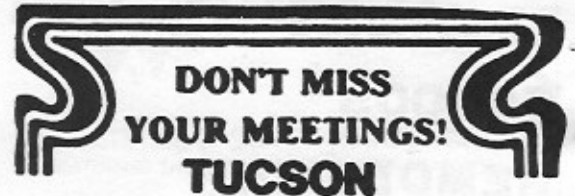

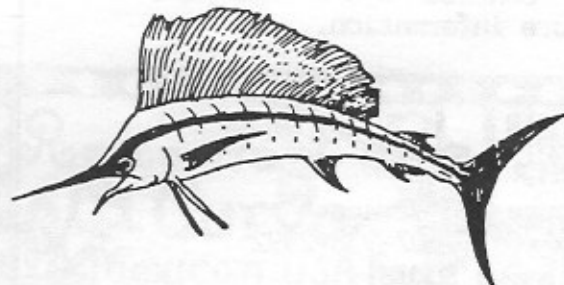
DERBY NEWS

Don't forget our steak fry Saturday May 7th at 5:00 pm S.G.Brown Plaza in Cholla Bay.

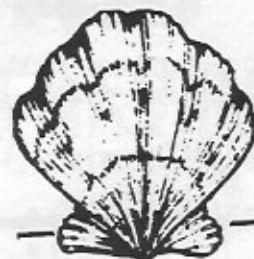

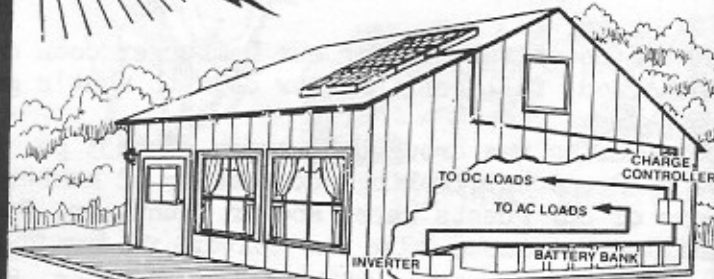

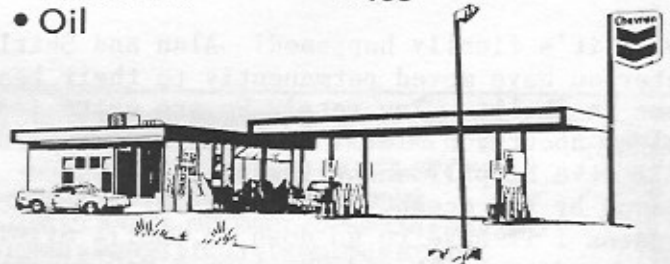

FISHING DERBY RULES

1. Each contestant participating in the Derby must have a valid Mexican Fishing License, and a valid Derby Ticket before starting to fish. All boats must be launched from Cholla Bay and have a valid Mexican boat permit. Participants must fill out a launch-slip before entering the water, and may not launch prior to Derby date. All fish must be caught on a hook and line.

2. Classes of fish eligible for prizes:

GROUPEr	MACKEREL	COCHI
PINTO	DOLPHIN	SARDINERO
BLACK SEA BASS	RED SNAPPER	LEATHER FISH
SEA TROUT	PARGO	SKIP JACK
POMPANO	FLOUNDER	SAILFISH

IT IS PROHIBITED TO CATCH AND KEEP SPECIES OF TOTOABA (WHITE SEA BASS)

3. Judging and prizes:

Fish will be judged according to weight. There will be a Grand Prize winner for men, women, and juniors (15 years of age or under). Fish taking a Grand Prize Trophy will not be eligible for any other awards. Additional awards will be given for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each category of fish. Awards will consist of trophies and/or cash.

4. Registration and weighing of fish:

The scales will be open for weighing from 10:00 A.M. until 6:00 P.M. each day of the Derby, except Sunday, May 29, 1988, when the scales will close promptly at 5:00 P.M. These closing times will be strictly enforced. Any fish presented for judging must be accompanied by the Derby Ticket of the person claiming the catch. The date, species and weight of the fish will be recorded on the back of said Derby Ticket at the time of weighing

5. Derby Tickets:

Derby Tickets which entitle the purchaser to fish the entire Derby may be purchased prior to and during the Derby for \$10.00 per adult and \$5.00 per junior. Daily Derby tickets may be purchased on the days you wish to fish for \$4.00 per adult and \$2.00 per junior.

