COMMON SEARCH & RESCUE COMMON

CHOLLA BAY RADIO OPERATIONS

The radios operated by the Cholla Bay Sportsmen's Club are essential to providing for effective communication and boating safety in the Puerto Penasco area. It is important that the radios be operated in a manner which meets the needs of our users. Frequently, especially on busy weekends, conversation on our primary frequencies is so heavy as to jepordize their effective use for handling normal boating operations and ensure safety needs are met.

In the event of an emergency when time is of the essence, the radio is often the only way to "sound the alarm" and obtain needed help. For this reason we ask that you monitor our safety and calling frequencies and use them to make initial contact with your party, then unless your conversation is with Cholla Radio, SWITCH TO ANOTHER CHANNEL FOR CONVERSATION:

Listed below are the channels in use by Cholla Radio:

RADIO TYPE

CB VHF Marine AM Marine

SAFETY, CALLING & EMERGENCY CHANNELS

> 3 & 9 16 & 26 2182

You will note that the safety and calling channels are AM Marine 2182, VHF Marine 16 & 26, and CB channel 3. As in the United States, CB channel 9 is for emergency use and should be used for that purpose only. Channel 9 is monitored by both Cholla Radio and the Mexican agencies.

REMEMBER, it is important that our safety and calling channels remain as clear as possible if we are to handle normal traffic and emergencies effectively. After making your initial contact on a safety and calling channel, switch to another channel for conversation with other than Cholla Radio.



Dr. Bill Hoffman and daughter Carol Pace finally accomplished a life long ambition this past spring, When Dr. Hoffman with wife Mary Louise, and Carol with her husband Dr. Lee Pace had five exciting days on a small raft that took the four of them and a guide along with four other rafts down the rough rapids of the Yampa River that ran into the Green River and ended at Dinosaur National Monument Park in Utah. The terrain was so rough that four wheel drive vehicles took them to Blue Point Mountain in Colorado where the rafts were launched. 
