





Siege by Feds

Legislation introduced into the U.S. Senate would require popular all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) to carry warning labels and youngsters under the age of 14 couldn't legally

operate them.

The chairman of the Senate subcommittee on consumer affairs wants the warning legislations on all ATVs manufacutured, imported or sold by dealers in the United States. ATVs are three or four-wheel engine-driven vehicles used primarily for off-road recreation.

Republican Sen. Robert Kasten of Wisconsin pointed out that by the end of last year, there were approximately 2.6 million such vehicles in use in the United States. Between 1982 and 1985, more than 400 people, almost half of them under 16 years old, were killed in ATV related accidents.

In that same time frame, there were eight deaths in Arizona, according to the Consumer Product Safety Commission.

The All-Terrain Vehicle User Safety Act would require the following display on each vehicle:

"Passengers will reduce balance and control; operator only, no passengers.

passengers.

"Use on hard surface may cause severe injury; off-the-road use only.

"Operation without helmet can result in severe injury; wear protective equipment; "Lack of supervision when children operate this vehicle may result in serious injury. Adult supervision required. This model shouldn't be operated by children under the age of 14."

It is a bit unfortunate such legislation is termed necessary. Most parents have accepted their responsibility in teaching their youngsters the hazards in simply operating a bicycle.

Sens. Dennis DeConcini and Barry Goldwater would no doubt like to hear from the folks at home on the proposed legislation.