6. Fish Fry and Awards Ceremony:

THE FISH FRY WILL BEGIN AT 6:00 P.M. ON SUNDAY, MAY 29, 1988

The Awards Ceremony and Jackpot ticket drawings will follow the fish fry.

Members of the C.B.S.C. and guests, Derby participants and families and Cholla Bay residents are welcome to come to the fish fry.

Identification will be required.

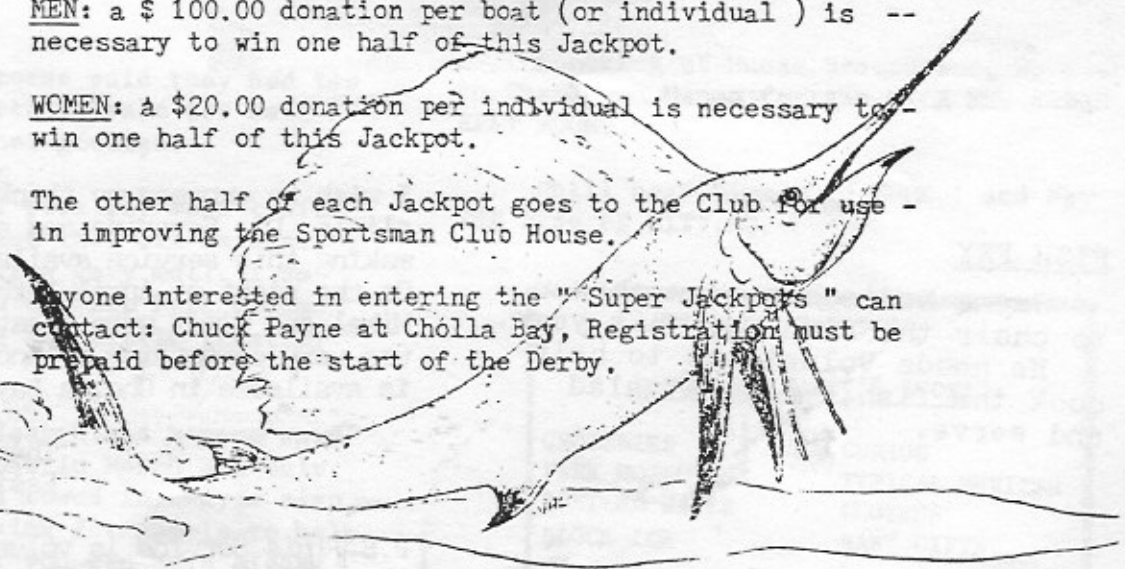

SCORPIONS

Stings occur more frequently during periods of rain or high humidity, and most stings occur on the hands or feet. SO WATCH YOUR HANDS AND FEET.

The following precautions should be taken:

1. Wear heavy work gloves when cleaning up debris, and pick up boards and look on the underside of them. A favorite habitat of scorpions is on the underside of scrap lumber and debris.
2. Use a good pesticide in yards and lumber piles.
3. If you feel something crawling over your body in the dark, do not swat it; brush it off. Swatting will guarantee envenomation, but a quick brush will remove the scorpion before it can sting.
4. Check clothing and shoes before putting them on.

Also, we have in our possession a book that was found at the Cholla Bay Public Library titled: "WHAT TO DO ABOUT BITES & STINGS OF VENOMOUS ANIMALS" by Robert E. Arnold, M.D., which is the property of the Cholla Bay Sportsmens Club.



