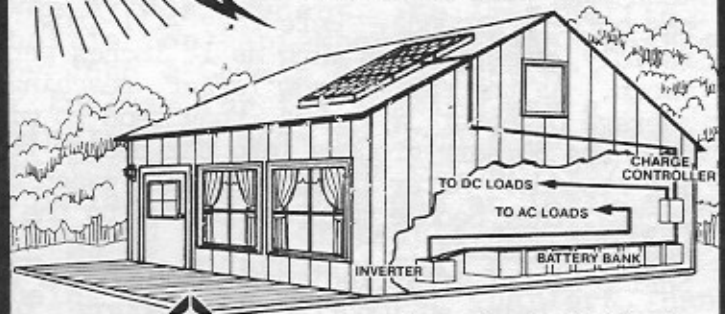

## SHRIMP

The six most common species are all members of one family, the Penaeidae, which is characterized by having the first three pairs of walking legs (there are five pairs in all) ending with small pincers.

We will concern ourselves with *Panaeus Aztecus* (Brown or Blue) shrimp. His two distinguishing characteristics are a pair of deep grooves on top of the head reaching from behind the eyes to almost the end of the cephalothorax cup, a pair of wide grooves on top of the next to last tail segment that will permit the fingernail to be inserted. Brown shrimp are usually a reddish brown color with tinges of blue or purple on the tail and some of the legs.

The Brown shrimp will spawn in both deep water or shallow bays and inlets. The female, which is larger than the male at maturity, lays about 500,000 eggs. The spawning season begins in March and continues through September, with two distinct peaks, one in May or June and the other in August or September.

During mating the male attaches a sac-like spermatophore to the female so that the eggs may be fertilized as they are laid. The eggs sink to the bottom and then hatch into the first of a series of Larval Stages. For the first two to three weeks the young are carried mostly by the currents.

The Juvenile shrimp (white in color), about  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch long will migrate along the bottom toward the nursery grounds. Here they will grow rapidly, sometimes as much as  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches per month. As the shrimp grow larger, reaching an average of about  $3\frac{1}{2}$  inches, they tend to migrate from the nursery grounds into the deeper feeding grounds. After this, when they reach  $4\frac{1}{2}$ -6 inches, they become mature and move to the spawning grounds.

Shrimp are of great indirect value to the fisherman in being an important food source for many game fish. They are also readily obtainable as bait. Shrimp have been raised in hatcheries in commercial quantities, however, by far the largest quantities (98.7%) comes from net catches.

### THOUGHT OF DEATH

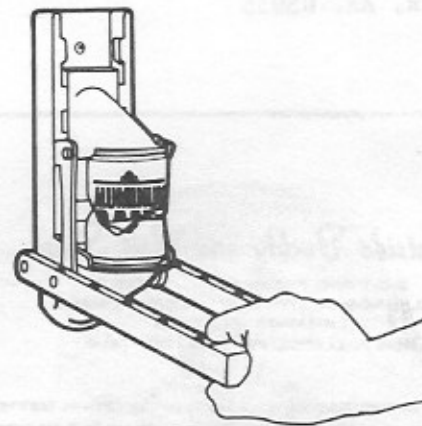
