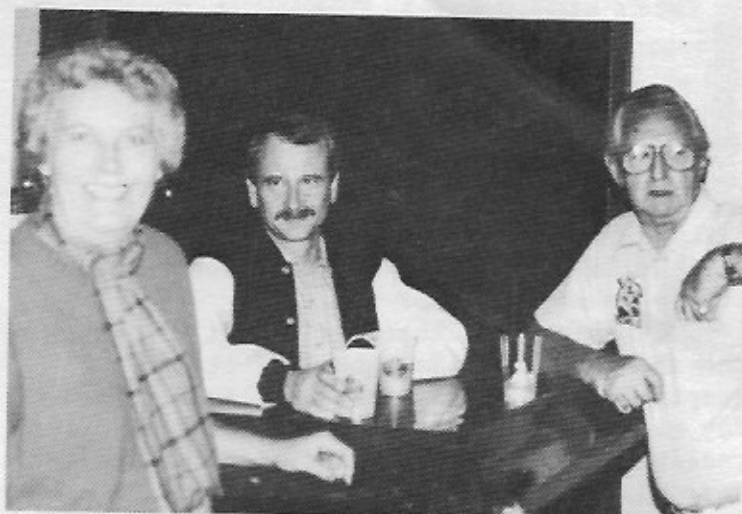
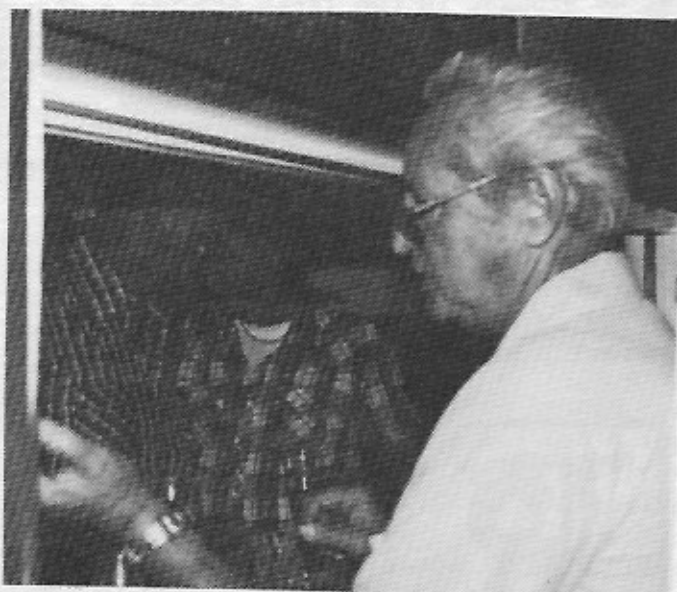
The Twist and Hula Hoop contest proved we do have some hidden talent in the Club. Mike Kemper showed us all some fancy steps with the twist.

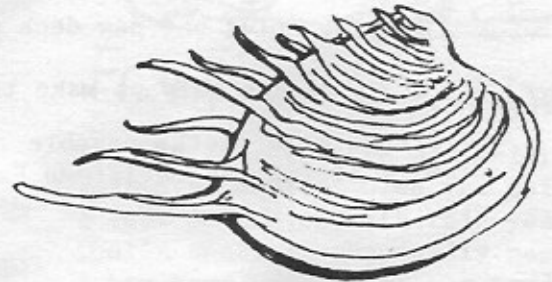

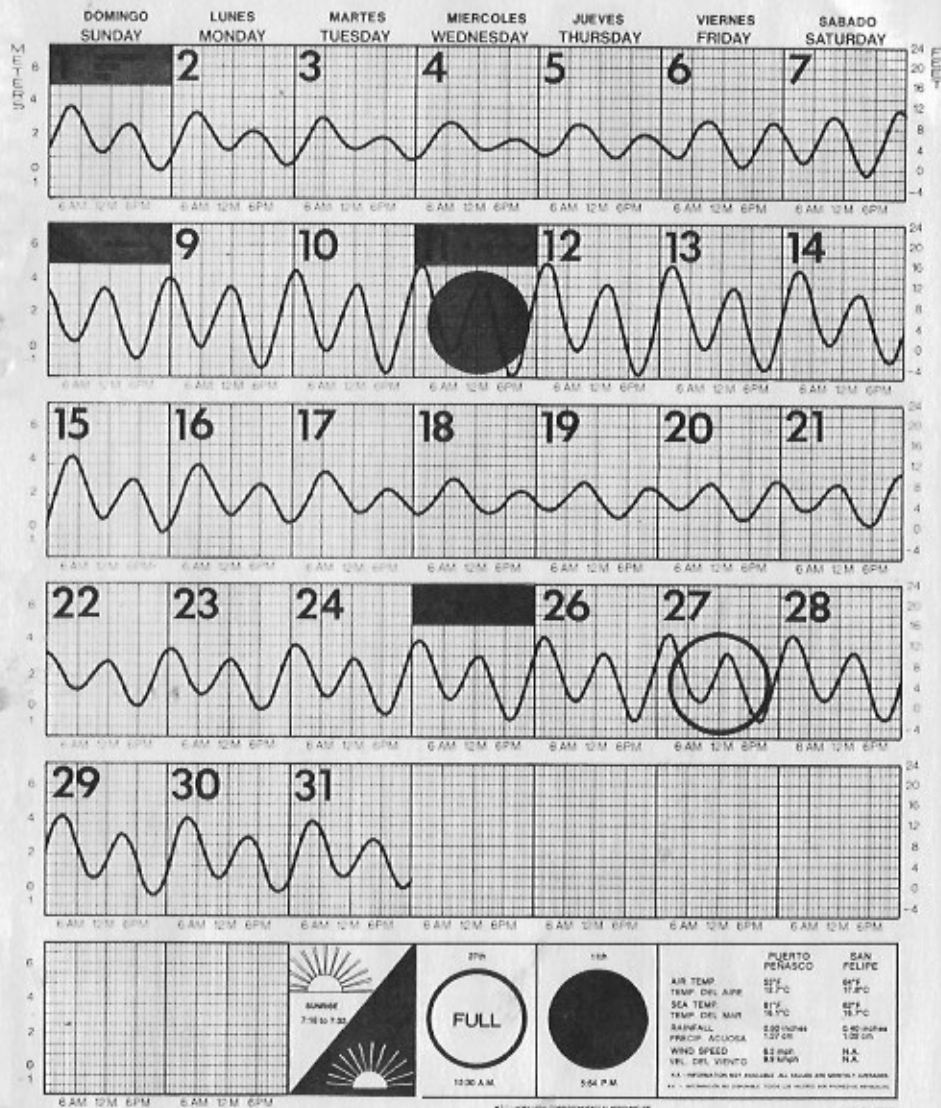