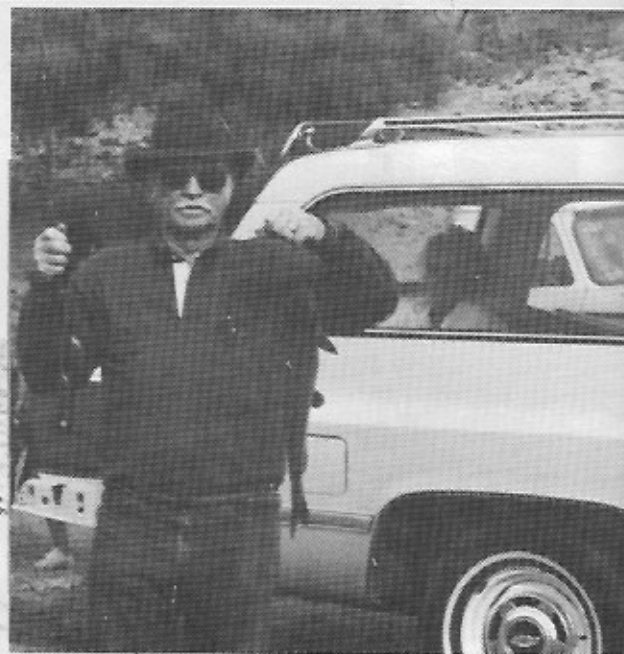
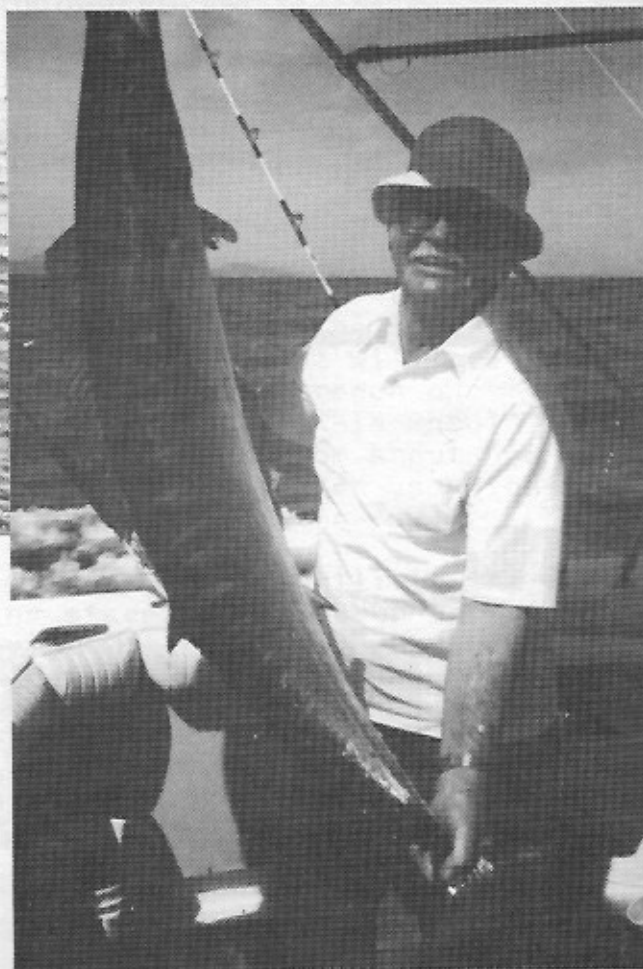

It was late in the afternoon, the Derby scales were closing and he had the first Dolphin fish of the season to be weighed. If he did not get this fish in before the closing it would not count. We changed our course to intercept with his boat coming in from the Bird Island area, took the fish and his son on into the scales with only minutes left before closing. I tell you this only to demonstrate to you his unselfishness and how much pride he always shows to the young and those who love to fish.

Somewhere in all the years passing another of the great Valentine conquests was the International Marlin fishing Derby in Hawaii. With a few of his most avid fishing friends, the Sabas of Chandler, the Hammers and others they represented our Sportsmen's Club above and beyond. Not only did they fish competitively, they came out winners bringing home a beautiful trophy for the Club. This trophy still hangs in the Clubs' Radio Room for all to admire.

There has to be many many more good tales to spin about this man. Taking the time to once again show and give a special thanks to such an outstanding member is always an immense joy. I will always have a special sort of pride in knowing and being a friend of this caricature, "Bill".

In the years to follow, Hammer and Valentine have become very special friends and fishing buddies.

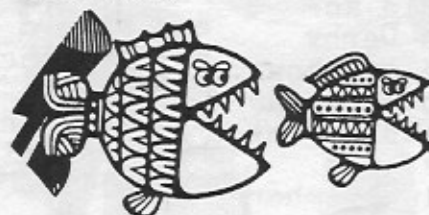

I happened to be fishing next to him one day when he hooked about a 40lb Black Sea Bass on a Diamond Jig- I have always wondered how the head of a Rock Bass got on the hook with that black bass, but I know when Bill said he was a purist he didn't lie then and doesn't lie now.

Un Dia por la Vida De 2/14 Veinte Anyos Pasado

Days dawned in Cholla Bay twenty years ago just about like they do now- either wrapped in pink or messed up with wind and sand and down right contrary. Most of the time when the Valentine Clan made an appearance the weather seemed to smile and say welcome to those four beautiful daughters, one great son, any number of pets, Jessie, Bill and naturally the African Queen

People fortunate enough to be in Cholla Bay on a summer evening about sunset would often see a strange apparition slowly appear over the horizon from out of the south. A good sized crowd had probably gathered at the boat landing to check out this sight because the above mentioned horizon was just about to disappear into darkness.

