



Noel Jordan won the Christmas Raffle certificate.



The recount of story is that, Paul & Augustin went in action to get Homer to hospital in Puerto Penasco. The Schoonovers also had guests whom were RN's that attended Homer. Homer died enroute. That is not the end of the commendable & loveable actions of the first persons mentioned. They further acted to expedite paperwork & crossing of border for Florence (widow) and body (Homer).

The Schoonovers are more than friends and Augustin (whom excused himself from personal family concerns) the surviving family owes more than thanks.

I intend to continue to administer the foundation in behalf of the Smiths. It is my wish that the Cholla Chatter will continously publish their needs to further their works.

A remarkable life ended in Cholla Bay on the first day of 1988.

In most cases, individuals spend part of their time on earth doing little that is either interesting or constructive. This was never the case with HOMER SMITH.

From the date of his birth, October 25, 1896, he participated in and helped shape the events and people with whom he was associated.

During World War I he was envolved in active combact with the United States Navy. After the war and for the remainder of his life he was active in the American Legion..

The war ended and Homer made the best contract of his life. He married Florence Tuttle. This union was a partnership that survived good times and bad. It became so solid that it was almost impossible to picture one of them without the other.

Professionally Homer was an architect. In Phoenix he was associated with Lesher and Mahoney and other firms. He supervised the construction of Camelback Inn, North Phoenix High School, Phoenix College and many other still remaining landmarks.

At heart he was always a rancher and cowboy. The lean years of the great depression found him homesteading and ranching in the Cave Creek area. He contracted with the Tonto National Forest to build the first fence with Mesquite poles and baredbwire to supliment income to support the ranch. At this time Florence also contributed to the family's wellbeing by providing transportation for the school. Two daughters had blessed the union at this time. Glodyne and Charlotte (Pudge) recall their childhood as fun and adventure in the desert setting.

The Smiths were outstanding citizens in the small desert community. Homer contributed both time and money to construct the new Legion hall. This building was then and is now a a community center.

The Colorado Plateau was the site of his next cattle ranch.

It was during this period that he built the house in Cholla Bay becoming a good neighbor to all of us. The nineteen fiftys found Homer racing Class D Hydroplanes. He held the national champion-ship for this class. In his" spare time" at Cholla Bay he build a Desel Motor Sailer which eventually was docked at Silver Gate Yacht club in San Diego.

Mexico was adventure territory for Florence and Homer to explore and love. One time they made a trip to Alaska. That beautiful grass convinced Mr Smith he was not too old to homestead one more time.

Returning from the northland Yarnell, Arizona became the place for Homer to build his Casa Ultimo. Community activities still kept him busy.

Homer and Florence were supporters of the orphanage located in Sonoita. In 1986 Homerand Florence donated 1 million plus Pesos to the Family Misssions, Inc PO. Box 8369. Phoenix, Az 85066.

In 1987 The Smiths set up a foundation at the National Bank of Mexico for the Granaja Feliz. This will assure them of over 1 million Pesos annually to rebuild and enlarge the facility.

Plans were made to visit the orphanage after Christmas and then celebrate the arrival of the New Year at Cholla Bay. In true character he decided to drive his own sports car to the festivities. He enjoyed visiting with long time friends and seeing 1988 arrive on schedule.

A heart attack ended this marvelous life in the first hours of 1988.

The Pioneer Cemetery in Peeples Valley is his final resting place.

Florence is with their daughter Glodyne in Payson . Her address is Florence Smith, c/o Glo Cowley, 615 W. Summitt, Payson, Az 85541.

Our sympathy is with the family Homer leaves behind. But what a wonderful time and way to have lived on this great planet earth.

Vasquez Liquors in Sonoyta donated three pinatas. We appreciate their thoughtfulness. We filled the pinatas with candy and persuaded Lou Bock and Wayne Kudis to hold the ropes while the boys and girls swung the mighty baseball bat. That bat can be a dangerous weapon, so Lou padded it and wrapped it with tape. When one pinata started to break, the boys grabbed it and almost pulled Wayne off the top of the Suburban. Such excitement - so many smiling faces. We enjoyed the happy faces of the parents while their children were having such a good time.


CHOLLA BAY CHAPTER GENERAL MEETING By Opal Farmer



Looks as if the Walter Warwicks are going to hold the "Miss America" contest this fall-they are building a runway to their gazebe.


