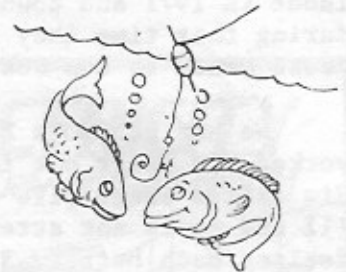

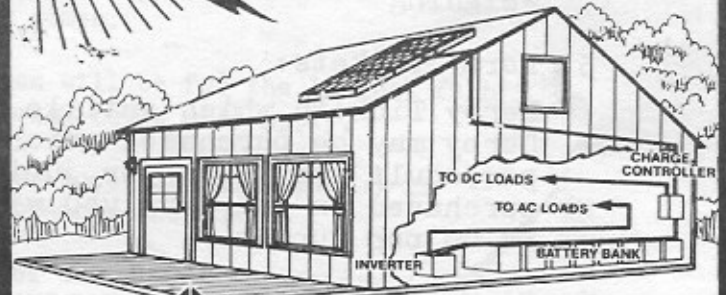

All fish must be caught on a hook and line.

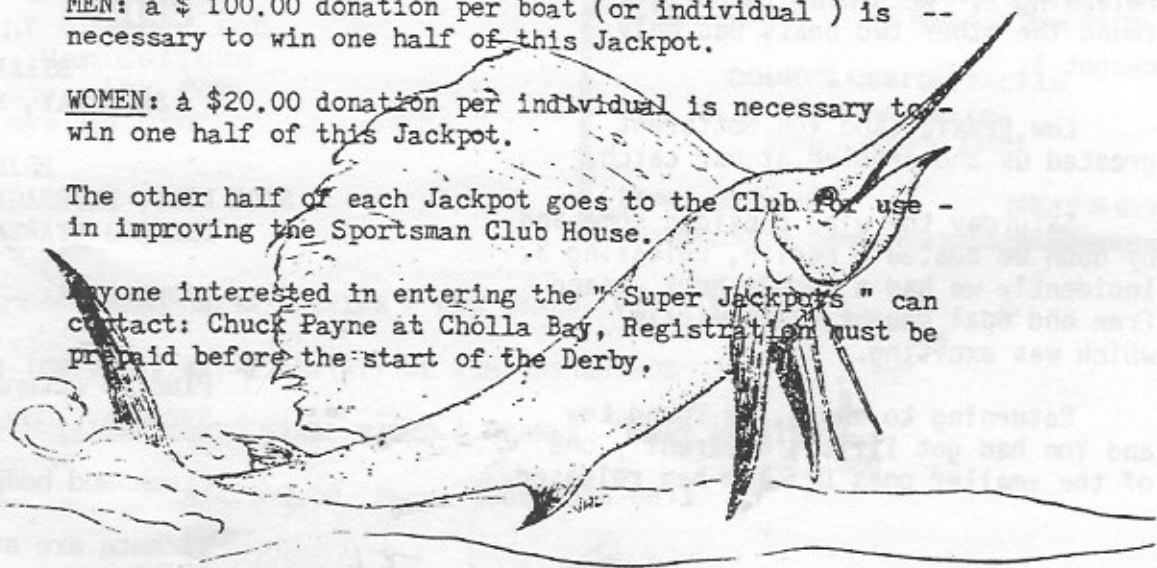

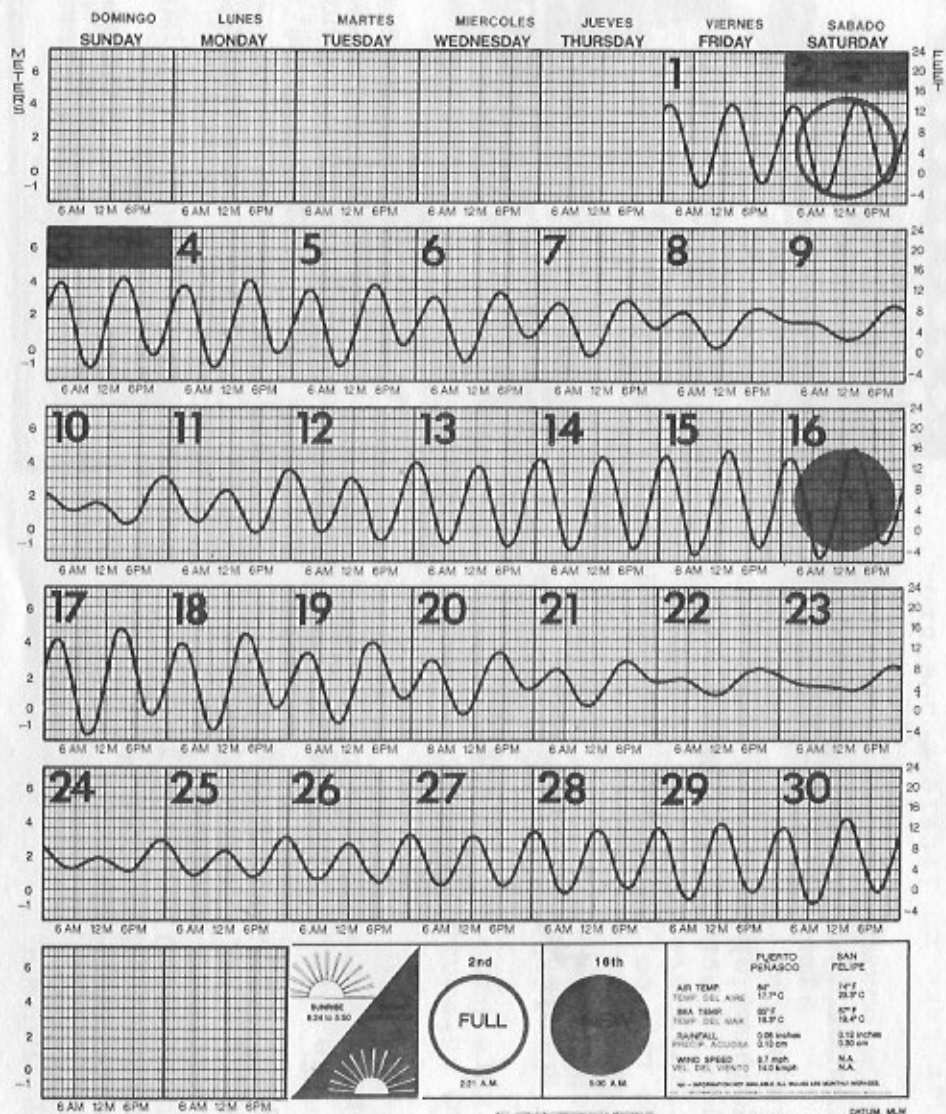