At first it resembled a large Pelican trying unsuccessfully to fly.

As it came closer it began to take on the outline of a very unique boat. The decks were practically awash. What appeared to be wings were actually long bent outriggers festooned with sailfish and dolphin flags. The tips of these flags almost touched the water. Rods protruded in all directions. In the cockpit the crew was shaded by a large umbrella advertising tractors.

When the African Queen made port she was invariable loaded with more fish (and tackle) than any of her buddy boats that had fished in the same area most of the day.

Now if you think dawn to dark fishing satisfied this fishing crew you are badly misinformed. After a few toddys for the body and dinner the next sports event was a night of shark fishing between Pelican Point and Tucson Beach. The thing that always amazed everyone was the number of sharks caught at night at the same place we swam all day long

Night shark fishing was invented by 2/14. It is great sport.

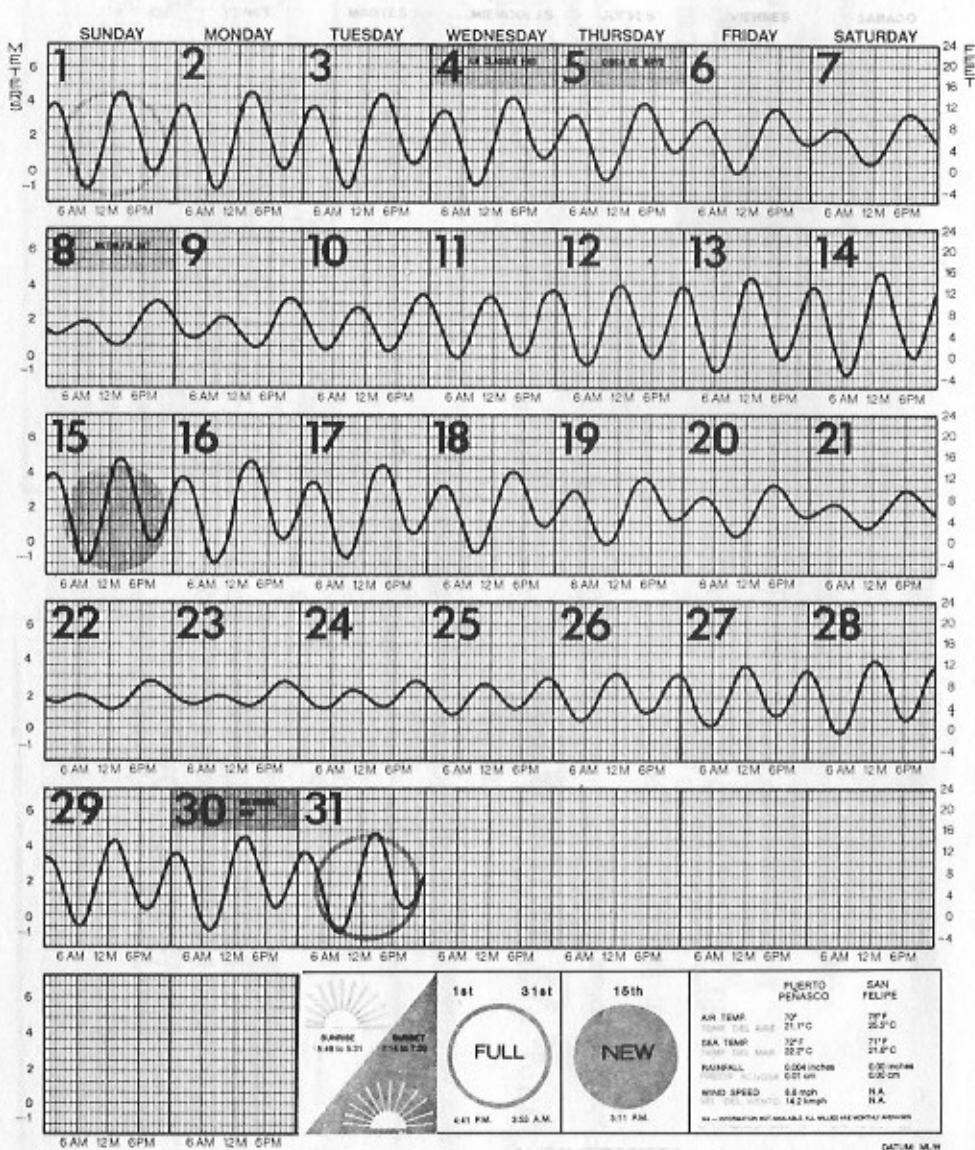
