


BITS AND PIECES


Loui Bock and his wife Shelly had some slides they took on underwater shots and some islands they toured while on their vacation. The slides were enjoyed by all who attended.





In 1907 Godfrey Sykes, Wm. Hornaday and five other adventurers explored Pinacate Mountain, built a cabin on it's peak and wrote a

book: Campfires on Desert and Lava.

About ten years before, an uncle of Roberto Celaya (who pioneered the L.P. gas business in Rocky Point) led a posse from Sonoyta, taking the trail of a Pinacateno war party who had murdered two sleeping vaqueros, overtaking them in the dunes near Cholla Bay and killed all but one little girl, who was taken to Sonoyta and grew there. The Trenchero Tribe living around Cholla Bay and Penasco were absorbed into tribes farther south.

In 1907 Diaz was president of Mexico and Teddy Roosevelt was president of the U.S.A. The latter, being a great hunter, was intrigued with stories of plentiful ibex roaming the mountains north of Cholla. By the time he left office it had been proven that the ibex were nothing more than pronghorn antelope and mountain sheep. So he switched his safari from Mexico to Africa.

In 1848 President Polk, after invading Mexico, paid General Santa Anna \$8 million to sign the Treaty of Hidalgo, giving all of "New Spain" from Texas to the Oregon Territory to the United States. Santa Anna used the money to pay back wages to his army, thereby remaining in power as president (sic). It was the world's greatest land swindle!

Cholla Bay storekeeper, Nacho Quiroz was the nephew of long-time alcalda (mayor) of Sonoyta, whose name was also N. Quiroz.

The old town being west of where it is today.

In 1848 gold was found in California, and the rush was on! A steady stream of seekers - wagon-to-wagon trekking westward over various routes along the new ill-defined international border, the most northerly being the Old Pueblo, Tucson. And by 1850 many were returning homeward, their pockets bulging. In fact, gold was so plentiful that merchants preferred silver, minted into pesos and dollars 2 - 1. No "folding money" in those days.

But not all homeward-bound parties ever got any farther than Arizona. The Roosevelt Dam being built, promised it would supply

water to make the desert bloom. And it did!

The late Glenton Sykes was a son of Godfrey Sykes, and he and Anna had a cabin at Cholla. Glenton, trapped in London by the Kaiser's submarines, and being harassed for not being in uniform, joined the British Army in World War I. When we got into the conflict he was transferred to the U.S.A. forces, and fought in the trenches until November 11, 1918. He was a great naturalist. There is a crater named for him - to the left, off the road to San Pedro. It's crest can almost be reached by any off-road vehicle.

Roy Forr for years had a cabin across from our No. 70. His father was livestock inspector at the border where I crossed stocker steers for my desert ranch. His mother, whom he and his wife frequently brought down, spoke no English. He was an optician in Tucson, fluent in both languages and very voluble, and had far greater influences on the Penasco officials than anyone in Cholla, including Al Scott.

Only a few years ago in the Arizona Legionaire I read of a new Tucson Legion Post being named for him, so I assume he is deceased, without having been, to my knowledge, ever honored by the club.






