BATHTUB RACE


The first international bathtub race was held in Choya Bay in April.



We were reminded not to forget the last part of the fishing Derby May 27,28 and 29th and the Fish fry on the 29th.It's at Gus Brown's Plaza.




Now, whenever I think of that big bass cruising the shoreline in search of a meal, I get a good feeling. A feeling that the future of our fish and wildlife is in good hands.
