In the summer of 1930 I was working on Mine Examination and Report Work with a mining engineer named Miles Carpenter when he asked me to take charge of a new fishing club located North of Rocky Point, Mexico. We drove there and found a building which had a kitchen, living room, and sleeping quarters. Also, a Whale Boat in charge of a Mexican Capitan and helper. A Mexican woman did the cooking. There were four American guest fisherman. After they left the road was closed by drifting sand dunes caused by heavy winds, and we were marooned.

After a month my crew walked out, but I stayed for another month when the road was reopened and Miles drove in and got me out.


I had survived mostly on fish and a desert water-hole across the bay to the North. The hole had a slab of rock in the middle with salt water on one side and potable water on the other.

I have never enjoyed better fishing in my life. Once I was fishing over some rough rocks at the mouth of Adair Bay with a drop line over the boat. I almost said "Darn it", I'm snagged", but then the line raced through my fingers. I finally landed a beautiful 75 pound White Sea Bass. Another time I hooked a 175 lb. Manta Ray who towed us all around the Bay until we finally knifed it close to the boat while that lethel barbed tail flashed near us.

We caught many different types of fish. One rather ugly fish that made a croaking noise accompanied by a gnashing of human-like teeth which I cut out and saved for years.

I surveyed a likely spot for an air strip that would require minor clearing and levelling.

I collected beautiful shells on the beaches and enjoyed showing them back in Tucson.





# Variety of Shells




CONES: Ours vary from just under one inch to about three inches long. They are brightly covered in yellows and browns and are best identified by their typical conical shape and attractive markings.



COFFEE BEAN shells, smaller relatives of cowries, are all less than one inch.




PEAR WHELK: The is the most delicately formed shell in the whelk family. All are carnivores and scavengers. The animals drill small holes in bivalve shells (oysters, etc.) and feed on the animal inside.



OLIVE: They are highly polished like the cowry. Olive shells are small — one half to two and a half inches long — and are usually a bright grey or bluish color. This animal plows along just beneath the surface of the sand at low tide, leaving a characteristic trail.

# Found at Cholla

COWRY: All cowries have highly polished shells; a few are plain, but many are mottled and brightly colored. Most cowries are from one to four inches long.



JINGLE SHELLS: They are thin, bright and pearly — and irregular in shape. It may be white, yellow or orange and is lustrous within. The shells, about one inch across, are unequal, the top one being deeply hollowed, the bottom one smaller and almost flat.






COCKLE SHELLS: Cockles in our area are usually from two to six inches and are white to yellow with strong squarish ribs. They live in shallow water — often in brakish inlets. They live in the sand.

MOON SHELL: They are sometimes called Owl eyes. Their shell is a light brown with a whitish base. It preys on clams. Have you seen its "sand collar" egg case?





FIGHTING CONCH: Did you ever see him fight his way out of the sand at low tide? Conch shells are thick and the colors variable. They are used for making cameos, buttons and other ornaments.



BLACK MUREX: They and their kin include over a thousand species, including the DRILLS which have become serious pests in the oyster beds. They are about one inch to six inches high; heavy, ridged, and usually spiny. Murex snails live in moderately deep water, but the shells are often washed up on the beaches. Shallowwater species can be collected at low tides.



As 1986 rapidly comes to a close, I would like to thank all the members of the Cholla Bay Sportsmen's Club for the opportunity to serve as your Council Chairman this year.

I would also like to express my appreciation to the other Council members for their devotion and dedication in helping to make this a successful year.
