


We have no news to report from the Reef at this time. Sure hope Daddy Reef has survived the Spring Breaks. See you next month.

CHOLLA BAY SPORTSMEN'S CLUB, INC. FISHING DERBY RULES

- 1. Each contestant participating in the Derby must have a valid Mexican Fishing License, and a valid Derby Ticket before starting to fish. All boats must be launched from Cholla Bay and have a valid Mexican boat permit.

 Participants must fill out a launch-slip before entering the water, and may not launch prior to Derby date. All fish must be caught on a hook and line.
- 2. Classes of fish eligible for prizes:

GROUPER MACKEREL COCHI
PINTO DOLPHIN SARDINERO
BLACK SEA BASS RED SNAPPER LEATHER FISH
SEA TROUT PARGO SKIP JACK
POMPANO FLOUNDER SAILFISH

3. Judging and prizes:

Fish will be judged according to weight. There will be a Grand Prize winner for men, women, and juniors (15 years of age or under). Fish taking a Grand Prize Trophy will not be eligible for any other awards. Additional awards will be given for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each category of fish. Awards will consist of trophies and/or cash.

4. Registration and weighing of fish:

The scales will be open for weighing from 10:00 A.M. until 6:00 P.M. each day of the Derby, except Sunday, May 29, 1988, when the scales will close promptly at 5:00 P.M. Batteries should have clean terminals and full charges.


Hand tools can be rust-free if kept in a plastic container that seals. A flare gun or spotlight are standard safety equipment along with a working fire extinguisher.


